### Description

STIS is an electronic dissemination system that provides fast, easy access to National Science Foundation (NSF) publications. There is no cost to you except for possible long-distance phone charges. The service is available twenty-four hours a day, except for maintenance periods.

Publications currently available include:

- *The NSF Bulletin*
- Program announcements and "Dear Colleague" letters
- General publications and reports
- Press releases
- NSF organization charts and phone books
- NSF vacancy announcements
- Award abstracts (1989-now)

### Network Access

There are many ways to access STIS. Choose the method that meets your needs and the communication facilities you have available.

- Electronic documents via electronic mail. Send a message to *stisserv@nsf.gov*. Put the command *get index* in the text of your message.
- Anonymous FTP. Connect to *stis.nsf.gov*. Retrieve the file *index*.
- Direct E-mail. This service automatically mails you information about documents added to STIS. For information on this, send the command *get stisdirm* to *stisserv@nsf.gov*.
- Gopher. Connect to port 70 on host *stis.nsf.gov*.
- WAIS. There are two databases on *stis.nsf.gov*. *nsf-pubs* contains all documents and publications, and *nsf-awards* contains award abstracts.
- Online STIS. You must have a VT100 emulator. Telnet to *stis.nsf.gov*, and log on as *public*.
