

## **POWERLOCK™ RELEASE 3 INFORMATION BRIEF**

The following enhancements have been incorporated into Release 3:

### **Greatly expanded AddOn interface**

Now supports multiple addOns active simultaneously. AddOns are activated simply by dropping them into the same folder as PowerLock. They can be deactivated simply by holding down the shift key. Development interface supports major enhancements to PowerLock via AddOns. PowerLock now ships with twelve AddOns.

### **Additional Preferences & Security Features**

Option to allow unlimited password attempts. Option to completely disable automatic shutdown and timeout plus the ability to specify extremely large values for these fields. Users can have their own unique Preferences via the PowerUsers AddOn. Additional SuperSecurity option of preventing exit via low level tools such as debuggers. The Macintosh will now refuse to recognise a floppy disk if it is inserted whilst PowerLock is running.

### **Expanded Log File**

Now supports different levels of detail. Optionally reports diagnostic information. Log File now stored in the same folder as the Preferences file and can be redirected via System 7 aliases. File format now more structured. LogManager AddOn now included with PowerLock.

### **Appearance & User Interface improvements**

More use of color. Simplified dialog boxes. Short cut keys available in dialog boxes for most buttons. Holding down the Command key displays all available short cuts. Fast Path to common dialogs available by option-clicking buttons. Available fast paths are displayed when the option key is held down.

### **Expanded System 7 support**

Now supports core AppleEvents. Future AddOns will be able to respond to additional AppleEvents. Can now substitute Aliases for PowerLock's files. Auto-Install is now available for System 7 users, greatly simplifying the installation process. System 6 Users can get the equivalent of an Alias using the 6/Launcher.

### **Localisation & Customisation Support**

Almost all text is now in resources supporting simpler localisation and also providing a means of customisation.

### **Release 2 Problems Fixed**

Create INIT problems on certain systems repaired. Bootblocks Modification was too unreliable under System 7 and has been disabled in that environment. Maximum # of users was four but should have been five - new release supports (via PowerUser AddOn) 99 users.

### **Compatibility with Release 2**

Release 3 uses a new Preferences format and hence to ensure compatibility its Preferences file name has changed to *PowerLock Prefs (3)*. This means that new defaults are automatically created. Userlists need to be recreated in Release 3. All Release 2 AddOns must be replaced with new versions however Release 2 AddOns are automatically disabled under Release 3. The Dispatcher AddOn is now unnecessary.

## ADDONS INFORMATION BRIEF

The following table lists the addOns either in development or available now for PowerLock Release 3. For unreleased AddOns, the Cost Code column is indicative only and may change.

Name	Cost Code	Status	Description
AccessTimes	-	Obs	Allows the SuperUser to specify a time range that each user is allowed to use the Macintosh - was supplied with Release 2 but no longer available with Release 3 - see PowerUsers for equivalent functionality
AutoLogOn	R	Ready	Automatically establishes connections to file servers, and off-line hard disks prompting for passwords where applicable. Each PowerLock user can have their own settings. (Requires System 7)
BookTools	F	1.0 Ready 1.1 Beta	Specific features for PowerBook users including putting the PowerBook to sleep after the timeout period expires, access to the Sleep command from within PowerLock, automatically launching PowerLock when waking up etc. (Requires System 7 and the Power Manager)
DarkSide	F	Alpha	Allows you to make use of any screen savers created for the <i>Dark Side of the Mac™</i> screen saver application
Defaults	R	Alpha	Particularly useful for corporations, allows administrators to establish a standard set of preferences which will be applied whenever PowerLock creates a Prefs file - overrides PowerLocks inbuilt defaults.
Hide	F	Ready	Places PowerLock into the background so that it can be easily called up via the Apple or Applications Menu (requires System 7 or MultiFinder)
LastResort	R	Ready	Bypasses the password dialog - helpful if a password is forgotten (available with Release 2 also)
LogManager	R	Ready	Allows viewing and analysis of the PowerLock log within PowerLock, simply by double-clicking the log file or selecting it from the Preferences dialog. Has demo mode for unregistered users.
MasterPassword	PO	Ready	Allows a single corporate wide master password to be used as an override or safety measure.
NeverEverShutDown	F	Ready	Prevents PowerLock from ever shutting down, including removing the Shut Down button from the main dialog.
OutToLunch	F	Ready	Simple screen saver that puts up a user-specified message when PowerLock times out
PowerMessages	F	Ready	Designed for use where several people use the one Macintosh. Allows each user to leave a message for any other user. Also allows the SuperUser to issue a broadcast message.
PowerPrefs	R	Alpha	Expands on the Preferences. Allows you to specify a different folder to hold active addOns. Changes the desktop pattern. Lets you specify a specific number of password attempts etc. Puts restrictions on passwords such as minimum lengths, enforced password changes
