Find File Preview and Word Documents

The preview view for the Find File command is not available for Word documents in this version of Office.

Documents in earlier versions of Microsoft Excel (earlier than Microsoft Excel 5) or PowerPoint (earlier than PowerPoint 4) cannot be previewed using the Find File command.

Word Won't Run After Installation

If you cannot run Word or you cannot open or save Word files, you may need to change the AUTOEXEC.BAT or CONFIG.SYS file so that the Share utility is properly loaded. For more information, see Word Readme Help. The information can be found in the topic "Word for Windows Product Update" under "Installing Share Utility."

To display Word Readme Help, choose the Contents button. Then select Word Readme Contents.

Editing the Working Directory of an Office Application

Using the Customize dialog box, you cannot change the working directory of an Office application. Office applications read the working directory from an internal setting.

Network Server Confirmation Error

Problem

You receive the following message during Setup:

Setup could not connect to the Network Server using the Network Server and Path provided. If you want to supply a revised Network Server and Path, select the Edit button. If you want to save the current Network Server and Path anyway, select the Continue button.

Solution

You can solve the problem in one of the following ways:

- Check that the network server and path you entered were typed correctly and that the server and path defines a valid network connection. To revise the server and path, click the Edit button.
- If you are running Novell, check that the Novell NETX.COM file is Novell version 3.22 or later. Using earlier versions of the Novell NETX.COM file can generate this error. To upgrade your version of Novell's NETX.COM file, contact your Novell reseller or distributor.

Workstation User Can't Save to Read-only Network Drive

Problem

You have a Workstation installation and can't save a Microsoft Excel or PowerPoint document to the default network drive.

Solution

The default network drive may be read-only. Change directories to save your document on your hard disk or your home directory or directory where you have write privileges on the network.

For Network Administrators: Before You Install

For a network installation of Office, Setup requires that you install into a new or empty directory.

If you want to upgrade an existing installation in a directory of the same name, for example, you want to install Office 4.2 in a directory named MSOFFICE where Office 4.0 was installed, you must delete that directory, and all files. Then, create a new directory of the same name, for example, MSOFFICE.

If you have a previous version of Office, your workstation users must run Setup again.
