This is general help for the &product.

The &product. uses the IBM User Interface Class Library (ICLUI) to implement features that are common to most Presentation Manager (PM) programs, like a menu bar containing File and Edit and **H**elp action bar items. You can use the &product. as a template from which to build your own ICLUI applications. Compare this code with the code from the Basic PM Application in the Project Smartz catalog to see how much easier it is to implement a user-interface with ICLUI.

The &product. is fully help-enabled, and uses string resources, instead of string literals, to facilitate translation.

To use the &product., open a file by selecting Open from the **F**ile pull-down. The file is opened, and then immediately closed. Subsequently, any menu item you select is displayed as text in the client window.
