

The Internet Neighborhood™

Congratulations, and thank you for trying *The Internet Neighborhood™*, or FTP32 for short. *The Internet Neighborhood™* is a Windows 95 Shell Extension designed to allow you to browse remote ftp sites from within the Windows 95 Explorer. KnoWare, Inc. has taken the robust feature set of the Windows 95 Explorer and given you the ability to use it against a remote FTP site anywhere on the Internet! Why fool around with imitations and clones who give you the old 'Explorer-Like' FTP clients when you can just use Explorer itself.

There is no longer any need for those 'Explorer-Like' ftp clients. This is the real thing!

The Internet Neighborhood™ is a Windows 95 Shell Extension which means that, since it implements the same OLE interfaces that are used by your *Network Neighborhood*, or the *Recycle Bin*, *The Internet Neighborhood™* is actually part of the shell's namespace. Now, from within the context of a single instance of Explorer, you can browse everything from your local hard drive, to the *Network Neighborhood*, to a FTP site in the UK!

What's New?

The following is combined list of features which have been added to *The Internet Neighborhood™* since its inception. V1.0 (Build 8)

- Fixed bug in UnInstall whereas the icon was not being removed from the desktop.
- Added Registration/Serial Number keys for unlocking the shareware version.

V1.0 (Build 7)

- Added configurable threads.
- Added a toolbar.
- Added 'PASSIVE' mode for basic firewall support.
- Added messaging to refresh the 'listview' after uploads & deletes.
- Fixed bug on NT/4 which prevented new FTP sites from being saved.
- Fixed bugs in the upload/download processes.
- Fixed memory leaks.

Known Problems

The following is a list of currently known problems which exist with *The Internet Neighborhood*[™]. These have been identified by various beta testers and will be addressed in future releases. (\$) denotes features which are available only in the fully registered version.

- Currently, none of the context menus are available from within the treeview. In order to right-click on an object and get its popup-menu, the object must be in the listview pane of Explorer.
- The 'explode-branch' accelerator is still causing problems. It works on small tree branches but our suggestion is that you don't try it on say...The Oakland Repository!
- Drag-Drop does not work. (\$)
- You cannot rename remote objects. (\$)
- Occasionally the contents of the treeview are not being updated. This usually occurs after the addition and/or deletion of a folder or FTP-Site.

What's Not New

V1.0 (Build 6)

- Fixed bugs in the upload process.
- Added the ability to upload multiple files at one time.

V1.0 (Build 5)

- Added the ability for a socket to know when its no longer being used so that it closes itself. (This also fixed a bug).
- Added another property page containing 'Winsock' options. You can now configure the size of the send/receive buffers & other Winsock options. This page will get more options added to it periodically.
- Fixed problem whereas the toolbar buttons dictating the listview state were not being set correctly.
- Fixed problem whereas the FTP32.DLL was not being unloaded from memory thus causing socket problems.

V1.0 (Build 4)

- Added 'Reconnect' and 'Disconnect' options to the FTP-Site objects. This allows you to re-establish a connection in the event of some unforeseen error.
- Added a 'message window' which displays any logon messages setup by the remote ftp site. This is also configurable in the 'General' tab options page.
 - Fixed problem which occurred when trying to transfer files to/from your local root directory.

V1.0 (Build 3)

- First Beta'able build.
