This program has been written in Visual Basic. The program itself is very simple. It is only useful for **viewing** icons. It will not edit them or use them in any useful way. I wrote this program in a couple of hours. I have barely begun to use Visual Basic and already I am amazed at its power.

Visual Basic handles all the hard work in this program. It creates the entire interface including the drive box, the directory box, the file box, and the menus. A skilled Visual Basic programmer (not me) could have written this program in less than five minutes. I don't know about you but to me that is impressive.

If you have always wanted to write programs for Windows but were afraid of the SDK (Software Developers Kit) then this program is for you. To give you an example of just how overly simple this program is, below is listed the **complete** source code for the entire program. **NO KIDDING.**

How to use IconLook

Give me a break! What is there to it? If you can't figure out how to use this one then you certainly don't need to be programming no matter how simple the language is to use. (Those of you that are actually reading this **before** running the program IconLook should run the program to see how simple it is to operate. You also get a gold star.)

There are some rules however. IconLook, like all Visual Basic applications requires that the file VBRUN100.DLL be located somewhere in your path. I always keep mine in my windows directory. This works even if your windows directory is not in your path. IconLook will only look at files that have an **.ICO** extension. If you try to view an .ICO file that is an old or incorrect format the Icon will say (disingenuously) **Bad Icon**.

I think that this program works. It does not **ever** write **anything** to disk so I believe it to be totally safe in every way. I will not accept **any** responsibility for **anything** that goes wrong **even if this program does have something to do with it** which is incredibly unlikely. While I do not choose to charge for this program at this time I reserve all rights to it.

This software is distributed under the **FOOLWARE** concept. I would be a fool if I thought you would send me any money for it even if I asked for some. Nor should you even if I asked for some. **REAL** shareware products should be supported if you use them. By real shareware I mean **REAL** programs like PC-Write and Qmodem and List and PC-File and tons of other really good products. On the other side of the coin however are snivelling little programs that barely (or even sometimes don't) do

what they say and do it poorly. Throw those guys away and if the author was kind enough to give you his address write him a letter to tell him not to flood the market with *low quality* crapware. I like to write simple programs that barely do what they say (and sometimes they do it poorly) but I **never** charge anything for them. That should exempt me from any nasty letters.
