This will in no way replace our regular features, which will continue to bring you the kind of in-depth information for which we are renowned. No magazine that caters for diverse interest groups and expertise levels can ever please everyone all the time, but if you feel that your own areas of interest are not getting a fair deal, then do let us know - we compile the magazine to please you, not ourselves.

Interactive multimedia is the big story at the moment - see the article in this issue. Having written the article, I was interested to hear that a House of Commons Select Committee has urged the government to invest £15bn in the information superhighway by constructing a nationwide cable network for the purpose. It's open to question whether this will happen as the result of a nationwide project - it's more likely to be done piecemeal. But the important point is that when an idea is adopted by MPs, it usually indicates that it is already well established in the nation's consciousness. The omens must be good for companies such as Acorn who are ahead of the

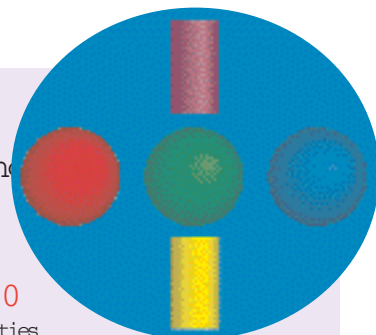

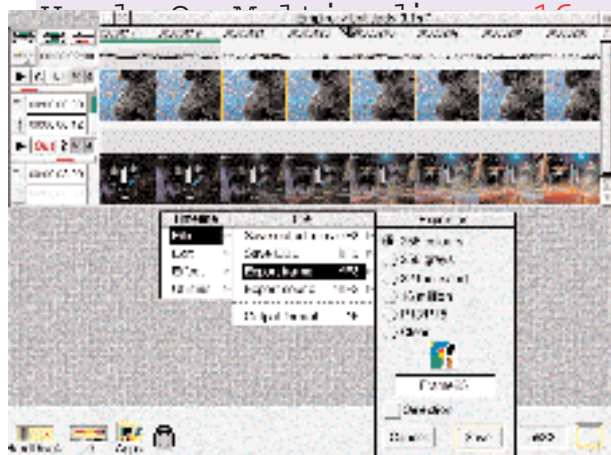
