It is possible to do limited text entry and editing in 1-2-3, but it is not practical for sophisticated applications. The format and macros in WP.WKS will work for letters, notes, documentation, etc. while still in 1-2-3, eliminating the necessity of changing programs and possibly data disks. You can type until you hear a beep, then tell 1-2-3 to wrap around with the <ALT-W> command, which invokes a short macro I created to save keystrokes when wrapping.

To start a new paragraph, <ALT-G> invokes a macro that wraps the text but doesn't move the cursor, so you can start the next paragraph where you want.

To go to the next page when newly entering text and the next page is presumably blank, you use the command <ALT-P>, which moves over one cell and up to the top row so entry can begin.

The macros and documentation are on page 2 (cell B1).
