

NAVRATER V 1.0

NavRater is a small application designed to start Navigator V 1.0 as well as connect to Pass 1 and keep track of your Compuserve Charges. The Rate of hourly connection is user definable. The charges will be saved in log files and will be dated when saved so permanent records can be kept for your on-line charges. Log files can be chosen and displayed on screen for easy reference.

The actual timer is small stays on top of your Navigator screen, and can be moved by clicking the top of the Timer and dragging it. The Buttons are self explanatory and change with your selection.

Navigator is still so new its going to take me a few weeks to figure it out so by registering this version you will be receiving the next version free of charge. if you have any suggestions let me know.

You can now add NavRater to your startup programs. I added new code so NavRater will logon at startup. A Limit-meter has been installed so that on-line cost limits can be entered. The percent of used on-line cost limit is displayed under the timer buttons. This percent display can be hidden by double clicking it, and by pressing (F2) it will reappear.

- " NAVRATER only " will start the NavRater only
- " LOGON Pass1 " will connect to Basic services on-line
- " START 'U DEFINE " will ask for the directory of the Application you wish to start, etc. "C:\Cserve\Wincim" then asks you for the name of the file expl. "Wincim.Exe" the next time you start up, it will start the chosen application, start NavRater and wait for you to log on.
- Rate amount can be entered in the text box
- By selecting the "Close Navigator on Exit". Navigator V 1.0 will close when you exit NavRater.

Registration is simple and easy:

- Log on to Compuserve
 - Go Swreg
 - Navrater
 - Version 1.0
 - Follow Instructions
 - a \$8.00 Charge will be added on to your Compuserve bill
 - I will supply your code as soon as I receive conformation
- That's all.

- Make shure Vbrun300.dll is in your Windows\System Directory if you don't have it, its available from Windows Shareware Forum "Go Winshare", Library One "Index"
- Unzip the NavRate.zip file in the directory of your choice
- Move Grid .vbv and Three.vbv to your Windows\System directory
- Make sure your Windows\System directory is in your path in your autoexec.bat.
- Use Windows Program Manager to create a new Icon use browse to find NvRate10.Exe then use browse to change the Icon. Use Csnv.exe as your icon file choose the icon.
