



# Popup



When the Developer Double Clicks on any item in the right list (fields to place into the screen), a Pop Up menu option appears allowing for the choice of these controls:

TEXT  
COMBO  
CHECK  
CHECK3D  
LIST  
OPTION  
OPTION3D

Once a control is chosen, the system changes the option in the list box and will then create that field with the requested control type.

# Options

The 'Options' dialog box is shown with the following settings:

**DATA** - Adds a Data Control to the form when created.

**CMDIALOG** - Adds a Cmdialog Control to the Form when created.

**Timer** - Adds a Timer Control to the Form when created.

**Add Button** - Creates an Add button for the user to add records with.


**Delete Button** - Creates a Delete button for the user to Delete Records with.

**Find** - Creates a Find button to allow user to enter in find equations to locate data. (For ex: if LName was a field in the table, the then user could enter LName = "Anderle" in the inputbox and the system would try to locate that record.)

**Add 3d** - Adds a 3d look to the form when running, this option adds code and calls the Function for all controls that it supports.

**CenterForm** - Adds code to automatically center the form on the screen.

# File Screen



**Locate Database** - File Finder Dialog Box pops up to ask the user where the MDB or DBF is Located. This file is then used to populate the Tables Combo Box (if MDB) and the Fields List Box (left).

**Create Form** - This File Dialog Box asks the user for a filename for the FRM file it is about to Create. This file can then be added to a Project in Visual Basic 3.0.
