1.2 preface

VLabTV is one of the first CyberGraphX projects I have written. It is comparable to EGSTV but does not need EGS. You need at least a VLab frame grabber and CyberGraphX together with a graphics board. Then you are capable of digitizing video frames on a 15/16/24 bit intuition environment. (Have a look at vlabtvprev.jpg).

As I've already said, it's my first CyberGraphX project and it is a freebie. I don't know if I continue my work on this project, it depends on your feedback.

1.3 features

- Grab VLab images and display them in a 15/16/24 bit intuition environment.
- 15/16/24 bit preview monitor
- grabbed images can be saved as simple iff files.

1.4 requirements

This software is of use only if you are running Kickstart 3.0+ and CyberGraphX. A VLab frame grabber is mandatory , of course.

What is CyberGraphX ?

The CyberGraphX system was designed to define an independant graphics standard for graphics boards. We also wanted to continue our development of workbench emulations. We could include all our knowledge of about 3 years of gfx board software development (wb-emulation of visiona, domino, picasso and now the cybervision64).

CyberGraphX is based on hardware dependant monitor drivers and hardware independant libraries. This has some advantages: Bug fixes in the workbench emulation or speed optimizations is of benefit for ALL gfx boards that are supported by the CyberGraphX system. There is no third like XpERT or Village-Tronic inbetween developers and users. That guarantees bug fixes and continued development of the software in the future.

CyberGraphX allows using of 15/16/24 screens independant of the used color model. You are able to use the cybergraphics.library functions to modify this screens. Using graphics.library functions is currently not possible but this may change in one of the next releases.

1.5 installation

To use VLabTV you just have to click on the VLabTV icon.

1.6 tooltypes

Tooltype descriptions

There are some supported tooltype parameters:

NOMSCRWIDTH

The nominal screen width your vlabtv screen should have.

NOMSCRHEIGHT

The nominal screen height your vlabtv screen should have

SCRDEPTH

The screen depth your screen should have. 15 is minimum

GRAB_X

Horizontal startposition of the grabbed image.

GRAB_Y

Vertical startposition of the grabbed image.

GRAB_WIDTH

Width of the grabbed image

GRAB_HEIGHT

Height of the grabbed image

GRAB_INPUT

Input channel which is to be used.

GRAB_VTR

if GRAB_VTR=YES, grab source is VTR by default

GRAB_LACE

If GRAB_LACE=YES, images are grabbed interlaced by default

GRAB_MODE

if GRAB_MODE=PAL, then images are grabbed in PAL mode, NTSC otherwise

PUBSCREEN

15/16/24 bit pubscreen which VLabTV should be opened on (see preview picture)
This only works with cybergraphics 40.41 and higher.

FASTYUV2RGB

If FASTYUV2RGB=YES, then a custom YUV to RGB conversion routine is used for
the monitor color preview.

Revision V0.8

- Up to 20 GrabProject are possible now
- greyscale monitor preview should be much faster now if you have at least cybergraphics.library 40.60
- diverse layout changes
- XPos,YPos,Width,Height gadgets are changeable now

Revision V0.7

- added new tooltype GRAB_MODE=(PAL|NTSC)
- added PAL/NTSC cycle gadget
- gtlayout.library is required now to use VLabTV
- VLabTV now uses the OS3.1 tapedeck.gadget in the monitor window if it's available
- added faster YUV to RGB conversion. Should improve monitor speed especially on 030 machines in color preview mode. added
- new tooltype FASTYUV2RGB=(YES|NO)
- greyscale preview monitor may be scaled and non scaled now
