

About Oil Change

Oil Change™ is a service designed to help you locate and install updates for the hardware and software on your computer using your Internet connection.

When you start the update process, Oil Change:

- n Lists the available updates for your hardware and software.
 - n Explains what the updates do and what the benefits are of getting an update.
 - n Delivers the updates using your existing Internet connection.
 - n Optionally installs the updates if useable installation procedures are available.
 - n Lets you reverse the installation of your last automatically installed update if you change your mind.

About updating your software

Oil Change acts as your PC's master mechanic. Each time you use it, Oil Change:

- n Checks CyberMedia HelpCentral to see if updates are available.
- n Displays a list of updates from which you can choose.
- n Lets you retrieve selected updates from the manufacturers' sites using the Internet.
- n Gives you options for installing the update.

If an update comes with an installation procedure that Oil Change can use, Oil Change can install the update automatically. Otherwise, Oil Change lets you save the update to your hard disk for manual installation.

Tip:

It's a good idea to create a folder for manual updates on your hard drive before downloading them. After you have created the folder, you can use Options to make it the default for all manual updates.

Note:

At this time, you can undo only the last update installed automatically by Oil Change. You should thoroughly test an installed update before retrieving the next update or installing any software manually.

About History

Oil Change keeps track of the updates that you retrieve, install, and uninstall. The History dialog allows you to review update activity.

History also tracks the following information:

- The number of applications or drivers found on your computer during the current Oil Change session.
 - The number of updates available for downloading during the current Oil Change session.
 - The cumulative total of the updates that Oil Change has retrieved, installed, or uninstalled.
 - The number of times that Oil Change has started and signed-on to CyberMedia HelpCentral.

About Undo

You should test each update after Oil Change installs it to make sure that it performs as expected. If you are dissatisfied with the update, you can use Undo to return your computer to its previous state.

You must use Undo before you retrieve a new update or manually install any software. Oil Change can perform an undo only for the last installed update.

Note:

You can use Undo to reverse any update that Oil Change installs automatically. Undo cannot be used to reverse manual updates.

About Options

Oil Change Options lets you do the following:

- n Update user profile information
- n Clear the Oil Change [disk cache](#).
- n Specify a default folder for any updates that you manually install
- n Choose your Internet connection
- n Specify settings if you connect to the Internet through a proxy server

Note:

Oil Change sends a message directing you to clear the disk cache when the stored information becomes corrupted.

About registering with CyberMedia

To protect the information in CyberMedia HelpCentral, you must register with CyberMedia before using Oil Change. You can register one of two ways:

- n Choose Oil Change New Member Registration from the Oil Change Start menu.
- n Or, just run Oil Change.

The first time you run Oil Change, you will see a Welcome New Member dialog box. If you click Register Now, you will be connected to the Oil Change Registration page. You must fill in:

- n Your member name
- n Your E-mail address
- n The password that you want to use to access Oil Change
- n A [Code word](#) that you select.

After you have completed the form, make a note of the member name, password, and code word. You enter your member name and password each time you use Oil Change. If you call CyberMedia for support, you must supply the code word as identification.

Note:

Registration information is stored on a secure CyberMedia Internet server; and if you forget your password, you can use Oil Change to retrieve a copy of it.

About finding your password

To ensure the integrity of Oil Change and the information stored on HelpCentral, CyberMedia requires that you choose a password when you register for the first time. You will enter this password each time you start Oil Change. If you forget your password, all is not lost. You can use Oil Change to retrieve a copy.

About choosing updates

Oil Change displays only the updates that are appropriate for your computer and the version of Oil Change that you are using. Oil Change also provides a description of each update. Sometimes more than one update is available for a given product. In these cases, you should carefully read the description to ensure that you are selecting the desired update.

Tip:

If you are trying to connect to a busy Internet service provider or web site, you may have to try several times before successfully retrieving an update. However, if repeated attempts fail, you should contact your service provider or the site that you are trying to connect to.

About Oil Change and your Internet connection

Oil Change uses the Internet not only to download updates, but to let Oil Change users register with CyberMedia and subscribe to the full version of Oil Change. If you've been using a browser on the Internet, you know that problems typically occur when you:

- n Attempt to connect to a site.
- n Download files.

These same problems can occur when Oil Change accesses the Internet. Usually, problems are temporary and are caused by:

- n Heavy network or internetwork traffic.
- n A server that is down for maintenance.

If Oil Change:

- n Alerts you to a problem with connecting to a site, wait a short time before trying again.

In the case of a very popular update, you may have to try several times before Oil Change successfully connects to the required site.

- n Takes an unusually long time to download, you can cancel the update and try again later.

About accessing the Internet

Oil Change relies on your Internet connection to connect to CyberMedia HelpCentral, and to the Oil Change home page. To use Oil Change to access the Internet, you must have one of the following:

- n An Internet connection through a network or a modem

Some networks have an Internet connection that you can use by connecting to the network—either directly or through dial-up networking.

- n An Internet connection through an Internet Service Provider (ISP).

If you don't connect through a network, your computer must have a modem installed. You can establish an Internet connection through an ISP, like America Online, CompuServe, Netcom, or EarthLink. An ISP acts as a middle man between you and the Internet. Your computer connects (using your modem) to the ISP's equipment, which in turn connects to the Internet.

In addition, you must also have:

- n A browser

A browser is software, such as Netscape or Internet Explorer, that allows you to view text and graphics and download files from web sites.

About protecting your privacy

Oil Change is non-intrusive. It keeps your sensitive data private.

- n The list of products and available updates that Oil Change creates never leaves your computer.
 - n CyberMedia HelpCentral is a secure database. You cannot view it by connecting to the CyberMedia web site. Only Oil Change can access HelpCentral.
 - n Registration information is kept on a secure CyberMedia server.

About accessing Oil Change features

You can access all features from the main Oil Change window. To start the update process, click Connect. To access online help, click Help. Click More to access the following features:

- n Home
- n Undo
- n History
- n Options

About automatic installation

One of the key benefits of Oil Change is its ability to automatically install an update if it has a straightforward installation procedure, that is, one that does not require user interaction. Because software manufacturers have different software design specifications, there will always be updates that have more complex installation procedures requiring user participation at certain points in the process. Oil Change cannot install these types of updates automatically.

Oil Change distinguishes between these two kinds of updates and lets you choose how you want installation to proceed:

- n Click Auto Install on the Install dialog box to have Oil Change automatically install the update if Oil Change supports the installation procedure.
 - n Click Manual Install to have Oil Change save the update on your computer's hard drive for later manual installation.

About manual installation

When Oil Change does not support an update's installation procedure, Auto Install in the Install dialog box will be unavailable. You can:

- n Click Manual Install.

Oil Change saves the update for you. You must remember to install the update later.

Note:

It is a good idea to create a folder for manual updates on your hard drive before downloading them. After you have created the folder, you can use Options to make it the default for all manual updates.

About CyberMedia HelpCentral

CyberMedia HelpCentral is a constantly monitored and revised database, residing on the Internet, that contains information about:

- n Available software updates, drivers, and fixes.
- n Web sites where these updates are located.

CyberMedia adds information to HelpCentral on an ongoing basis, thus relieving you of the chore of scouring computer-related web sites for possible software updates. Oil Change even checks for updates to its own software every time you visit HelpCentral.

Note:

If you think of the World Wide Web as a library of information, HelpCentral is a card catalog listing manufacturers' web addresses and information about available updates. Oil Change consults the card catalog, then provides you with a list of available updates. You choose whether to retrieve an update.

About CyberMedia documentation

CyberMedia provides documentation in several formats, including:

n Printed Quick Start Guide

CyberMedia includes a Quick Start Guide with all versions of Oil Change. The manual contains basic installation information and descriptions of Oil Change features.

n Online help file

CyberMedia includes online help with Oil Change. Online help is a standard Windows 95 help file that contains detailed information about using Oil Change to update your computer software and hardware using the Internet. You can get help by clicking the Help buttons located on the Oil Change windows and dialog boxes.

n Online manual

CyberMedia includes an online manual as part of the documentation for Oil Change. You can access the manual from the Oil Change home page on the CyberMedia web site.

About subscribing to Oil Change

You may be using a version of the Oil Change service that locates updates only for a selected group of hardware and software products. If you want Oil Change to search for updates for additional hardware and software products installed on your computer, you must subscribe to the Oil Change service by clicking Subscribe on the Applications and Drivers dialog box. Oil Change will start your web browser and connect to a page where you can subscribe by filling in the information, including a credit card number. CyberMedia charges a one-year subscription fee to your credit card.

About the trial version of Oil Change

If you are using a trial version of Oil Change, you have access to all the features normally available to users who subscribe to a full version of Oil Change, with one difference. Oil Change confines its search for updates to a limited set of hardware and software products. If you want Oil Change to search for all available updates for the hardware and software installed on your computer, you must subscribe to the service by clicking the Subscribe button in the Applications and Drivers dialog box.

After connecting to the home page, subscribe by filling in the information, including a credit card number, on the page. CyberMedia charges a one-year subscription fee to your credit card.

About a special version of Oil Change

If you bought a hardware or software package that includes Oil Change as part of the package, you have access to all the features normally available to users who subscribe to the full version of Oil Change, with one difference. Oil Change confines its search for updates to a limited set of products. This set of products is related to the hardware or software package that you purchased. If you want Oil Change to search for all available updates for the hardware and software installed on your computer, you must subscribe to the service by the Subscribe button in the Applications and Drivers dialog box.

After connecting to the home page, subscribe by filling in the information, including a credit card number, on the page. CyberMedia charges a one-year subscription fee to your credit card.

Installing manual updates

Usually, the software manufacturer compresses manual updates so that they take up less space on the server and transfer faster. Many updates are packaged in a single program file (.exe extension) that you decompress by double-clicking the file in the Windows Explorer. If an update does not decompress automatically, you must decompress it manually using a program such as WinZip before you can install it.

Sometimes update files are zipped. You can tell when an update is zipped because the file name has a .zip extension. You need a utility such as WinZip to unzip the update before installing it.

After you unzip or decompress an update, you can see the files contained in the update. Usually, the manufacturer places installation instructions in a text file called Readme.txt. If you don't find a Readme.txt file, check any other file that has a .txt or .doc extension for installation instructions.

Undoing automatic updates

If you want to undo an update, you should use Undo as soon as possible after Oil Change installs the update. Oil Change saves a backup copy of the original version of the software and system settings on your hard drive. However, as you use your computer, system settings change constantly. So, it is advisable to use Undo before the saved system settings become out dated.

If you use Oil Change to automatically install more than one update, Undo can reverse only the last update. Oil Change removes the old backup version to make room for a new one. This is done to keep the disk space used by Oil Change to a minimum.

Using Oil Change to update your software over the Internet

Oil Change requires:

- n An Internet connection through network or a modem

Some networks have an Internet connection that you can use by connecting to the network—either directly or through dial-up networking.

- n An Internet connection through an Internet service provider.

If you don't connect through a network, your computer must have a modem installed. You establish an Internet connection through an Internet service provider (ISP), like America Online, CompuServe, Netcom, or EarthLink. An ISP acts as a middle man between you and the Internet. Your computer connects (using your modem) to the ISP's equipment, which in turn connects to the Internet.

In addition, you must also have:

- n A browser

A browser is software, such as Netscape or Internet Explorer, that allows you to view text and graphics and download files from web sites.

Disk Cache

A disk cache is a reserved space on your computer's hard drive where a program such as Oil Change stores important information.

Code word

A code word is a unique word that you use as identification when you call CyberMedia® for service. You choose a code word when you register with CyberMedia.

Troubleshooting

If you have trouble with Oil Change™, you may find the solution to your problem in the following tables. Table 1 contains descriptions of some of the common problems you may experience when using the Internet. You may encounter these problems any time you use the Internet. They are not unique to Oil Change. Table 2 lists some of the error and alert messages you may receive when using Oil Change. These messages are provided by Oil Change and are specific to the Oil Change program.

Table 1. Common problems

Problem	Cause and Solution
Cannot connect to CyberMedia® or other web site	People are using all of the available connections to the web site. Try again later. If you use a modem to connect to the Internet, Oil Change should initiate the dialer. If you have an automatic dialing program that initiates the dialer, try activating the dialer before trying to register If you use America Online or CompuServe to connect to the Internet, start your browser before starting Oil Change.
Cannot retrieve updates	If you are trying to connect to a busy Internet service provider or web site, you may have to try several times to retrieve an update. However, if after several attempts, you still unsuccessful, you may have to contact the service provider or web site.
Slow data transfer	The speed of your modem determines, in part, how fast data transfers from the Internet to your computer. Service providers offer connections at various speeds. Try checking the speeds supported by your modem, then check with the service provider for available connections at the highest speed. You may also want to consider upgrading your modem. The Internet could be busy. The number of users trying to download data affects the data transfer rate. Try again later. Noise on the telephone line can slow data transfer. Try again later.

Table 2. Error Messages

When you receive this error	Try this
ID not recognized when running Oil Change	Wait and try to sign-on later. The CyberMedia server may be down or temporarily inaccessible.
Scan error	Do the following On the main Oil Change window, click More to display additional features. Click Options. Click the Cache tab. Click Clear.

About connecting through a proxy server

To control access to various parts of the Internet, some networks route Internet connection requests through a proxy server. Oil Change provides options which support various proxy addressing schemes, including:

- n HTTP
- n Secure
- n FTP

Your system administrator can tell you which type of address you should use.

About Home

The Home feature lets you connect to the Oil Change home page at the CyberMedia web site. Visit the home page when you want to get the latest information about what's happening to Oil Change. The home page contains links to other pages which may be of interest to you, including the CyberMedia Home page.

Sign-On

Use this dialog box to identify yourself to Oil Change. After a successful sign on, Oil Change searches your computer to identify software and hardware.

Applications and Drivers

Use this dialog to view the applications and drivers on your computer that Oil Change recognizes. You can select only one update at a time to retrieve. The size of the update and the speed of your Internet connection affect the amount of time it takes Oil Change to retrieve the update. If the update is located on a busy Web site, Oil Change may not be able to connect to the site, and you will have to try the update later.

From time-to-time CyberMedia adds complimentary updates to the list that appears in the Applications and Drivers dialog box, for example, updates to tax preparation software, and the windows operating system. If you aren't interested in these updates, you can click the plus/minus box to hide all the entries below a major entry. Also, you can select or clear the **Hide goodies** check box to hide or display these value-added entries completely.

- n To view only the applications and devices with updates, select the Show only entries that need updating check box.
- n To select an update to download, click it.

A detailed description appears in the box located in the lower half of the dialog box.

Select to display only the applications or drivers on your computer that have available updates.

When this box is selected, Oil Change hides product entries in the Windows Goodies category, as well as any value-added, complementary updates that CyberMedia provides as an ongoing service to Oil Change subscribers.

Click to retrieve the update selected in the list.

After Oil Change retrieves the update, you have the option of installing it. Based on what Oil Change knows about the update, Oil Change lets you install the update either automatically or save it in a folder so that you can install it manually. See online help for more information about installing updates.

Install

Use this dialog box to specify what to do with the retrieved update. Oil Change gives you installation options. If Oil Change can install an update automatically, the Auto Install and Manual Install buttons are available. If Oil Change cannot automatically install the update, the Auto Install button appears dim, and only Manual Install is available.

To avoid conflicts, you should close all other running applications before starting an installation.

Displays Oil Change statistics and lists the updates that you have retrieved, installed, or uninstalled using Oil Change.

Displays the last action that Oil Change performed for the update:

- n **Retrieved Update:** Oil Change successfully downloaded the update to your computer.
- n **Installed Update:** Oil Change successfully installed the update on your computer.
- n **Performed Undo:** Oil Change successfully removed the installed update from your computer.

Displays the date and time that Oil Change performed the action.

Undo

Use this dialog box to reverse the last automatic installation that Oil Change performed. Oil Change cannot reverse installations performed prior to the last update or installations performed manually.

Restore Missing System Files

Oil Change checked your computer and found that the URL.DLL, which is required to connect to the Internet, is missing. This file might have been deleted accidentally when you upgraded some of your software. A backup copy of the file has been located, and Oil Change can restore it to its proper location.

Oil Change will save the update in a folder on your hard drive. Usually, the software manufacturer compresses manual updates so that they take up less space on the server and transfer faster. Many updates are packaged in a single program file (.exe extension).

- 4 Decompress the .exe by double-clicking the file in the Windows Explorer.

You may have to use a program such as WinZip to decompress the program if it doesn't decompress automatically. After you decompress an update, find the file containing the installation instructions. Usually, the manufacturer places the installation instructions in a text file that has a .txt or .doc extension.

Warning:

You cannot use Undo to uninstall manual updates.

It's a good idea to create a folder for updates that require manual installation before starting Oil Change. You can set this folder as the default using Options.

- Start Oil Change later. The server on which CyberMedia HelpCentral is stored may be down.
