Creating a new archive:

Choose **New Archive** from the **File** menu. The first dialog will prompt you for the archive name. The following dialogs will prompt you for the files to archive. When you are finished, press "Cancel."

Restoring file from an archive:

Choose **Open Archive** from the **File** menu. You will be prompted for the files to restore.

Options:

You can archive a file either as a **Normal** file or a **MacBinary** file. [Note: Macintosh files must be archived with the **MacBinary** option or they will be unusable when you extract them. **Normal** is for MS-DOS compatibility.] With the **MacBinary** option set, both the resource fork and data forks will be archived. With the **Normal** option, the resource fork will be archived if the file has no data fork. Otherwise, only the data fork will be archived.

Compatibility:

Mac LHarc is compatible with archives created with MS-DOS LHarc v1.13, Unix LHarc, and LHarc for various other machines. Mac LHarc does not extract from self-extracting archives created under MS-DOS. It does not extract from archives containing subdirectories.

Cautions:

This program is Multifinder-aware but not perfectly so. Please use with System 6 or later.

Redistribution:

There is no restriction on redistribution, reprinting, and modifications of LHarc provided the following terms are met:

1. The copyright notice must not be altered.
2. Files from the original distribution (ie, the program and documentation) must be present in all redistributions. When a file is altered, all changes must be explicitly documented.
3. Circulate the latest version.
4. The author is not liable for any damage resulting from the program's use.
5. The author is not responsible for correcting defects in the program.
6. For commercial use, the following must be observed in addition to the above.
 - a. Commercial distribution with this program as the main product is prohibited.
 - b. No file is to be copy protected in a package that includes LHarc.

- c. LHarc is not to be provided commercially to individuals and organizations deemed unfit as its users. [Those not honoring the terms?]
- d. The commercial product's packaging, manual, or disk label must clearly print the original copyright notice and these redistribution conditions.
