

DOCUCOMP EXAMPLE

This example will demonstrate how DocuComp works. This page represents the first of two drafts, which will be compared later by DocuComp to highlight the changes between them.

By reading the two drafts, and then the DocuComp comparison, you will get a flavor of the editing marks and some of the format choices available. Of course, this is a simple example, and it may be hard to appreciate DocuComp fully until you use it on one of your own documents.

By now most of the main features of DocuComp's comparison abilities will have been demonstrated. We suggest that you make a few test runs on simple files or the DocuComp test files before beginning to use this program routinely. By changing program parameters and testing the different options you will become familiar with the variety of uses and results DocuComp can provide.

If you use DocuComp for an unusual application we would appreciate hearing from you. We are always anxious to learn about new ways in which this program can be used.

You should pay particular attention to the way DocuComp handles text that is moved. In this simple example, this paragraph will be moved two paragraphs up in the page. Although finding where the text was moved should be no problem for DocuComp, it is more complicated if changes are made to this paragraph before it is moved. The second draft of this example will in fact make changes to this paragraph and then move it. It will be interesting to see how DocuComp handles it.
