Introduction:

QM-Link/MA (MA = Multiple Account) is a QuickMail gateway to AppleLink®. QM-Link/MA

can be used to send and receive messages and files via AppleLink. QuickMail users can now exchange information via AppleLink as easily as they do with other QuickMail users on the network.

A single QM-Link gateway can be used to monitor hundreds of AppleLink accounts. In contrast, QM-Link can also allow hundreds of QuickMail users to use a single AppleLink account.

Requirements:

- 1) An AppleLink Account
- 2) QuickMail v2.01

Protocol Notes:

There are two protocols for sending and receiving files via AppleLink. The original one was EF3 and there's a new one called EFX used by AppleLink™ 5.0. We received documentation for EF3 from Apple and have written the QM-Link/MA Gateway to use that protocol. We are seeking -- but do not yet have -- approval from Apple and GEIS to include the EFX transfer protocol which is somewhat faster and may be more reliable. By the final release of QM-Link/MA we anticipate having approval for EFX.


Those with licensed copies of AppleLink 5.0 and ResEdit™ can do the following to utilize the EFX protocol within the QM-Link Gateway:

Use ResEdit to copy the JREF resource from the AppleLink 5.0 application into the QM-Link gateway. The QM-Link gateway will recognize that the JREF resource is present and will then utilize the EFX protocol.

We highly recommend using the EFX protocol if you have AppleLink 5.0.

Installation and Setup:


- 1) Copy the QM-Link/MA file and the "AppleLink.Script" file into the "QA" folder on your QuickMail Administrator machine. This must be done on the QM Server machine.
- 2) Run the QM Administrator™ application. (QM Administrator must be running for the QM-Link gateway to make a connection to AppleLink)
- 3) Select "New MailCenter" from the File menu
- 4) Give the MailCenter a name (and password) and select "QM-Link|MA" from the "Bridge" pop-up menu. Press the "OK" button

5) Select a Custodian for the AppleLink MailCenter

6) Click the "More" button.



If this is the first time you have configured the MailCenter, the copyright screen will appear. Press the “OK” button.

The main configuration window will appear.
Put the phone number used to call AppleLink in the “Phone #” field. Set the baud rate at

which you connect to AppleLink.

Use the “Script” button to select “AppleLink.Script” in the “QA” folder. The script is used to dial the modem and get connected to AppleLink. After that, the gateway itself takes over and talks to the AppleLink system. If you need to modify the script, refer the scripting appendix in your QM Administrator manual.

The “Display Connect” checkbox controls whether or not the progress of an AppleLink connection is displayed on the screen.

The “Service” and “System” fields should be pre-filled and **should not** be changed. However, users outside North America may need to change these fields.

Create Button: The Create Button allows you to set up new AppleLink accounts to be checked by the gateway.



Enter the QuickMail name for the “Account Custodian”, the AppleLink ID and password. The Account Custodian will receive any mail from this account which does not have an “ATTN” line. This can be used to map a persons AppleLink account directly to their QuickMail account.

For each account, Send and Receive parameters can also be set. These parameters control under what conditions mail is sent and received via the gateway.

Change Button: The Change Button allows you to edit information on an existing account.

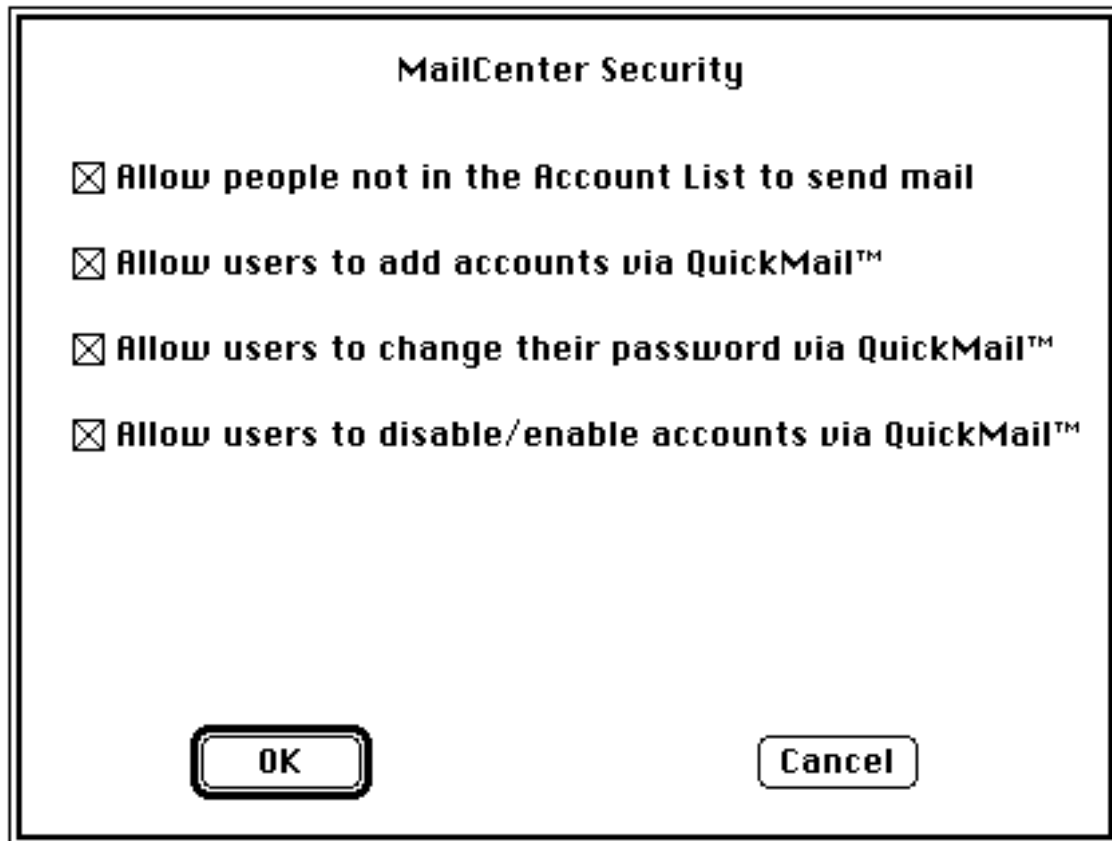

Remove Button: The Remove Button is used to permanently remove an account.

Disable (Enable) Button: The Disable Button can be used to temporarily disable an account. When an account is disabled, it will not be checked by the gateway. Clicking on a disabled account will change the Disable Button to Enable.

Import and Export Buttons: The Import Button can be used to import a list of accounts from a text file. Export will export the list of accounts to a text file.

Security: Clicking "Security" will bring up this dialog:



Allow people not in the Account List to send mail — This option allows only users with AppleLink accounts to send mail via the gateway.

Allow users to add accounts via QuickMail — The Account Maintenance form (described below) can be used to add new accounts to be checked by the gateway

Allow user to change their passwords via QuickMail — The Account Maintenance form (described below) can be used to change the password on an AppleLink account.

Allow users to disable/enable accounts via QuickMail — The Account Maintenance form (described below) can be used to enable and disable accounts.

Click the "OK" button.

7) Press the "Set Connect Times" button to configure when the MailCenter will connect to AppleLink.

8) Click the OK button.

Using the Special Forms:

QM-Link can utilize two special QuickMail forms for Administrative and User functions.

This form is used to an Add Account, Change a Password or Enable/Disable an account.

User ID Search:

This form is used to look-up addresses on AppleLink. When the gateway receives a User ID Search form, it will connect to AppleLink (at the next regular connect time) and get a list of addresses which match the search criteria. It will then return the list of addresses to the person requesting the search.

Misc. Notes:

PLEASE REMEMBER: This is BETA software and should be treated as such. We've been using it for over two months without any problems, but as with any network software, weird things can happen.

Changes from last beta:

- Corrects a problem with replies that sometimes caused a "Bad Entry" in the AppleLink MailCenter.
- Corrects a problem with sending binary files.
- User ID Search now works properly.
- If your message is sent with 'Return Receipt' ON, then the AppleLink Item Number will be returned to the Sender.
