## Viewing images one-by-one.

In the listbox on the left side of the screen you will see all images on this CD listed by filename.  
To view one of the images, simply doubleclick on the filename and the photo will be viewed.

You can get a neutral screen by clicking the button marked **Clear** or pressing **ALT+C**.

## SlideShows

You can view all the images on this CD in a continuous loop, with the SlideShow function.

To enter the SlideShow, simply click on the button marked **SlideShow**, positioned in the lower left corner of the screen. You can also press **ALT+S**.

You will then see a dialog-box with options for the slideshow.

You can select either automatic or slideshow controlled by yourself, by checking one of the RadioButtons.

The automatic slideshow will show all images in a continuous loop with an interval that you decide. To decide the interval, simply enter the interval in seconds in the inputbox.

The user-controlled slideshow will view the first image, and when you click with the mouse any place in the picture, the next image is viewed - and so on...

When you are done with your selections, click the button marked **OK** to start the slideshow, or click the button marked **Cancel** to return without slideshow.

When the automatic slideshow is running, you can pause it by clicking the button marked **Pause** or pressing **ALT+P**. You continue by clicking the button marked **Continue** or by pressing **ALT+C**.

When the user-controlled slideshow is running, you can get a neutral screen by clicking on the button marked **Clear** or pressing **ALT+C**.

The slideshows can be terminated by clicking the button marked **Break** or by pressing **ALT+B**.

## Video

If the CD contains videosequences, you will see a button marked **Video** on the left side of the screen.

When you click this button, a new window named **Video** will cover the screen **OR**

if Video for Windows isn't installed on your computer, a dialogbox will ask you if you want to run Setup

- Select the button marked **Yes**, and follow the instructions.

On the left side of the screen, you will see 5 or 10 thumbnail-pictures, each representating a videosequence. Simply click on a thumbnail-picture to start the video.

When the video is running, you can click on the left side (marked PANIC) to stop the video and get a neutral screen. You return to the thumbnails by clicking the left side (marked OK).

You return to the main window, by clicking the button marked **Exit**.

## GIF-Format

GIF files were designed by CompuServe to create the smallest possible image files for uploading and downloading from electronic Bulletin Board Systems (BBS).

There are two GIF file versions; 87a and 89a. Version 87a was the first of the two versions to appear. Version 89a added new features to the 87a format.

Both versions may use an encoding method referred to as interlacing. When an image is saved by using four passes instead of just one, it is called interlacing. On each pass, certain lines of the image are saved to the file. If the program decoding a GIF file displays the image as it is decoded, the user will be able to see the four passes of the decoding cycle. This will allow the user to get a good idea of what the image will look like before even half of the image is decoded.

## Change category

When you click the button marked Category, you will see a dialogbox with the categories listed as radiobuttons.

You select a new category by clicking one of the radiobuttons, and then click the button marked OK.

## Read stories

If the CD contains stories, you will see a button marked Text on the left side of the screen. When you click the button marked Texts, you will see a new screen with a file-listbox on the left side, showing all the textfiles on the CD. When you doubleclick on a filename, the text will appear and you can scroll up and down to read the story.

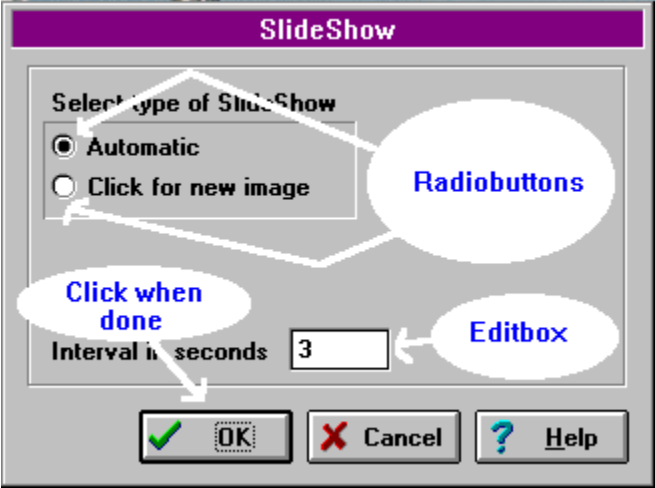
A RadioButton is a circular area next to a text, and when you click in the circle you select the option described by the text. When a RadioButton is selected or checked, it shows a black mark in the circle. Only one radiobutton in a group can be selected at the same time.

A Checkbox is a small square next to a text, and when you click in the square you select the option described by the text. When a Checkbox is selected or checked, it shows a black cross in the square. More than one checkbox in a group can be selected at the same time.

An InputBox is an area where the user can enter text or numbers. To enter data in the inputbox, it must be active - that is the cursor must be in the box. To make an inputbox active, you either use the TAB-key or click in the box with the mouse.

You navigate up and down the listbox by clicking the arrow-buttons on the top and bottom in the right side of the listbox. You can also use the slide on the right side of the listbox.

Video for Windows is a program that allows you to play .AVI files containing video-sequences under Windows. If Video for Windows isn't installed, the program will not be able to run video.
