1.2 Intro to Graphic Workbench

Hello and welcome to the wonderfull world of Graphic Workbench

Relax, sitback and let The Conspiracy enhance your dreary old Workbench

OK first things first, thanks for taking an interest in Graphic Workbench we hope you will find this program of some use to you.

Graphic Workbench is a program that places a backdrop of your choice into your WBPattenr, and whatever backdrop you have chosen a set of corresponding icons will be added as your partition icons. The excellent program WBVerlauf by Christian A. Weber will also be added and set up so it blends in with your backdrop. Each backdrop will have it's own WBverlauf configuration.

No backdrop will be placed in your windows, but if you wish you

can set it up so as the pic showing on your Workbench will also be displayed when you open a window. Alternatively on disk 1 you will find a directory called "WindowPics" in there you will find some tile size pics of various Amiga logo's etc that will use far less memory than a full backdrop. Be warned though that some logo's may cause a colour clash with the newly configured palette, so choose wisely young jedi knight.

In essence what you have here is a demo, although Disk 1 is the main program and will never change, Disk 2 is a selection of backdrops and icons taken from a series of Data Disks that cover individual subjects ie. Glamour, Sci-Fi, Fantasy, WbPattern, Games etc.

This demo disk has a selection of 10 backdrops & icons, there should be something on here for all tastes whether you're into starTrek or Fantasy or even nice pieces of tottie.

DOOM on the Amiga - Well not quite, we may not have the game running on our Amiga's but now you can have the backdrop & icon set sitting on your workbench screen and it's on the Demo Disk so run along now children.

1.3 Requirments for Graphic Workbench to run

You will need an AGA Amiga with a HD, and although not essential some extra memory would be a help.

Where we believe our program stands out from the rest is our Partition Icons are designed specifically to complement the selected backdrop giving your Workbench a much more Graphically pleasing look. To achieve this it may take up that bit more memory but we believe the results justify this.

As we said earlier extra memory is not essential but you'll be amazed by the difference an extra 2mb fast ram makes. When the Amiga 1200 was first launched 2 MB Ram sounded massive, but how big is it once you've fitted a Hard Drive, after Workbench boots up your lucky if you have 1 Mb left just try running Image FX, Photogenics, or even just compressing files with LHA it's a nightmare. We personally use the Viper board and The Blizzard 1220/4 satisfaction gauranteed. The only trouble the 1220/4 caused was on incompatibility on Macks system with the Zappo CD Rom drive. Although that has now been solved with the release of the latest install software v12 from Archos.

So make the leap, invest in FAST Ram today & support The Amiga

1.4 How to install Graphic Workbench

How do I Install Graphic Workbench?

Installation could not be simpler, the first time you load Graphic Workbench you will be given two choices you can either A. View all the backdrops before making your choice or B. Install a backdrop & icon set there and then. Obviously if you have just booted up for the first time you will wish to view the backdrops first before making your choice.

What files will be placed on my Hard Drive?

If this is the first time using the program we will save your old icons & system configurations etc in a Directory called T.M.C this will be created in your SYS:Prefs partition so your old icons can be re-installed

The program wbverlauf will be placed in the WBstartup drawer. And the new icons to match the backdrop you chose will be renamed as Disk.info and placed in the appropriate partition.

Your WBPatten & Screenmode prefs will also be changed so as to show of the backdrop & icons at the correct configuration

What do I need to do to view the Backdrop & Icon set I selected?

Simply reset your computer the computer needs to be reset so so the workbench screen can remap itself into the colours used by the backdrop. After a simple reset you then see your selection in all it's glory

What has happened to my old icons?

Your old Icons and backdrop (if you had one) are quite safe and have been saved and placed in a Drawer called T.M.C which can be found in the Prefs Drawer in your Workbench partition.

I've just remembered a bit of information that may be helpfull in using Graphic Workbench, each backdrop has 6 accompanying icons (we figure not many people have more than 6 partitions). On some icons it has the partition names written on them ie. SlaineIvory has some stunning icons with dh0, dh1, ram etc written in the top corner, the ram icon obviously is not a

problem but if your one of those people whose partitions are named differently ie HD1 or bobsdrive 1 etc you will find the 6th icon "Default" is identical to the rest with exception of missing out the partition name So you could use this icon to replace all partition icons or you could use a program such as iconian and adjust the icons to suit.

NOTE. Any backdrop set that has icons with the partition names written on them will have a default icon that has no partition name on it.

1.6 How old is Graphic Workbench

This the first release of Graphic Workbench, hopefully it will be an ongoing process with the release of Data Disks.

Graphic Workbench is really The Complete Picture II but with a much better user interface and a WB3 look.

When we first started work on GWb we were not sure what form it should take, initially it was going to be 3 disks with 2 of the disks packed with as many backdrops and icons as we could fit on. Gradually we decided that only 2 disks was a much better idea, Disk 1 being the main program and disk 2 being a demo of some of the backdrops and icons available through theData Disks. This also had the added bonus of being cheaper to post.

1.7 Who wrote Graphic Workbench and Why?

Graphic Workbench was written by The Surgeon from an original idea by Mack.

The idea behind Graphic Workbench came after reading Amiga Format and seeing in their "Workbench" section pictures of Amiga Workbench's with brill pictures adorning the background, a quick check of the shit Amiga manual informs me I can place a picture in the WBPattern and it will be displayed every time I bootup.....Amazing!!!

It started there really, we first brought out "Backdrop Stramash" which was just 12 pictures that you would have to install yourself and to be honest was pretty poor. Then came "The Complete Picture" which we felt was a pretty good program but it never really took off. Ironically it is now just appearing in the adverts for PD Houses. The reason we think TCP never really flourished was A. We never distributed it well enough. B. It wasn't as stable as Gwb ie. if you installed a backdrop and icon set it used to just delete your old ones to hell. and C. the name was shit if you see Graphic_Workbench listed in an advert you have a rough idea what it is, I don't think you can say the same for The Complete Picture.

The Surgeon took nearly 10 months to write the installer and all the programming bits for this program, God knows what took so long. ps from the Surgeon A voice in my ear kept saying "I Think We Should Change That Picture For This One "

If Your Drives Are Not Called Dh0: Dh1: Dh2: etc

Hopefully if this is the case you copied the originals first and never ruined them {if so send them to us telling us your partition names} this program needs to know the partition names as in dh0: jh0: hd0: etc not the pet names as in workbench: work: games: etc

If you are unsure about the partition names open up a SHELL or CLI window this can be found in the systems drawer type the word INFO then press return you will find the information you require here remember if it starts with the letters DF then it is probably a floppy disk drive ignore ram: ignore cc0 as this is whatever is plugged into your PCIMA slot now you should be left with the partition names we are looking for

Take a note of them and run Graphic_Workbench again

1.20 RAM.INFO

You will probably find the computer has stored a ram icon somewhere this is usually found in your main partition or in the s directory under the name ram.info if you look in your startup-sequence or user startup you may find a line telling the computer to copy ram.info or disk.info to ram: put a semicolon ; in front of this line and reboot the computer This should solve your Problem

1.21 ICON COLOURS RUBBISH

The only time we at the conspiracy had this problem was when NEW ICONS was running so try switching it off , removing it from WBstartup or if it runs from Startup-Sequence or user-Startup edit it, put a ; in front of the line and reboot your machine.

Note From Mack I actually run Graphic Workbench & NewIcons at the same time, it really just depends on what backdrop you have installed i.e. I'm running the Nova backdrop while running NewIcons with no problem, but i am aware that on some backdrop sets NewIcons can cause a problem. The solution, yes there is one, although not particularly user friendly. First step, switch of NewIcons then install the backdrop set of your choice, then using an icon editing program such as "Iconian" save your disk.info's as brushes. Now switch NewIcons back on & reboot. Having rebooted you now want to run your icon editor again, load in the brushes of your disk.info's and they will remap themselves to uneffected colours, then just save them as disk.info's to the relevant partitions and as if by Magic.... I hope this helps you & with a little time & patience all problems can be overcome.

Open up a shell window found in sys:systems and copy the file you want to edit just incase it goes wrong
