Well, now that this has been tested and is in working order with little or no bugs, I am finally making it available to the public at an incredible low price.

OBSERVANT BYSTANDER

Excuse me, but what the hell are you talking about?

TED

This is a set of QuicKeys and other files that will automate your scriptwriting without having to plunk down \$500 for a package designed specifically for that.

BYSTANDER

What do I need?

TED

MS Word 5.0, QuicKeys, and, of course, your imagination.

BYSTANDER

I'm doing okay everywhere but in the imagination department.

TED

I'm sure you can work on that. This collection of QKs provides the scriptwriter with INT & EXT lines, numbered, of course; description lines, character lines, dialog lines, stage direction lines, and transition lines.

BYSTANDER

It sounds too difficult for me.

TED

It's not difficult at all! We've used the power of Word and QK to automate everything but the typing! For example, I have hardly hit any function key while typing this. The computer knows exactly what line to go to! I start with INT. or EXT. and then push return. My next line is automatically formatted for description! When I am done with descriptive paragraphs, I type a F9, and I can type a character's name, *pre-0formatted!* When I hit return, it goes to the dialog format *automatically!* Another return and I am ready for another character! If, at any time I want to change lines I just type the appropriate F key, and I am ready to go. And there are only 8 different f-keys to know!

BYSTANDER

It does sound truly amazing. But you wouldn't just give this out for free, would you? I mean, what will it cost me?

TED

(snickering loudly)

A mere ten dollars.

BYSTANDER

Wow! I would pay several hundred!

TED

That is also acceptable. But ten dollars will be adequate. Just send it to this address:

2 EXT. BYSTANDER'S HOUSE, ON THE FRONT LAWN

BYSTANDER is quickly licking envelope, and places it in his mailbox, putting the little red flag in the "up" position.

3 INT. YOUR OFFICE

BYSTANDER arrives, taps TED on shoulder.

BYSTANDER
Uh, how do I install it?

TED
Simple. Take the files from the Sequences folder and the KeySets folder and put them in your Sequences folder and KeySets folder in the QuicKeys folder in your Preferences folder.

BYSTANDER
Then what do I do?

TED
Replace the MS Word Prefs file in your preferences folder with the MS Word Prefs file.

BYSTANDER
And then?

TED
Write a script!

BYSTANDER
What about all those F-Keys?

TED
(turning red)
Oops. I almost forgot. Here they are:

Magically, the wall behind TED changes into a listing:

F1 INT. Slug Line

F2 EXT. Slug Line

F5 Description

F9 Character

F10 Dialog

F12 Stage Direction (for characters)

F13 Delete Previous Paragraph

F15 Transition Line

BYSTANDER

Anything else I need to know?

TED
