









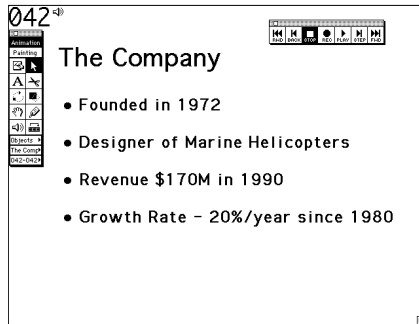


- 5. Select Move Up.**

In frame 001, the first bullet now appears at the bottom of the frame.

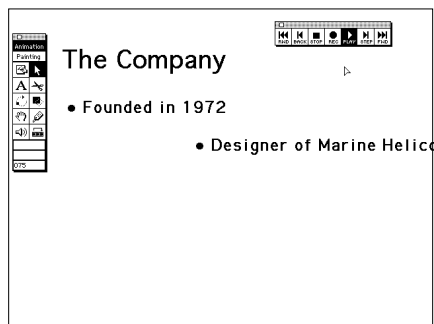




- 9. From the Animate menu, choose AutoMotion and drag right and down to select Move Left.**

Cinematic moves the text bullets to the right off the screen.

- 10. Click Play on the Controls palette to see the new animated slide.**



- 11. On the Controls palette, click Stop.**

- 12. Click the Frame Selection Indicator in the Tools palette and select “Worldwide Distribution”.**







When you reach the last bullet, Cinemation will advance to the next frame. In this case, that is the beginning of the movie.

**16. On the Controls palette, click Stop.**

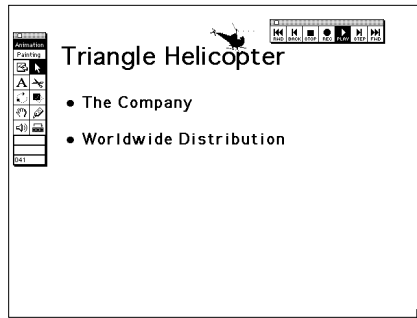

**5. In the Controls palette, click Play.**

You will see that an animated helicopter has been added to your first slide.



Once the frames and music for Slide 1 play, Cinemation pauses before going to the next slide. A hand appears on the screen to indicate that you should click to continue. Whenever you import a presentation Scrapbook into Cinemation, a pause until mouseclick and a transition will automatically be added to each slide.

**6. Click the mouse to continue.**

Cinematic plays the frames for the next slide.
