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Help File Conventions

This Help File uses certain conventions when describing special events. The conventions used are:-

Hot Spots

In various topics within this Help File, graphics are used to show the visible appearance of an aspect of Smart Address. These graphics have areas called 'Hot Spots' which are areas within the graphic that may be clicked with the mouse to display information about that part of the graphic. The <Tab> key may also be used to "tab" to these Hot Spots.

Keyboard Interaction:-

Where keyboard interaction is possible, the keystrokes used will be indicated within < > markers. For example:-

"<Ctrl> and <U>" means press the CTRL Key and the U Key at the same time.

"<Right Arrow> or <Up Arrow>" means press EITHER the Right Arrow Key or the Left Arrow Key.

Menu Interaction:-

When Menu Commands are referred to, they will be specified as "Menu Name | Menu Command", meaning the command required is to be found under the Menu Name given. For example:-

"File | Printer Setup" means the Printer Setup Command found under the File Menu

Smart Address has been designed as an easy to use and convenient Telephone and Address Book for your Windows Desktop. By having Smart Address always running, you will have your telephone numbers and addresses only a mouse click away.

Smart Address supports multiple Address Books open at any one time, with each Address Book being displayed in its own Window.

Some of the many facilities supported, include:-

- Keep notes with every entry.
- Group entries into user definable categories.
- Flexibility. Nearly all aspects of Smart Address are customizable by the user.
- Associate dates with entries. Smart Address will even remind you when a date is due. For example, Birthdays, Customer call required, etc.
- Export and Import entries to and from text files.
- Powerful Search and Indexing capabilities
- Inserts entries directly into your Word Processor
- Dials telephone numbers for you (Modem required)
- Powerful print facilities, supporting envelopes, address labels and lists.
- Automatic back-up of your Address Books
- Plus many more....

An Overview of Smart Address

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An Overview of Smart Address

Smart Address has been designed as an easy to use, yet powerful, Address Book Management application. Smart Address works by allowing multiple Address Books to be created to store differing sets of Addresses. Because Smart Address uses the Windows Multi-Document Interface (MDI), as many Address Books as the user wants, may be open at any one time.

Each Address Book is stored as a disk file and holds all the Address Information and 'personality' of that Address Book. The 'personality' is the customizable aspects of a Book, the labels used for data fields, which data fields are actually displayed, the Index Criteria for restricting entries displayed, etc. As disk files can be damaged or lost, and often users forget to back-up their files, Smart Address by default will always create a back-up copy of each Book when it is closed. If there are then problems with the disk file, Smart Address can use the back-up file and recreate the lost or damaged Book in full.

Smart Address has most facilities associated with Address Management available. There is a facility to Import Address Lists. that may have been created by other applications. into an Address Book and also a facility to export entries from an Address Book. A use for which may be for example, to create a Mail Merge Data File for a Word Processor. There are various printing capabilities, allowing envelopes, labels or text listings to be produced for any range of Address entries.

An important facility within Smart Address is the Reminders function. This function allows dates to be set for an entry and instruct Smart Address to remind you when that date becomes due. Smart Address can also automatically advance the set date by any period, once you have acknowledged it. This facility is designed to allow Birthdays, Customer Calls, etc. to be scheduled.

There are also very powerful search and index capabilities, allowing the user to be able to restrict the entries displayed to their requirements and therefore be able to access whatever subset of information is needed.

Above all, Smart Address has been designed to be totally flexible and customizable. The user isn't forced to use the default design of an Address Book, they may amend the layout to suit their needs. In fact an Address Book doesn't even have to be used for Addresses. For example, the author has been using an Address Book to hold his Network Workstation hardware and configuration details. With the Search and Index capabilities, he has quick access to any of this information. Simply by changing the field labels and which fields are displayed, the whole concept of what an Address Book is used for can be altered.



How Smart Address Indexes Entries

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How Smart Address Indexes Entries

Smart Address requires each entry to have an Index. This Index is used to represent the entry within the "Index List" and is also used to restrict entries when an "Index Criteria" is set.

By default, each entry's Index Field will be set to <Default Index>. This Default Index is defined via the "Options | Preferences Command (Address Book Tab)" command and is unique to each Address Book. Changing the Address Book's Default Index, will re-index the whole of the Address Book.

For example, if the Address Book Default Index was set for the "Name" field, each entry's "Name" would appear in the Index List. Changing the default Index to say the "Company" field, would result in each entry's "Company" appearing in the Index List. In situations where the Default Index is changed to a field that is empty in an entry, Smart Address will attempt to Index that entry on the "Name" field and if that field is also empty, it will then Index it on the "Company" field. As the "Name" or "Company" field must be completed for each entry, Smart Address will always be able to assign a valid index to an entry.

This behavior can be changed by overriding the Index Field at entry level. Within each entry's data, a value is held defining the field that is to be used for the Index. As detailed above, by default this is set to the Address Books Default Index. By selecting a different field to use as the Index for an entry, the user may force that entry to always Index on that field, regardless of changes to the Address Books Default Index.



Using the Tag Entry Facility
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Using the Tag Entry Facility

Whilst the Search and Index facilities of Smart Address allow the user to access various subsets of entries easily and quickly, there is sometimes a requirement to restrict a subset even more and without any logic to the restriction required.

To cater for these instances, Smart Address allows entries to be "Tagged". When an entry is "Tagged", that entry will be indicated in Red, within the Index List. Multiple entries can be tagged at any time and the Index List restricted to show just tagged entries or even just entries that are not tagged. Using this facility a new and non-logical subset of the Index List may be built.

Certain facilities within Smart Address can make use of the presence of tagged entries by allowing tagged entries to be specified as a range for processing. These include, Printing, Exporting and Deleting of Entries.

As an example for the use for tagging, take a situation where the user wishes to produce a selective Mail Merge file for their Word Processor. The selection he might require is all the entries that belong to a category of "Prospects" and that the user has phoned that day. While restricting the Index List to entries having a category of "Prospects" is easy, using the Index or Search commands, it isn't easy to restrict to entries he has contacted that day. By making use of the Tag facility, he can tag each entry as he contacts them and then produce the Mail Merge file using the tagged entries only.

It should be noted that tags are not saved within the Address Book. Tags are temporary flags that may be attached to any entry.



Printing with Smart Address

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Printing with Smart Address

Smart Address allows entries to be printed in various formats and supports the printing of Envelopes, Address Labels and Text Listings.

Smart Address handles printing by allowing Print Styles to be defined that contain information as to what stationary the print will use, the layout of the fields on that stationary, the character fonts to be used and the fields that are to be printed. Smart Address also allows a Return Address and a logo to be printed on Envelopes and Address Labels.

Print Styles are grouped by the stationary type. For example, the Print Style of "Monarch Envelope" contains it's own unique definitions of layout, fonts and fields for printing. All of these definitions may be set-up via the "File | Printer Setup" command.

By default, Smart Address supports a large variety of common Envelope and Address Label formats, but user definable formats may be set-up using the two supplied "Custom" formats, or by the user creating their own new format. For information on creating a new format, see the Hints and Tips section of this Help File.

Smart Address, groups printing into two basic types, Envelope Printing and Label/Listing Printing. Each type may be associated with it's own Print Style and it's own Printer. This caters for users that may have a printer allocated for Address Labels and another for Envelopes, but the two types may use the same printer if required.

As mentioned above, Smart Address provides a basic facility for printing Text Listings. Text Listings allow entries to be printed in a format suitable, for example, for insertion into a "Filofax" or just as a simply text print. The Text Listing Print Style shares the same printer type as Address Labels and the output format for text listings may be defined via the "File | Printer Setup" command. Due to the varied differing formats of possible listings, Smart Address is only supplied with a couple of example Listing Styles.

It should be noted that when Smart Address prints Labels or Listings the output printed is 'clipped' to fit the output area defined. This means for example, that if the output is too long to fit on a defined label, Smart Address will only print the part of the line that fits on the label. This stops the next label being over-printed with the data from the previous label. If this facility is required to be turned off for some reason, see the Hints and Tips section of this Help File for the method to do this.



Importing Text Files to Smart Address
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Importing Text Files to Smart Address

Smart Address enables text files containing Address Entries, to be imported into an Address Book. In order for these files to be imported, they need to be in a certain format and then mapped using the "File | Import" command to the various data fields within the Address Book.

The required format, is a format called "Comma Delimited" or "Comma Separated Values", CSV for short. This means that each Address Entry needs to start on a new line of the text file, with each data field of that entry being separated by a certain character. Generally this character is a "," but Smart Address allows for other characters to be used.

For example:-

"Mr.", "A.N. Other", "", "", "Address Line 1", "Address Line 2", "Address

In the above example, the Address lines of the entry are represented by separated data fields for each line. This would require, when mapping the import fields using the "File | Import" command, each Address line to be mapped to it's associated Address line in the Address Book. Smart Address, also allows Address Lines to be imported that are represented as one data field. For example:-

"Mr.", "A.N. Other", "", "", "Address Line 1 <CR> Address Line 2 <CR> Address ...

In this example, the Address lines are separated by Carriage Returns, with the Address being represented as a single field. When mapping the import fields in this case, the Address field should only be mapped to the first Address line in the Address Book. Smart Address will automatically split this Address into the required separate lines.

If it is required to have quote (") within a data field, then the quote should be duplicated, which instructs Smart Address that the quote is part of the data and not a field delimiter. For example:-

"Mr.", "A.N. Other", "", "", "99 ""Riverview"" House", ".....

In this example, the first Address line will be imported as: 99 "Riverview" House

Import / Export File Format

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Import / Export File Format

The file format rules used by Smart Address when importing and exporting files are as follows:-

- Each record starts on a new line and is terminated by a <Carriage Return> (#13) and <Line Feed> (#10) character.
- Each field within a record is enclosed in quotes (") and is separated by a comma (,). The comma may be replaced by another character using the "Options | Preferences" command.
- Quotes within a data field are duplicated. For example, "A House ""Name"" " would be imported as: A House "Name"
- Line breaks within the Notes field should be represented by a single <Carriage Return> (#13) character.

Note: #?? refers to the ASCII character code.



Using Date Reminders in Smart Address

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Using Date Reminders in Smart Address

An important part of Smart Address is the Reminders facility. This facility allows dates to be set for an entry and have Smart Address, remind you when those dates become due. The amount of advance warning that Smart Address gives you, can be configured by the user. By default, Smart Address will use two days advance warning.

Lets use the following example, to explain the use of Date Reminders:-

The user has configured one of the three date fields to use as a Birthday field and has entered the date of a Birthday. By default, Smart Address will not take any action for this date, as the default reminder is that of "No Reminder". However, as the field is being used for Birthdays, the user has set the reminder to "Yearly Reminder", as Birthdays are yearly events.

Smart Address then constantly checks the date of this entry against the current date . When the date is approaching and falls within the defined advance warning period, Smart Address will indicate that the date is becoming due, by placing a Yellow "Warning" indicator next to the date concerned and next to the entry in the Index List. The user can then send a Birthday card to the person concerned and then acknowledge the reminder using the "Tools | Acknowledge Reminder" command. As the reminder was set as "Yearly Reminder", Smart Address will then automatically advance the date by one year, so that the user will be reminded to send another Birthday card next year.

If the user hadn't acknowledged the reminder, then Smart Address would take no further action until the Birthday matched the current day. Smart Address would then replace the Warning indicator with a Green "Due Today" indicator, indicating that there is an action due today for that entry. If the user still did not acknowledge the reminder, then when the Birthday was past, Smart Address would replace the "Due Today" indicator with a Red "Entry Overdue" indicator. This Overdue indicator will remain until the user acknowledges it.



Using the Auto-Dial Facility

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Using the Auto-Dial Facility

Smart Address has a built in Automatic Dialing facility, that allows a telephone number contained within an Address Book to be dialed. It should be noted, that to use this facility a Modem is required to be attached to the computer.

Auto-Dial has a facility that can be configured so that prefixes may be added to telephone numbers. This allows situations where it may be necessary to first dial a number to obtain an outside line, or to select a different telephone service provider, to be catered for. It also caters for internal telephone extensions to be automatically recognized. For example, if the user has set a prefix up to be added to all dialed numbers to select an outside line, this prefix wouldn't be required when dialing an internal extension. By making use of the automatic identification of extensions, this is based on the length of the number being dialed, Smart Address will know not to add the outside line prefix.

Also built into the Auto-Dial facility, is a re-dial function. This function allows Smart Address to be configured to automatically re-dial a telephone number if that number is found to be busy when it's dialed. Smart Address will continue to dial the number, until either it rings or is canceled by the user.

Automatic Recovery of Corrupt Address Books

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Automatic Recovery of Corrupt Address Books

If Smart Address attempts to open an Address Book that has become damaged or could not be located (maybe it's been deleted, or moved), Smart Address will display a message informing the user of this problem.

If Smart Address detects that a back-up copy exists for the Address Book concerned, Smart Address will offer to automatically recover the Address Book from it's back-up copy. If this action is taken, Smart Address will rebuild the Address Book and open it.

If no back-up copy is detected, then Smart Address will terminate the Open request.

By default, Smart Address automatically creates a back-up copy of an Address Book when that Book is closed. The back-up copy is saved to the same disk location as the original Address Book. This automatic back-up, can be disabled by the user using the "Options | Preferences" command. It should be noted however, that if the back-up facility is disabled, then Smart Address will not be able to automatically recovery any lost or corrupt Books. Due to this, the automatic back-up should only be disabled, if the user performs his own back-up processes.

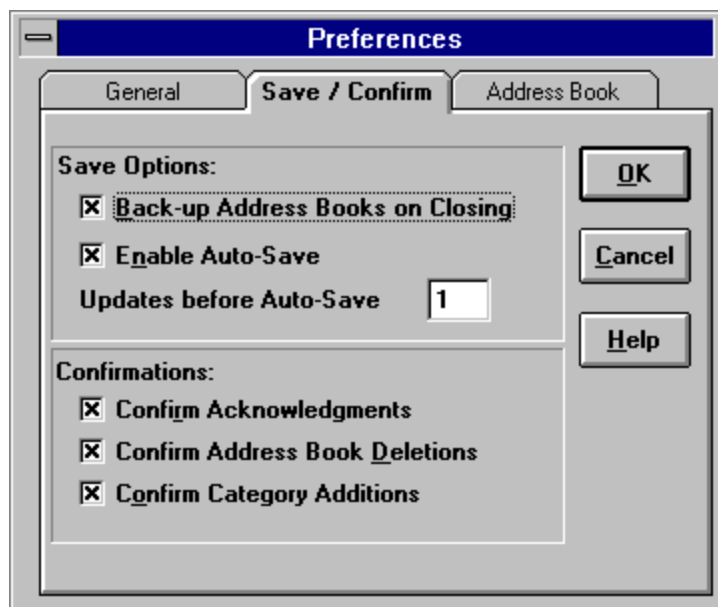

Securing your Smart Address Files

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Securing your Smart Address Files

Whilst Smart Address provides an automatic back-up facility for backing up your Address Books when they are closed, you should still take your own security of your Address Books. The main reason for this being that the automatic back-ups are saved to the same physical location on your disk as your original Address Books. If that directory on your disk was to be deleted or lost, then you would also lose your back-up Books as well as your original Books.

It is therefore recommended that you add your Address Books and the changeable files within Smart Address to your regular disk security. The files that should be backed up are :-

Address Books

Any file with the extension .ADR

Smart Address Configuration Files

SMARTADR.CFG (This will be in the Smart Address Directory)

SMARTADR.INI (This will be in your Windows Directory)



Adding a New Word Processor to Smart Address

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Adding a New Word Processor to Smart Address

In order for Smart Address to allow a Word Processor to be defined, it needs to know certain information about that Word Processor. By default, Smart Address is supplied with a selection of common Word Processors already defined. It may be however, that the Word Processor that you use, is not defined.

The following describes how you can define a new Word Processor to Smart Address:-

You should always back-up SMARTADR.CFG before editing it. Failure to do so can cause problems running Smart Address if the file should become damaged.

- 1 Using Microsoft Write or another such editor, open the SMARTADR.CFG file that resides in the same directory as SMARTADR.EXE (the Smart Address Program)
- 2 Locate the section [Word Processors]
- 3 Insert a line within this section for the Word Processor you wish to use. The format of this line is :-

Word_Processor_Name=Caption_Bar

Where:-

Word_Processor_Name is the name you wish to use to reference the Word Processor, using Smart Address.

Caption_Bar is the caption title for the Word Processors main window. The Word Processor should not have documents currently open when you check the caption title.

- 4 Exit Write, or the editor used, first saving the modified file.
- 5 Exit and Restart Smart Address and select the new Word Processor using the "Options | Configure Word Processor" command.

If after defining the new Word Processor, Smart Address will not insert the entry to it, check that you specified the correct Caption_Bar as without this, Smart Address is unable to locate the application required.



Adding a New Envelope, Label or Listing Style

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Adding a New Envelope, Label or Listing Style

Smart Address is supplied with a large selection of pre-defined Envelope, Address Labels and a few Text Listing Styles. It may be however, that you will wish to define your own Style in addition to using the supplied "Custom" Styles available.

The following describes how you can define a new Print Style to Smart Address:-

You should always back-up SMARTADR.CFG before editing it. Failure to do so can cause problems running Smart Address if the file should become damaged.

- 1 Using Microsoft Write or another such editor, open the SMARTADR.CFG file that resides in the same directory as SMARTADR.EXE (the Smart Address Program)
- 2 Locate the section [Styles]
- 3 Insert a line within this section for the Print Style you wish to define. The format of this line is :-

Style_Description=Style_Id

Where:-

Style_Description is a description of the new Print Style.

Style_Id is either 11 for an Envelope Style, 12 for a Label Style or 13 for a Listing Style

- 4 Exit Write, or the editor used, first saving the modified file.
- 5 Exit and Restart Smart Address and configure the New print Style using the "File | Printer Setup" command.

It is important to ensure the new Print Style is configured before using as various settings relating to the Style layout need defining via the Printer Setup command.



Converting Old Version Address Books
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Converting Old Version Address Books

With Version 2.0, the file format of Address Books changed to cater for the increased amount of information each Address Book now holds. Smart Address will automatically offer a conversion of any previous version's Address Book that is opened.

Alternatively, you may elect to only open the old Address Book as Read Only. In this case, Smart Address will not convert the Book to the new file format, but as a result will only allow the Address Book to be read and not updated.

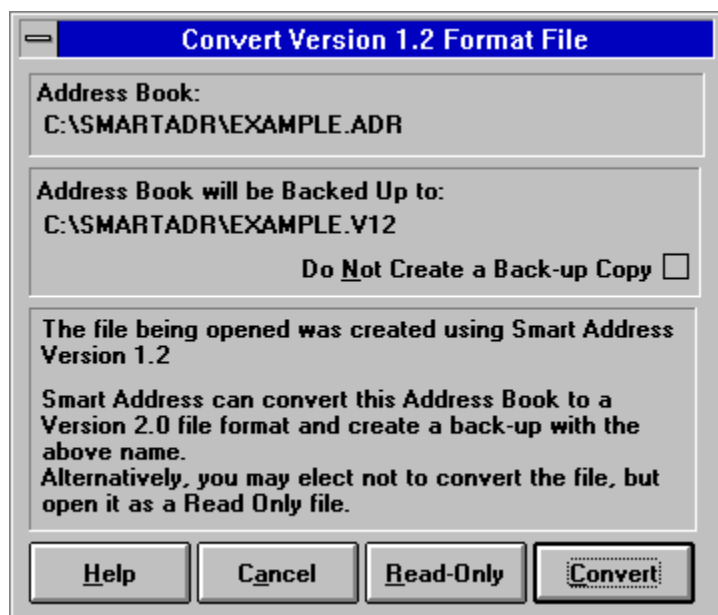

Copying A Field to and from the Windows Clipboard
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Copying A Field to and from the Windows Clipboard

Whilst Smart Address provides a command to copy a complete entry to the Clipboard and a command to Paste a complete entry from the Clipboard to an entry, you can also copy a single field, or part of a field, to and from the Windows Clipboard.

Copying a Field to the Clipboard

In order to copy a field to the Windows Clipboard, highlight the text within the field to be copied, using the mouse or <Shift> and <Cursor Keys>, and then press <Ctrl> and <C>. The highlighted text will then be copied to the Clipboard.

Copying Text from the Clipboard to a Field

Position the cursor in the field to receive the text and at the location within the field you wish the text to go and then press <Ctrl> and <V>. The text on the Clipboard will then be inserted into the field selected.



Creating Address Book Icons on Your Desktop

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Creating Address Book Icons on Your Desktop

Address Books produced by Smart Address are automatically associated with Smart Address. This means that Smart Address can be started and an Address Book opened by simply double-clicking on the Address Book in Windows File Manager, or by entering the Address Book name, including its Path, at Program Managers "File | Run" Command.

This also allows Icons to be set-up within a Group in Program Manager. Once an Icon is set-up, double-clicking on the Icon will open the associated Address Book for you.

The quickest way to create an Icon for an Address Book, is to open File Manager and Program Manager so they are both visible. Using File Manager, locate one of your Address Books. Click once on the Address Book and without releasing the mouse button, 'drag' the Address Book out of File Manager and 'drop' it on one of Program Managers Icon Groups.

Double-clicking of this new Icon, will open the Address Book that was 'dragged'.

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Creating a Mail Merge File for Word for Windows

Smart Address can via use of the "File | Export" Command produce Mail Merge Data Files for input to a Word Processor. As an example, the following describes how to produce a Mail Merge file for Microsoft's Word for Windows Version 6.0:-

- 1 Restrict the Index List in Smart Address to the entries required for the Mail Merge.
- 2 Use the "File | Export" command and it's ALL Button to export the Complete Index List to a file called MAILDATA.TXT.
- 3 Start Word for Windows and select the "Tools | Mail Merge" command
- 4 Follow the screen prompts and select the Data Source as Open Data Source, and open the MAILDATA.TXT file which was exported in 2 above.
- 5 Create Mail Merge fields within your Main Document and then Merge the Data File using the Merge command.

Most Word Processors can use Mail Merge files as Word for Windows does. For more information, please consult the documentation for your Word Processor.



Invoking Smart Address from your Word Processor

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Invoking Smart Address from your Word Processor

By making use of the Macro facilities with your Word Processor, it is possible to add a command in your Word Processor that invokes Smart Address. This allows for you to then call Smart Address while editing a document, select the entry required and have Smart Address insert that entry into the document and then returning control back to the Word Processor.

As an example of this, Smart Address comes with a Word for Windows Macro that adds the facility to invoke Smart Address to the Tools Menu. In order to run this macro, open the SMARTMAC.DOC file, located in the same directory as you installed Smart Address, using Word for Windows and run the Macro InstallSmartAddress.

By default, Smart Address ignores fields that are empty when inserting a record to a Word Processor. By amending the SMARTADR.INI file, Smart Address can be instructed to insert empty fields as well.

You should always back-up SMARTADR.INI before editing it. Failure to do so can cause problems running Smart Address if the file should become damaged.

- 1 Using Microsoft Write or another such editor, open the SMARTADR.INI file that resides in the Windows directory.
- 2 Locate the section [General]
- 3 Insert the following line within this section:-

Keep Blanks=1

This instructs Smart Address to include empty fields during inserts to Word Processors. To ignore empty fields, with remove this line or change its value to 0

- 4 Exit Write, or the editor used, first saving the modified file.

Locking and Unlocking a Print Style Layout

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Locking and Unlocking a Print Style Layout

Smart Address by default, locks the Print Style Layouts of all the supplied Print Styles. This is due to the fact that these Styles are pre-defined and therefore the dimensions should not need to be changed.

If for some reason, you need to 'unlock' these styles or possibly 'lock' some of your own styles, then the following can be actioned:-

- 1 Using Microsoft Write or another such editor, open the SMARTADR.CFG file that resides in the same directory as SMARTADR.EXE (the Smart Address Program)

- 3 If locking the Style add the following line into this section:-
Locked=1

If unlocking the Style, remove the following line from this section:-
Locked=1

- 4 Exit Write, or the editor used, first saving the modified file.
- 5 Exit and Restart Smart Address.



Networking Address Books

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Networking Address Books

Smart Address supports the sharing of Address Books over a Network.

In order to share an Address Book, the Address Book should be located on the Network so all users have access to it. The Network File Permissions should then be set so that only one person has update access to that Book, with everyone else having Read-Only access. The person with update access, acts as the maintainer of the Address Book and is responsible for updates to that Book.

Currently Smart Address does not support multi-user update access to an Address Book.

Smart Address can also be installed to be run from a Network. To do this, install Smart Address to a location on the Network all users have access to and then set the Network File Permissions to Read-Only for the Smart Address directory.

Multiple Copy Licenses

It should be remembered that registration of a single copy of Smart Address allows you to use it on a single PC, and to make back-up copies for security purposes. It does not permit installation on more than 1 PC at the same time, or use on multiple workstations connected to a network.

Relocating the Smart Address Configuration File

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Relocating the Smart Address Configuration File

Smart Address holds all of its defined Printer Styles within a configuration file called SMARTADR.CFG. This file, by default, resides in the same location as the Smart Address program file SMARTADR.EXE.

If there is a requirement for this file to be located in another location, e.g. to allow individual users to reconfigure the print styles when running Smart Address over a Network, then an entry may be placed within the SMARTADR.INI file located in the Windows directory.

The following describes how to make this amendment:-

You should always back-up SMARTADR.INI before editing it. Failure to do so can cause problems running Smart Address if the file should become damaged.

- 1 Using Microsoft Write or another such editor, open the SMARTADR.INI file that resides in the Windows directory.
- 2 Locate the section [General]
- 3 Insert the following line within this section:-

CFG File=C:\WINDOWS\SMARTADR.CFG

In this example, Smart Address will look for the configuration file in the C:\WINDOWS directory. To locate the file in another location, simply change the drive and directory path as required.

- 4 Exit Write, or the editor used, first saving the modified file.
- 5 Exit Smart Address and using File Manager copy the configuration file from its current location to the location now specified within the INI file.
- 6 Restart Smart Address



Synchronizing Networked Address Books
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Synchronizing Networked Address Books

By default, Smart Address will automatically synchronize opened Networked Address Books every five minutes.

For example, if an entry is updated in a Networked Address Book by the address book administrator, that update will, within the next 5 minutes, be automatically reflected for any users who may have that book open.

Note: To disable this facility, specify a Refresh Interval of 0 (see below for details).

The interval used for synchronizing Networked Address Books may be amended by editing the users SMARTADR.INI file.

You should always back-up SMARTADR.INI before editing it. Failure to do so can cause problems running Smart Address if the file should become damaged.

- 1 Using Microsoft Notepad or another such editor, open the SMARTADR.INI file that resides in the Windows directory.
- 2 Insert the following lines :-

```
[Network]
Refresh Interval=10
```

In this example, Smart Address will automatically synchronize Networked Address Books every 10 minutes. To specify another interval just change the 10 to any value between 0 and 60.

- 3 Exit Notepad, or the editor used, first saving the modified file.
- 4 Exit and then restart Smart Address for the new interval to take effect.



SMARTADR.CFG Lost or Corrupt
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SMARTADR.CFG Lost or Corrupt

Certain functions within Smart Address required access to the Smart Address Configuration file, SMARTADR.CFG, which is located in the same directory as the Smart Address program file (SMARTADR.EXE).

If this file should become damaged or lost, then certain functionality of Smart Address will not be available. This situation will be notified by an appropriate message when trying to perform one of these functions.

To correct this, the configuration file should be recovered from your last good back-up and Smart Address restarted. If for some reason you did not have a back-up, then you should reinstall Smart Address from it's original disk.

Tagging Entries with the Mouse

Whilst Smart Address enables entries to be "Tagged" via use of the "Tools | Tag Entry" command and the Keyboard Shortcut of <Ctrl> and <T>, you can also "Tag" an entry by double-clicking it with the mouse.

Turning off Confirmation Prompts

Smart Address by default provides confirmation prompts for various actions, including deletions, acknowledgment reminders, unknown categories, etc.

Any of these confirmation prompts may be turned off by use of the "Options | Preferences" command.

Warning: If you have turned off a confirmation prompt, remember you will have no confirmation when performing that action. For example, no confirmation when deleting a range of entries.

Turning off Print Clipping
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Turning off Print Clipping

When Smart Address prints Labels or Listings the output printed is 'clipped' to fit the output area defined. This means for example, that if the output is too long to fit on a defined label, Smart Address will only print the part of the line that fits on the label. This stops the next label being over-printed with the data from the previous label.

If this facility is required to be turned off for some reason the following should be actioned:-

The "Fast Edit" facility of Smart Address allows Update Entry Mode to be entered simply by clicking the left mouse button in any field within the "Data Page" or tabbing into the "Data Page" by use of the <Tab> key.

Search Address Book

On issuing this command, either via the Tools Menu, Toolbar Button or the Keyboard Shortcut, Smart Address will display the Search Dialogue allowing the required search parameters to be entered.

User Access Allowed

This panel enables the level of access to the Address Book to be defined.

Delete

Checking this field, enables the Delete function to any user of the Address Book.

Unchecking the field, prevents users deleting entries from the Address Book.

Export

Checking this field, enables the Export function to any user of the Address Book.

Unchecking the field, prevents users performing Address Book exports.

Print

Checking this field, enables all the Print functions to any user of the Address Book.

Unchecking the field, prevents users producing any prints from the Address Book.

Update

Checking this field, enables all the Update functions to any user of the Address Book.

Unchecking the field, prevents users performing any entry update.

Address Book

This panel details the Address Book file the access privileges will be effective for.

OK Button

The OK Button applies the specified access privileges to the current Address Book, before terminating this dialogue.

Action

This panel informs the user what action will be taken against the reminder when it is Acknowledged.

Either the reminders date will be advanced by the period indicated by the reminder, or, if the reminder was a once only reminder, then the date will not be changed, but the reminder will be changed to "No Reminder".

Acknowledgment

This panel informs the user which reminder is being Acknowledged, the reminders current date and the date that will be set for that reminder when the acknowledgment is confirmed.

OK Button

The OK Button will acknowledge the set reminder and advance the date by the period indicated by the reminder, before terminating the dialogue.

If the reminder was a once only reminder, then the date will not be changed, but the reminder will be changed to "No Reminder".

Cancel Button

The Cancel Button will cancel any changes made within the dialogue and terminated the requested function.

Auto Identify Extension Numbers

This panel allows the user to specify an extension number length which Smart Address uses to automatically identify an internal telephone extension.

When Smart Address identifies a telephone number as being that of an internal extension, it will not append any defined prefix to the number.

For example, Smart Address has been told to prefix all dialed telephone numbers with a "9" to select an outside line. It has also been told that extensions have a length of 4. When the number "01270 759739" is dialed, Smart Address will actually dial "9 01270 759739". But when the number "2792" is dialed, Smart Address recognizes this as a extension (length is 4) and dials "2792" (note the absence of the "9" for an outside line).

Automatic Re-dial

This panel allows the Automatic Re-dial facility to be configured.

The Automatic re-dial facility allows a dialed telephone to be re-dialed if that number is found to be busy.

Delay between Re-dials (Seconds)

This field allows a delay to be specified for Smart Address to wait before retrying a busy telephone number.

Enable Automatic Re-dial

Checking this field instructs Smart Address to retry a dialed number if it finds that number to be busy. Smart Address will continue to dial the number until either it becomes free or is canceled by the user.

Dial Tone

This panel allows the type of dial tone used by the telephone system to be specified. Select the "Tone" setting if on a exchange that uses tone dialing, otherwise select the "Pulse" setting for exchanges that use pulse dialing.

Initialization

This field allows a Modem Initialization string to be defined. This string is sent to the modem prior to any automatic dialing by Smart Address

Note: If the AT command prefix for modem commands is not specified, then Smart Address will automatically add the AT prefix for you.

OK Button

The OK Button will configure Smart Address for your modem, before terminating this dialogue.

Port

This field should specify the communications port that is being used by your Modem. The port required should be selected from the 'drop-down' list.

Baud

This field should specify the baud rate (or speed) that you wish to use for your Modem. The baud rate required should be selected from the 'drop-down' list.

Modem Time-out Value (Seconds)

This field allows a modem time-out value to be defined. This value is used to terminate any modem function if a response is not received from the modem in this period of time.

Address Book will be Backed Up to

This panel details the back-up file that will be created when converting the Address Book being opened.

Note: If the "Do Not Create a Back-up Copy" field is checked, then no back-up will be taken.

Do Not Create a Back-up Copy

Selecting this field instructs Smart Address not to create a back-up copy of the Address Book prior to performing the conversion.

Warning: It is NOT recommended to convert any Address Book, without first having a back-up copy taken. This field should only be selected if you are sure that you already have a back-up copy of the Address Book. If in doubt, do not select this field.

Address Book

This panel details the Address Book that is being opened.

Cancel Button

The Cancel Button terminates the Address Book open command and therefore doesn't convert or open the specified Address Book.

Convert Button

The Convert Button should be used to instruct Smart Address to convert the Address Book to a Version 2.x format file before opening the book.

Read-Only Button

The Read-Only Button instructs Smart Address not to convert the Address Book being opened, but to open it with Read Only access.

Note: The Address Book cannot be updated until it is converted to the new file format.

Dialog Caption Bar

The Caption Bar (window title) indicates what conversion is about to take place and details the version of Smart Address that created the file being opened.

Select Fields for Insertion

This panel allows the fields that will be inserted to the Word Processor document, to be chosen by simply checking the appropriate field.

Additional fields may be accessed by using the Page Tabs.

Note: This field definition is unique between Address Books

OK Button

The OK Button will apply the Word Processor definition to Smart Address, before terminating.

Select Word Processor

This panel allows the Word Processor being used by the user, to be chosen from the 'drop-down' list.

In order to use the "Edit | Insert in Word Processor" command, the Word Processor application being used must be defined, otherwise the insertion will not work.

Complete Index List

Selecting this field will cause all entries in the Index List to be deleted.

OK Button

The OK Button will allow the Delete Entries Request to continue for the entries selected.

Delete Required

This panel allows the range of entries to be deleted, to be chosen.

Selected Entry

By selecting this field, only the currently selected entry will be deleted.

All Tagged Entries

Selecting this field will cause all entries that have been tagged and appear in the Index List to be deleted.

Note: If there are currently no tagged entries within the Address Book, this field will be disabled.

Dial Button

The Dial Button instructs Smart Address to dial the selected number, before terminating this dialogue.

Number Selection

This panel allows the required telephone number to be selected for dialing. Only fields that contain a telephone number will be enabled for selection.

Dialing Prefix

This panel allows a prefix to be specified that can be appended to the front of any telephone number dialed. For example, it might be required to select an outside line by first dialing the number '9' or to select another telephone service provider by appending a set code before the number dialed.

Note: The Dialing Prefix will only be appended to a number if the Use Prefix field is checked.

Complete Index List

Selecting this field will cause all entries in the Index List to be printed.

Copies

By its nature, envelope printing doesn't allow for a number of copies to be specified. Therefore the number of copies is set at "1".

The Copies Panel, is only enabled when printing Labels or Listings (see the "File | Print Label(s) or Listing(s)" command).

Selected Entry to the End of List

Selecting this field will cause all the entries, from the currently selected entry to the last entry in the Index List, to be printed.

OK Button

The OK Button will accept the values entered within this dialogue and produce the required print.

Printer

This field indicates the printer currently selected for printing. To change to another printer, use the "File | Printer Setup" command or the Setup Button on this dialogue.

Print Range

This panel allows the range of entries to be printed, to be chosen.

Selected Entry

By selecting this field, only the currently selected entry will be printed.

Sort Printout By

This Panel allows the user to specify the order that the print is to be produced in. Smart Address will sort the print according to the field chosen from the drop-down selection box. For example, if the user requires the resulting print to be printed in "Category" order, then the "Category" field should be chosen.

By checking the "Sort by Last Word" box, Smart Address will sort the printout according to the last word of the specified field. By default Smart Address uses the first word of each entry in determining the sort order.

Style

This field indicates the selected Style to be used. To change this Style, use the "File | Printer Setup" command or the Setup Button on the Dialogue.

All Tagged Entries

Selecting this field will cause all entries that have been tagged and appear in the Index List to be printed.

Note: If there are currently no tagged entries within the Address Book, this field will be disabled.

All Button

The All Button will automatically map all available data fields to the Export File Format list.

Complete Index List

Selecting this field will cause all entries in the Index List to be exported to a text file.

Selected Entry to the End of List

Selecting this field will cause all the entries, from the currently selected entry to the last entry in the Index List, to be exported to a text file.

OK Button

The OK Button will allow the Export Request to continue for the range selected.

Export Range

This panel allows the range of entries to be exported, to be chosen.

Selected Entry

By selecting this field, only the currently selected entry will be exported

All Tagged Entries

Selecting this field will cause all entries that have been tagged and appear in the Index List to be exported.

Note: If there are currently no tagged entries within the Address Book, this field will be disabled.

Export Button

The Export Button instructs Smart Address to export the specified data fields to a text file using the mappings defined by this dialogue. Once Smart Address has exported the data, this dialogue will terminate.

Select Fields for Export

This panel presents the available data fields that can be exported from Smart Address. The panel consists of four tab pages and additional fields may be displayed by "tabbing" to the required page.

To create the order that Smart Address writes the data fields to the export file, select the required field from the Export File Format list and then click the required data field button. This will then associate that data field with the export field when the export is performed. To remove a export field from the Export File Format list, simply select the export field and click the data field button again.

Export File Format

This panel lists the available export fields. Each field is identified by a Field Number and shows if a data field has been mapped to that export field or not.

In order to map a field, the relevant field should be selected from the list and the required data field button used to associate the two fields.

Reset Button

The Reset Button will remove any set mappings for the export file and return all Export File Format fields to <Not Mapped>

Save Field Names as Default

Checking this field will instruct Smart Address that when the OK Button is pressed, the field labels within this dialogue will become the default field labels. This will mean that all new Address Books created, will be created with these field labels already set.

Default Button

The Default Button will restore all the field labels to their defaults.

Field Labels

This panel allows the Labels for each field to be set, by simply typing the required label in the appropriate field.

Additional fields may be accessed by using the Page Tabs.

Note: These field labels are unique between Address Books

OK Button

The OK Button will set the fields labels within the current Address Book to the values set by this dialogue, before terminating.

Help Button

This button displays the Help File for the Dialogue.

All Button

The All Button will automatically map the text file to the Smart Address Data Fields.

Note: This Button will only map correctly, if the text file was created using the All button of the Smart Address Export command.

Import Fields

This panel lists the available fields for import to Smart Address. Each field is identified by a Field Number and shows an extract from the import file to help identify what fields are what.

In order to map a field, the relevant field should be selected from the list and the required mapping button used to associate the two fields.

Import Button

The Import Button instructs Smart Address to import the specified text file using the mappings defined by this dialogue. Once the text file has been imported Smart Address will terminate this dialogue.

Data Mapping Buttons

This panel presents the available data fields that the import files contents can be mapped to. The panel consists of four tab pages and additional fields may be displayed by "tabbing" to the required tab page.

To map an import field, select the required field from the Import Fields list and then click the required mapping button. This will then associate that import field with that data field when the import is performed. To remove a mapped field, simply click the mapping button again and this will return the import field back to the Import Fields list.

Import fields may be merged together by using both the mapping buttons associated with a data field. For example, if the import file has the name as two separate entries, one as first name and one as surname, these can be merged into one entry of "first_name surname".

Use First Line of Import File to Set Field Labels

When this field is checked, Smart Address will set the field labels for the Address Book receiving the import, to the values specified in the first line of the import file.

If this field is not checked then Smart Address will import the first line as an entry.

Index Category

This panel allows the Index Category for the Index Criteria to be chosen.

By default the Index Category will be <All Categories> resulting in all entries being eligible for display. The user may define a different category for restricting the entries displayed, by either entering a category or choosing one from the 'drop-down' list.

If the "Wild Match" field is selected then this means that any category beginning with the category chosen will be eligible for display. For example, a category of 'CONTACTS' and the Wild Match field selected, would make the entries with the following categories eligible for display :-

- Contacts
- Contacts - Personal
- Contacts - Business
- Contacts - Press

De-selecting the Wild Match field, would result in only the following category being eligible for display:-

- Contacts

Index Character

This panel allows the Index Character to be used by the Index Criteria to be specified. In order to chose a character, simply click on the character button required. To set the Index Character to all characters, the All Button should be used.

The Index Character is used to restrict the entries displayed within the Index List to certain entries only. For more information, see the Indexed On field on this dialogue.

Indexed On

This panel allows the Indexed On settings of the Index Criteria to be set. The Indexed On setting, determines how Smart Address uses the Index Character for restricting the entries displayed. Depending on this setting, Smart Address will either match the Index Character against the first letter of the first word, the first letter of the last word or the first letter of every word of the entry's index record. Only entries that provide a match for the Index Character and the Index Category will be displayed.

There are three values for the Indexed On setting - First Word, Last Word, All Words

This setting is also used to determine the order that entries are displayed within the Index List. If the setting is "Last Word", then the Index List will be sorted on the last word of each entry's Index Field. Otherwise, the Index List will be sorted on the first word of each entry's Index Field.

OK Button

The OK Button will set the Index Criteria for the current Address Book, based on the settings defined by this dialogue. The Index List will be rebuilt to display only entries matching this criteria before the dialogue is terminated.

Reset Button

The Reset Button will reset the Index Criteria to display all entries within the Address Book. The Index List will be rebuilt to display all entries before the dialogue is terminated.

Access Allowed

This field details the degree of access the user has to the Address Book. This may be either:-

UPDATE - Full Access is allowed

READ ONLY - Only the Read Functions are available

Additional access restrictions may also be in effect. See the Access Allowed field in the Supplier Panel.

Address Book Created

This field indicates the date and time that the Address Book was created. If the Address Book was converted from a pre-version 2.x Address Book, then this date will not be available and will therefore be displayed as "Not Available"

File Name

This field provides the fully qualified file that is the Address Book. This File Name is the name that Smart Address uses to store the Address Book on disk.

Address Book

This field contains the Name of the Address Book. This is the Name that is displayed within the Address Book's Window Title.

No.

This field indicates the total number of entries contained within the Address Book.

OK Button

This button terminates the displayed dialogue.

Supplier Panel

This panel relates to commercially supplied Address Books. If the Address Book currently open is not a commercial book, then this panel will be disabled.

Address Book Supplied By

If the Address Book has been purchased from another company, then this field will detail the name of the company that supplied the Address Book.

Access Allowed

Companies that retail Address Lists using Smart Address, can set the level of access that is allowed against any Address Book supplied by them. This access will be indicated by the associated boxes being checked for the level of access that is available.

Last Updated

This field indicates the date and time that the Address Book was last updated.

Copies

This Panel allows the user to specify the number of copies of each entry required.

If a Listing Print Style is selected, then the number of copies relate to each page of the listing, with multiple entries on each page.

If a Label Print Style is selected, then the number relates to each entry. For example, if you requested 3 copies, then 3 copies of the first entry would be printed followed by three copies of the next entry and so on.

Full Sheet of Labels for Each Entry

Select this field to instruct Smart Address to print a complete sheet of labels for each entry printed. For example, if the Label Style defined is for labels that are 8 deep by 2 wide, then Smart Address will print 16 copies of each entry.

Note: This field is only available when a Label Print Style is defined.

Number of Copies

Select this field to control the numbers of copies by a set number. Once selected, then the Number of Copies text field will become available. This field should be completed with the number of copies required.

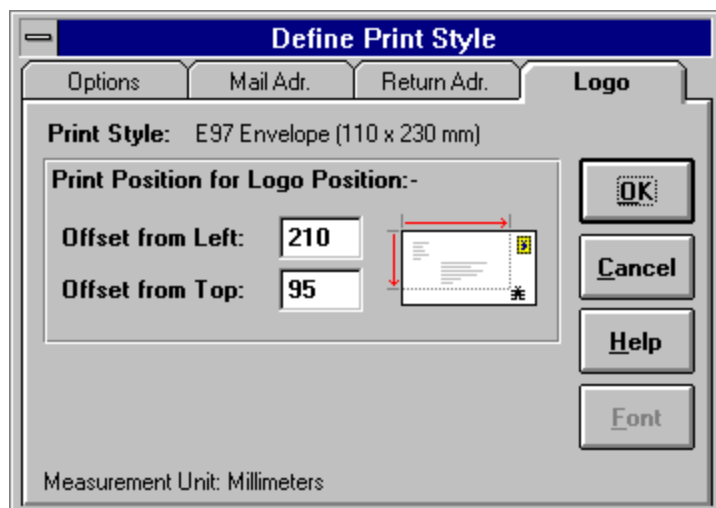

Note: This is not a scaled picture, i.e. it doesn't represent the true size/shape of the envelope, but is used to provide a visual reference to the orientation chosen.

Picture - Logo Tab

This picture represents the location of the Logo and indicates where the location measurements are taken from.

Note: This is not a scaled picture, i.e. it doesn't represent the true physical location of the Logo, but is used to provide a visual reference to where the location measurements are taken from.

Picture - Mail Address Tab

This picture represents the location of the Mail Address and indicates where the location measurements are taken from.

Note: This is not a scaled picture, i.e. it doesn't represent the true physical location of the Mail Address, but is used to provide a visual reference to where the location measurements are taken from.

Picture - Return Address Tab

This picture represents the location of the Return Address and indicates where the location measurements are taken from.

Note: This is not a scaled picture, i.e. it doesn't represent the true physical location of the Return Address, but is used to provide a visual reference to where the location measurements are taken from.

Font Button

The Font Button allows the font for the current object (Mail Address or Return Address) to be specified.

The font chosen is associated with the current Print Style, i.e. different Print Styles can have different fonts defined for these objects.

Height

This field allows the Height of the Envelope being used to be specified.

Measurement Unit

This field indicates the current unit used for measurement.

This measurement unit may be changed by via the International Option of the Windows Control Panel.

OK Button

Envelope Orientation

Note: This print position is specified from top edge of the stationary being used..

Width

This field allows the Width of the Envelope being used to be specified.

Note: If this field is disabled, then the Envelope Style currently selected is one of the supplied envelope definitions, therefore changes to it's Width is not allowed.

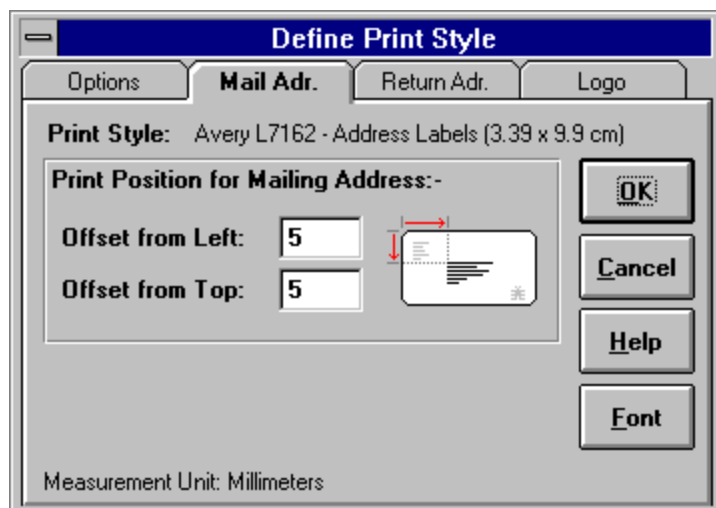

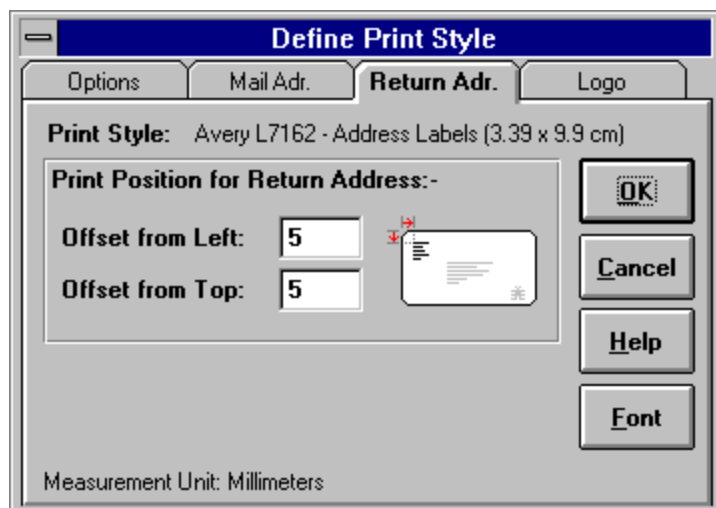

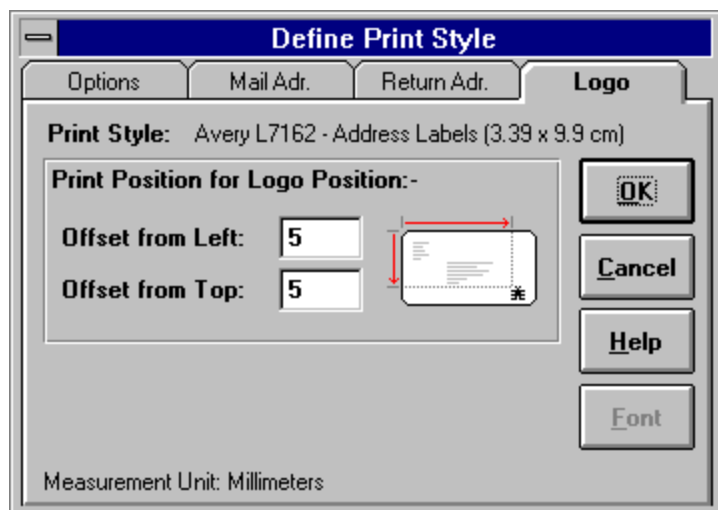

This field is used to specify the number of labels across per sheet.

Note: If this field is disabled, then the Label Style currently selected is one of the supplied label definitions, therefore changes to this value is not allowed.

Label Definition

The panel allows the size definition for the selected label to be defined. Without the correct dimensions, Smart Address will not be able to correctly position the output on any Labels printed.

Note: If these fields are disabled, then the Label Style currently selected is one of the supplied label definitions, therefore changes to these values are not allowed.

No. Down

This field is used to specify the number of labels down per sheet.

Note: If this field is disabled, then the Label Style currently selected is one of the supplied label definitions, therefore changes to this value is not allowed.

Label Height

This field is used to specify the physical height of a single label.

Note: If this field is disabled, then the Label Style currently selected is one of the supplied label definitions, therefore changes to this value is not allowed.

Horz. Gap

This field is used to specify the horizontal gap between labels on the sheet. This is the measurement of the gap between labels 'across' the sheet.

Note: If this field is disabled, then the Label Style currently selected is one of the supplied label definitions, therefore changes to this value is not allowed.

Left Margin

This field is used to specify the left margin of the label sheet. This is the measurement of the gap between the left edge of the page and the left edge of the first label.

Note: If this field is disabled, then the Label Style currently selected is one of the supplied label definitions, therefore changes to this value is not allowed.

Top Margin

This field is used to specify the top margin of the label sheet. This is the measurement of the gap between the top of the page and the top of the first label.

Note: If this field is disabled, then the Label Style currently selected is one of the supplied label definitions, therefore changes to this value is not allowed.

Vertical Gap

This field is used to specify the vertical gap between labels on the sheet. This is the measurement of the gap between labels 'down' the sheet.

Note: If this field is disabled, then the Label Style currently selected is one of the supplied label definitions, therefore changes to this value is not allowed.

Label Width

This field is used to specify the physical width of a single label.

Note: If this field is disabled, then the Label Style currently selected is one of the supplied label definitions, therefore changes to this value is not allowed.

Default Category

This panel allows a default category to be defined which will be used as the initial category for all new entries and for any imported entry that does not have a category.

Note: This setting is unique to each Address Book

Save as Default for New Address Books

Checking this field will instruct Smart Address that when the OK Button is pressed, the settings defined within this tab page will become default. This will mean that all new Address Books created, will be created with these settings already defined.

Default Index Field

This panel allows the Default Index Field for an Address Book to be defined. By default, new entries are created with the Index Field set to <Default Index>. Smart Address will then use the field that is defined as the Default Index Field, to extract the Index data that is to be used.

Changing this value, will cause all entries that are set to <Default Index> to be re-indexed automatically to the new Default Index Field.

Note: This setting is unique to each Address Book

Reminder Options

This panel allows the Smart Address settings related to the date reminders facility, to be configured to the users requirements.

Note: These settings are unique to each address book.

Indicate Active on Index List

Selecting this field instructs Smart Address to place an "Active Reminder" marker to the left of the Index entry within the Index List. This allows a visual representation to be given, showing entries in the Index List that have "Active Reminders" present.

Note: This setting is unique to each Address Book

Advance Warning at x Days

This field allows the number of days for an advance warning of a date reminder to be set.

Smart Address indicates dates that will be becoming due, by turning on a yellow notification marker for the entry. The Advance Warning field, controls how far ahead Smart Address checks for due dates.

Note: This setting is unique to each Address Book

General

This panel allows the general Smart Address settings to be configured to the users requirements.

Keep Active Tab between Entries

Checking this field, instructs Smart Address not to change Tabs (Data Pages) between different entries.

For example, if the user is currently viewing the Reminders Tab and then selects another entry for display, if this field is not checked the current Tab will be changed to the Address Tab. With this field checked, the Reminders Tab would remain displayed.

Enable Fast Edit of Entries

Checking this field will enable the Fast Edit facility of Smart Address. This facility enables the Update Entry Mode when a data field is clicked with the mouse or is tabbed into using the TAB Key.

Without this facility enabled, the Toolbar or Menu Command must be used to update an entry.

Note: The Fast Edit facility will automatically enable the New Entry Mode if the Index List is empty when a data field is clicked or tabbed into.

Use Vertical Tabs

Checking this field instructs Smart Address to use vertical tab markers instead of horizontal markers.

Enable Toolbar Tooltips

Selecting this field enables the displaying of "tooltips" when the mouse pauses over a toolbar button. A "tooltip" is a short description, displayed just below the toolbar button, describing the function of the button.

Import / Export Options

This panel allows the Smart Address settings related to importing and exporting Address Books, to be configured to the users requirements.

Export Address as Single Record

Checking this field instructs Smart Address to export an entry's Address as a single record.

By default, Smart Address will export the five Address Lines of an entry as five separate records, separated by the specified Separation Character. If the user requires the Address exported as a single record, then this field should be checked. Smart Address will then export the address as one record, with each Address Line being separated by a Carriage Return and Line Feed.

Field Separation Character

This field allows the specification of the character to be used to separate data fields when exporting or importing Address Books. For example, if this character is ",", then an export would output an entry as :-

"Title","Name","Position", and so on

OK Button

The OK Button will apply any changed settings to Smart Address, before terminating this dialogue.

Confirmations

This panel allows the Smart Address settings related to confirming user actions, to be configured to the users requirements.

Confirm Acknowledgments

Checking this field instructs Smart Address to request confirmation by the user, before any Date Reminders are acknowledged.

Confirm Category Additions

Checking this field instructs Smart Address to request confirmation by the user, before an unknown Category is applied to a entry.

Confirm Address Book Deletions

Checking this field instructs Smart Address to request confirmation by the user, before any entries are deleted from any Address Books.

Save Options

This panel allows the Smart Address settings related to saving Address Books, to be configured to the users requirements.

Enable Auto-Save

Checking this field, instructs Smart Address to save the current Address Book to disk after it has been updated. This ensures that if a problem was to occur with the PC (e.g. a power-cut, accidentally being powered-off, etc.) any previous updates would not be lost.

If this field is not checked, then updates will only be saved when closing the Address Book or via use of the "File | Save" Command.

Back-up Address Books on Closing

Checking this field, instructs Smart Address to create a back-up copy of an Address Book when it is closed. This back-up can then be used to recreate the Address Book if the original file should be damaged or lost for some reason.

The file name given to a back-up copy will be the same as the Address Book, except that it will have an extension name of ".BAK". For example:-

C:\SMARTADR\EXAMPLE.ADR would be backed up as C:\SMARTADR\EXAMPLE.BAK

Updates before Auto-Save

This field allows the number of updates necessary before an automatic save of the Address Book is performed, to be specified.

By default, Smart Address will perform an automatic save after every update. By changing this field, automatic saves can be configured to be performed at a greater interval.

Note: This field will only be enabled, if the Enable Auto-Save field is checked.

This dialogue allows a user to define which field entries are printed for a specified Print Style. This definition is associated with the actual Print Style, i.e. each Print Style has its own definition of which fields are printed. For more information, click on the required element:-

Select the Fields to be Printed

The fields that will be printed, when printing using the current Print Style, may be selected by checking the fields required. Additional fields may be accessed by using the Page Tabs.

OK Button

The OK Button creates the required Print Field Definition, associates it with the current Print Style and ends this dialogue.

Print Blank Fields

By default, Smart Address doesn't print data fields that are empty. By checking this field, Smart Address will print the data field regardless if it contains data or not.

Print the Field Labels on the Output

Checking this field, instructs Smart Address to print the field's label along with its data.

For example, a field labeled "Company Name" with a value of "Oakley Data Services" would print out as -

Company Name Oakley Data Services

Print Style

This field indicates the selected Print Style that this Print Field definition is to be associated with.

Logo File Button

This button will only be enabled if the "Print Logo" field is checked. Selecting this button enables the Windows Bitmap file to be chosen. Once a file has been chosen, the file name will be placed in the "Logo File" field to the left of this button.

Logo File Name

This field will be enabled only when the "Print Logo" field is checked. When enabled, a file name should be entered to specify the Windows Bitmap file to be used.

OK Button

The OK Button will accept the values entered within this dialogue and define the required Print Styles.

Printer

This field indicates the currently selected printer for the current Print Style.

This printer may be changed by using the Printer Button on this dialogue.

Return Address

A Return Address may be printed on all Envelopes or Labels if required. If this option is enabled within the relevant Print Style, the Address entered within these fields will be used.

Note: The Return Address doesn't have to be an Address. It could, for example, be a message to appear on the envelopes printed.

Printer Button

The Printer Button allows the Printer to be used for the selected Print Style to be chosen, or set-up, from the list of printers installed to Windows.

Print Style

This 'drop-down' list box indicates the current style of stationary defined. This style may be changed by selecting the 'drop-down' arrow and choosing another style from the list displayed.

Print logo

Checking this field, instructs Smart Address to print a "logo" on the output. The Logo to be printed is a Windows Bitmap file, whose location is specified in the text field below the Print Logo field.

Note: This option is not available when defining Listing Styles.

Print Return Address

Checking this field, instructs Smart Address to print a "Return Address" on the output.

Note: This option is not available when defining Listing Styles.

Date Rule

This field allows a Date Rule to be defined for the search. A Date Rule allows entries that have date entries falling within the specified rule to be located. If no date searching is required, a Date Rule of <None> should be selected.

Note: For a search to take place, either the Text to Find field must be completed or a Date Rule defined.

End Date

This field allows the end date of a defined Date Rule to be specified. The format of the date displayed/entered is dependent on the International Setting within the Windows Control Panel.

Note: This field will only be enabled if an appropriate Date Rule has been selected.

Fields

This panel allows the scope of the search request to be specified. If All Fields is selected then the search will attempt to match against all the data fields within an entry. If Selected Fields is selected, then Smart Address will only attempt to match against the fields specified by the user.

All Fields

Selecting this field will instruct Smart Address to attempt to match the search request against all the data fields within an entry.

Selected

Selecting this field performs two functions. Firstly the dialogue will be extended automatically allowing individual fields to be selected for the scope of the search.

Secondly, it instructs Smart Address to only attempt to match the search request, against the individual fields selected by the user.

Method

This panel allows the Search method to be used, to be specified. This method controls how Smart Address attempts to match the text entered in the Text to Find entry field against the text in Address Book entries.

Specific

Selecting this field instructs Smart Address to perform a 'Specific' search when processing a search request.

When running a 'Specific' search, Smart Address will only match an entry that completely matches the search text. For example, if the Text to Find was entered as "Peter", the search would find :-

Peter

but not :-

Peterson
Mark Peters
Peter Smith
etc.

Wild

Selecting this field instructs Smart Address to perform a 'Wild' search when processing a search request.

When running a 'Wild' search, Smart Address will match any entry that contains the search text. For example, if the Text to Find was entered as "Peter", the search could find :-

Peter
Peterson
Mark Peters
Peter Smith
etc.

OK Button

The OK Button will perform the requested search and display any matching entries within the Index List. If no matching entries could be found the Index List will remain unchanged and a message issued.

Origin

This panel allows the Search Origin to be specified. The Search may be performed against the complete Address Book or on the subset currently displayed within the Index List. The subset option, allows selective searches to be performed by searching on search results, etc.

Book

Selecting this field instructs Smart Address to search the complete Address Book, ignoring the selection currently displayed within the Index List.

Index List

Selecting this field instructs Smart Address to only search the subset currently displayed within the Index List. This enables selective searches to be performed by searching on a previous search result, etc.

Start Date

This field allows the start date of a defined Date Rule to be specified. The format of the date displayed/entered is dependent on the International Setting within the Windows Control Panel.

Note: This field will only be enabled if an appropriate Date Rule has been selected.

Text to Find

This field allows the text to be searched for, to be specified.

Note: For a search to take place, either the Text to Find field must be completed or a Date Rule defined.

Save Field Selection as Default

Checking this field will instruct Smart Address that when the OK Button is pressed, the field selection within this dialogue will become the default field selection. This will mean that all new Address Books created, will be created with only these fields showing.

Default Button

The Default Button will mark the fields to be shown based on the current default.

Select Fields to be Displayed

This panel allows the fields shown to be chosen by checking the field required. Checked fields will be displayed in the Address Book, whilst unchecked fields will not be displayed.

Additional fields may be accessed by using the Page Tabs.

Note: The fields chosen for displaying are unique between Address Books

OK Button

The OK Button will configure the fields displayed within the current Address Book to the choice specified by this dialogue, before terminating.

Address Tab

Clicking on this Tab, pages the dialogue so that the fields associated with the Address Page are displayed.

Notes Tab

Clicking on this Tab, pages the dialogue so that the fields associated with the Notes Page are displayed.

Others Tab

Clicking on this Tab, pages the dialogue so that the fields associated with the Others Page are displayed.

Reminders Tab

Clicking on this Tab, pages the dialogue so that the fields associated with the Reminders Page are displayed.

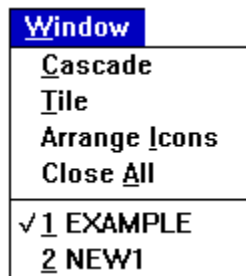

Address Book Caption Bar

The Address Book Caption Bar contains the name of the Address Book belonging to that Window.

There will be instances where additional information is displayed on the Caption Bar with the Address Book Name. For example, an Address Book called EXAMPLE, may at times appear as:-

EXAMPLE*

Address Book Needs Saving

If the Auto-Save function (see the "Options | Preferences" command) has been disabled and the Address Book has been updated but not saved, then an * will be appended to the Name on the Caption Bar. When the Address Book has been saved, this * will be removed from the Name.

EXAMPLE [Read Only]

Address Book is Read Only

If the user does not have update access to the Address Book, either due to Network Access Permissions or the Book concerned has been marked as Read Only using Windows File Manager, then [Read Only] will be appended to the Name on the Caption Bar.



Categories Displayed
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Categories Displayed

This field on the Status Bar, indicates the current setting for the Index Category.

By default the Index Category will be <All Categories> resulting in all entries being eligible for display. The user may define a different category for restricting the entries displayed, by setting the appropriate value using the Display Index.

If the category displayed on the Status Bar is prefixed with '**', then that means that the category restriction is applied to categories beginning with that category. For example, a category being displayed as 'CONTACTS *' would make the entries with the following categories eligible for display :-

Contacts - Personal
Contacts - Business
Contacts - Press

During a Search, this field will indicate the type of Search that is in effect against the Address Book, as a Search will override the Index Category and is therefore not relevant to the subset of entries displayed.

The Data Page

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The Data Page

This area of an Address Book is used to present each entry's data. It is also used for updating and adding data for entries.

It is presented as four pages, or 'tabs', each containing a subset of the data connected to the entry. Each page may be accessed by clicking the mouse on the 'tab' required or by using the View Menu.

Indexed On

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Indexed On

This field on the Status Bar, indicates the current setting for the Indexed On value. This value determines how Smart Address uses the Index Character for restricting the entries displayed.

There are three values for this setting - First Word, Last Word, All Words

This setting is also used to determine the order that entries are displayed within the Index List. If the setting is "Last Word", then the Index List will be sorted on the last word of each entry's Index Field. Otherwise, the Index List will be sorted on the first word of each entry's Index Field.

The Index List

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Index List

The Index List displays a list of each entry's Index Field, that matches the current Index Criteria, in the order specified by the current Index Order.

The currently selected entry will be highlighted within the Index List and the details for that entry displayed within the Address Book's "Data Page".

To select another entry, simply use the mouse or keyboard to move the highlight to a different field.

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Navigating the Index List

In order to move through the Index List, the following keys may be used:-

- <Left Arrow> or <Up Arrow>
These keys move up the Index List one entry at a time.
- <Right Arrow> or <Down Arrow>
These keys move down the Index List one entry at a time.
- <Page Up> or <Page Down>
These keys will either move up or down the Index List one page at a time.
- <Home> or <End>
These keys will either move to the top or bottom of the Index List

The mouse also may be used by clicking any entry to select it, or in conjunction with the Index Lists Scroll Bar.



Quickly Locating an Entry within the Index List

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Quickly Locating an Entry within the Index List

An entry may be located quickly by simply typing in the name your required. For instance, if you wish to locate the entry for 'Windowshare', then as you type in 'Windowshare' the Index List will automatically position itself as you type in.

For example, when the 'W' is entered, the Index List will select the first entry beginning with 'W', when the 'i' is located then the first entry beginning with 'Wi' will be located and so on.

This will continue until either no matches can be made, indicated by a beep, a pause occurs during typing or one of the Index List navigation keys are used.



Number of Entries Displayed

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Number of Entries Displayed

This field on the [Status Bar](#), indicates what subset of entries are currently displayed. If all entries are displayed, the default state, then both numbers will match - for example 203 of 203.

If only a subset of entries have been displayed, either by use of "Tools | Set Display Index", "Tools | Show xx..." or an Address Book search, then the field will show the number of entries within the subset. For example, 100 of 203 informs us that 100 entries out of a possible 203 have been included in the Index List.

The Status Area

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The Status Area

This field of the Status Bar, is used for general information during the day-to-day running of Smart Address. The most common use for this area is to notify what the current search is, that is in effect against the Address Book.

Another use is to notify what Show command is currently applied to the Index List.

Address Field

These are five freeform text fields for use, by default, to specify an Address for the person or company concerned.

Smart Address allows the use and label of this field to be customized by the user.

Drop Down Calendar Button

These buttons will invoke a drop down calendar from which a date may be selected. Once a date is selected, that date will be placed in the associated date field to the left of the button pressed.

Category Field

This is a 'drop-down' list box for use, by default, to specify a category that the current entry belongs to. A new category may be entered into this field or an existing category chosen from the 'drop-down' list box.

Smart Address requires this field to be completed for any entry.

Smart Address allows the label of this field to be customized by the user.

Company Field

This is a freeform text field for use, by default, to specify a Company Name.

Smart Address requires either this field or the Name field to be completed for any entry.

Smart Address allows the use and label of this field to be customized by the user.

Date Fields

These are three Date fields that may be used to specify reminders for certain events to be set for the currently selected entry. Smart Address can then 'remind' you when these dates become due. For an example, you can set-up a reminder for a persons Birthday, a reminder for to re-contact a Client, etc.

The format of the date displayed/entered is dependent on the International Setting within the Windows Control Panel.

It should be noted that past dates may be used in order that fields can serve as a reminder of an event that has happened, as opposed to an event this is to happen. For example, a Date field may be used to hold the date that a Customer first became a customer.

Date Field Labels

Each of the three Date fields have a customizable label defined to them. This label should be used to describe the type of Reminder being set. For example, Birthday, Call Customer On, First Contacted, etc.

It should be noted that past dates may be used in order that fields can serve as a reminder of an event that has happened, as opposed to an event this is to happen. For example, a Date field may be used to hold the date that a Customer first became a customer.

Telephone Dial Buttons

These buttons allow Smart Address to dial the associated telephone number, using Smart Address's Auto-Dial facility. If no associated telephone number is present, then the button will be disabled.

Smart Address allows the showing of these buttons to be turned off by the user.

Indexed On Field

This is used to define the field that is to be the Index for the currently selected entry. By default, the Index field will be <Default Index>, meaning that the entry will be indexed on the field the user has chosen as the default Index for this Address Book. This is set via "Options | Preferences".

If you wish to force an entry to always index on a certain field, regardless of what field is set as the default index, then choose the field from the 'drop-down' list box.

The field an entry is 'Indexed On', is the field that is displayed for that entry in the Index List.

Smart Address allows the label of this field to be customized by the user.

Reminders Legend

This field provides a legend to the various Notification Markers that may be displayed for an entry.

The number of days of advancing warning, i.e. to trigger the Yellow notification, is customizable by the user (see "Options | Preferences").

The displaying of this field may be turned off by the user in the Show Fields function (see "Options | Show Fields").

Name Field

This is a freeform text field for use, by default, to specify a persons Name.

Smart Address requires either this field or the Company field to be completed for any entry.

Smart Address allows the use and label of this field to be customized by the user.

Notes Field

This is a freeform text field for use, by default, to enter notes on the person or company concerned.

Smart Address allows the use and label of this field to be customized by the user.

Reminder Notification Marker

Smart Address will indicate when an entry has a date due by checking the Reminder Frequency and it's associated date. If that date falls within the notification period set, then a Notification Marker will be placed against the date concerned.

Smart Address can, if required, also place a Notification Marker against the entry within the Index List.

Telephone Numbers

These are four freeform text fields for use, by default, to specify up to four telephone numbers for the person or company concerned.

It should be noted that these fields can also be used to store non-telephone numbers, for example Electronic Mail addresses, product codes, etc.

Smart Address allows the use and label of these fields to be customized by the user.

Position Field

This is a freeform text field for use, by default, to specify the persons position within a Company. For example, Vice President, Managing Director, etc.

Smart Address allows the use and label of this field to be customized by the user.

Reminder Frequency

This field is a drop-down list box, that allows a reminder frequency to be associated with a date. Selecting the drop-down arrow, will display a list box containing a selection of reminder frequencies that may be set.

Once a Reminder is acknowledged (see "Tools | Acknowledge Reminder"), Smart Address will advance the associated date by the Reminder Frequency specified. For example, if the frequency is set as a four weekly reminder, then the associated date will be advanced by four weeks.

Title Field

This is a freeform text field for use, by default, to specify a persons 'Title'. For example, Mr, Mrs, Doctor, etc.

Smart Address allows the use and label of this field to be customized by the user.

Spare Fields

The 'Others' tab contains six freeform text fields that are by default labeled "User Definable 1 - 6". These fields do not have any defined use and may be used to hold additional information about the entry.

For example, one of the fields may be used as a Christmas card checklist. To do this, label the field as "Send Christmas Card" and enter the word "Yes" for any entries that require a card sending. When it's time to send your Christmas cards, you can perform a search against just the "Send Christmas Card" field for any entries that contain "Yes" in this field.

Smart Address allows the use and labels of these fields to be customized by the user.

"Active Reminder"

An Active Reminder is where a date within an entry has a reminder set and that reminder has now become due.

"Data Page"

The Data Page is the insert area to the right of the Index List that contains the entry's data within four tabbed pages.

"Index Criteria"

The Index Criteria is the criteria used to restrict the entries displayed within the Index List. The criteria in effect is shown within the Status Bar at the bottom of the Smart Address application. The Index Criteria may be set by use of the Index, Search or Show.. commands found under the "Tools" menu.

"Index List"

The Index List is the area on the left hand side of an Address Book, that lists the entries matching the current Index Criteria. An entry's data, may be displayed by selecting it's Index from this list.

"Tag"

If an Entry has been "Tagged", then the entry's Tag state will be set.

"Tagged"

An Entry's "tagged" state can be toggled by use of the "Tools | Tag Entry" command. Tagged entries are indicated in Red within the Index List.

All Words

This means that the Index Character is matched against the first character of every word of each entry's Index Field. If and of these are the same, then that entry is added to the Index List

First Word

This means that the Index Character is matched against the first character of the first word of each entry's Index Field. If these are the same then that entry is added to the Index List.

Index Category

The Index Category is used for restricting entries within the Index List. This is set via the "Set Display Index" command of the Tools Menu.

Index Character

The Character used for restricting entries within the Index List. This is set via the "Set Display Index" command of the Tools Menu.

Index Criteria

The Index Criteria is the criteria used to restrict the entries displayed within the Index List. The criteria in effect is shown within the Status Bar at the bottom of the Smart Address application. The Index Criteria may be set by use of the Index, Search or Show.. commands found under the "Tools" menu.

Index Field

The Index Field is the field whose content is used to Index that entry on. By default this is the Name field, but this may be changed by using either the 'Default Index' facility within the Preferences Menu, or by selecting a different Index Field via the Entry's "Others" Tab.

Index Order

The Index Order is the order that entries are displayed within the Index List. This order is dependent on the current "Indexed On" value set by the Set Display Index Command of the Tools menu. If the value is set to "Last Word", then the Index List will be sorted on the last word of each entry's Index Field. Otherwise, the Index List will be sorted on the first word of each entry's Index Field.

Last Word

This means that the Index Character is matched against the first character of the last word of each entry's Index Field. If these are the same then that entry is added to the Index List

New Entry Mode

New Entry Mode is when Smart Address has been asked to create a new entry. In this mode, the Index List is disabled and all fields within the "Data Page" are cleared allowing the new data to be entered.

Status Bar

The Status Bar is the area at the bottom of the main Smart Address Application Window and is used to provide various feedback to the user regarding the current state of Smart Address.

Update Entry Mode

In this mode, the Index List is disabled and the fields within the "Data Page" are enabled to allow updating of the Entry's data.
