A500+ (But I have no RF Modulator)

Cambridge Z88 Laptop (Soon to have a Connection to the Amiga A1200)

I have been collecting Public Domain for a few years now, and although my collection is not very large, (350 ish disks), I have quite a lot of other disks from mags etc, and friends. I also run the latest version of Virus Checker and Virus Z 2 on startup to combat virus infection.

I have been interested in computing from a very early age. My very first computer was a ZX81 (remember them!) with a full 16K upgrade! Wow! I had two of them before I upgraded to a ZX Spectrum (the first one with the dead man finger keys!). From there I bought a 48K ZX Spectrum (The black one with the fold down feet), and from that a ZX Spectrum +2, which at the time was the cutting edge of technology. A whole 128 KB of power. I also had a Radio Shack TRS-80, which I only used for playing chess and Card Games - it was that primitive. I then decided it was time for a change, and bought an A600 with my brother. Wow! Programs that loaded in less than three days, and they had decent sound and graphics. I was converted. I had a shot of friend's Atari ST, but it was not the same - The Amiga was the one for me!

Soom after this my brother and I, who owned half of the Amiga, decided to upgrade up to an A1200. We did and since then have expanded the system. We bought the printer first because we were currently using an Epson 9 pin Black & White and the quality was quite literally, crap! We have since bought the Hard Drive (Notice to all non-Hard Drive owners:- GET ONE NOW. YOU WILL NOT BELIEVE THE DIFFERENCE!), and we are currently saving up for a CD-ROM, a Sound Sampler and an Colour Inkjet Printer.

I also own a Cambridge Z88 Laptop computer, which is handy to type out your letters when you are out and about, or away from home. I am just about to buy a cable that connects the Z88 to your Amiga. It's something I've wanted for a long time. Eventually, I got it. All good things come to those who wait. I also have a Phillips CDi with the Digital Video Cartridge, lots of films and games etc. It is a brilliant machine to play with. Does anybody else have one, and would like to swap tips etc about games, and maybe even some discs?

I am now also a Co-Editor for Doubleclick!, the Amiga disk magazine produced regularly by Pentrisoft. It is freely available from PD Libraries, as well as Pentrisoft, Amicom PD, Mark Harman (The Pentrisoft President), as well as myself. A worthy read which has loads of articles to suit just about any taste.

I work in the mornings delivering newspapers with my brother. After that I work as a mechanic in my father's garage, fixing cars. From time to time I am a DJ, who runs his own mobile disco (which was paid for out of the paper round - think of the price of CD's and equipment etc).

My main interests are Cars, for obvious reasons, Computing and Motorcycling and I own an L Reg Kawasaki AR125 in Team Green Racing colours. 1.13 Why I Did This Guide

Why I Did This Guide

I found that after writing off to a few PD Libraries, they all stocked roughly the same thing. I thought that if I wrote to the magazines and advertised my disk in the PenPals and small Ads section, people would write to me, having had the same dealings with PD Libraries. I want to make it clear that I am NOT a PD Library, just someone who does not want to lose the Amiga. I am not charging money for this, I am treating this the same way as you would writing to a penpal. If you had a penpal and he sent you a tape or CD etc, you would not expect to pay for it. This is not to say that money received will not be appreciated. If you feel I should get money for what I am doing then don't let me stop you. I also did this guide for the challenge, the sheer hell of it, and really because nobody has even tried something like this before!

This version is better in some ways than previous ones as all the text is in one Amigaguide document, whereas in previous versions, the textfiles were stored in a separate directory called Text.

This had some advantages and disadvantages. Editing the previous version was harder, as there was lots of different text files to change, but now the whole file is loaded into Ram, whereas the text viewer I was using only loaded in the file when needed. You win some, you lose some!

Army Miner - A brilliant MineSweeper clone. You have a grid of squares and you click on the grid, working out where the mines are.

Big Time Sensuality - AGA demo with a Bjork soundtrack. The graphics,

as is the sound, are brilliant. Please note that it is AGA only and has 2 disks.

Card Games Deluxe - Do you not have enough memory to run Klondike (Like me!)? Do you want to be able to play Videopoker as well? Do you want to use the Klondike cards as cardbacks? YES! Well, get this. I advise that you install it to your Hard Drive, as it speeds things up. You can also play MED modules in the background. Octamed 5 can save modules in MED format, so any song will do. (3 disks).

Deluxe Galaga - This has got to be the best Space Invaders game around. Written by Edgar Vidal (the same man who wrote Deluxe Pacman), the graphics are excellent and the game is so addictive. I have played it to death, but I still have not send away the shareware fee (ooeerr!!). I have both the ECS and AGA versions of the game.

Deluxe Pacman - Same Guy, same great game. Brilliant conversion of Pacman, with loads of levels, and ghosts, and power ups etc.

Dialling Codes - Stuck for an STD Code. Do you know the town but not the code. This will help you. Type in any town (or code) in Britain, and this program will give you the answer. Sorry Alan, but I don't think that this program covers Eire. Belfast is in it, but Dublin is not.

Doubleclick Disk Magazines - As a contributor to these magazines, I feel that this is a bit biased, but they really are brill. Loads of stuff in them, and they are on a par with the legendary Grapevine series. I will of course have the latest version of the magazine.

Fast Intro Maker - Make jazzy intros and bootblock intros with this great program. I have sent away for the full version to Deutchland, but I have not had a reply back yet.

GuiArc - Expand and dearchive all those programs on your magazine disks. Brilliant program. I have used it for ages. Worth it's weight in gold, about 57p as a disk does not weigh all that much!

Grapevine Mags - These are BRILLIANT!!!!!! I have every issue from 15 onwards and I have a few early ones as well. Very funny and very well put together. I wish they would come back.

Jesus On E's - Excellent Rave Demo. All the others try to copy this one! Takes seconds to load, but about 30 minutes to play. The bad thing is that it is not HD installable and you must have and external drive to use it. Get one if you don't have one as you do not know what you are missing. (2 Disks).

Kefrens Desert Dream - Dazzling Demo from Kefrens. Set in Cairo,

Egypt in 1993, it has a story at the start and lots and lots of great effects by the end. 2 disks to this one, but you can put the second disk in df0: when asked, but it spoils the demo if you have to be asked.

Kick 1.3 - A MUST GET!! You need to get this to be able to turn WB2.04 and upwards machines into a WB1.3 machine. Excellent program.

Motorola Invaders - AGA Space Invaders with a Metallica soundtrack!

Very good graphics and sound. (2 Disks).

Numtris - Tetris with numbers. I registered for this game, as it is so good. Unfortunately, I would be breaking the law if I gave you the full version, so I won't! You have blocks with numbers on them which fall into the pit. Add up the columns in the pit to the number printed on the bottom, without going over that number, and the column disappears. On the left of the screen is the tiles left counter. When it reaches zero, you have completed the level. It starts at 200. On the demo version, the game ends when the counter reaches 100, but it still is a hard game, especially on the later levels.

OJ Simpson (The Trial) - Lots of info about OJ. Text, pictures, sound samples - you name it. Very well put together.

Please Release Me - My favourite animation at the moment. For all you country music lovers, the song sung by a ballon. Very funny.

Quick LHA - I use this program every day, for packing and unpacking LHA archives, easily, and most importantly, quickly. Also handles LZX etc.

Remdate - This is a serious bit of kit. It is a Diary and Planner for your Amiga. I would recommend that you have a battery backed clock, a hard drive, and maybe some extra memory. A lot to ask, but it is worth it. You can input Birthdays, Special Days, Holidays, use like a simple diary to say what you did. It also has a things to do list, can print calendars, pick lottery your lottery numbers, absolutely anything! This is why I had to register for this program. It is well worth the slightly more than usual registration fee of ten pounds, but in my view, it is money well spent.

Serious Backgammon - Another game I will be registering. Time Limit version (5 Minutes) of the popular board game. Graphics etc. are brilliant.

Tetris Pro - I am a Tetris Pro Pro! This game is excellent!! As you finish the lines, a picture is revealed. Show all the picture and the level is complete. Some of the pictures are worth playing for!

The Flintstones - Over 18's Demo about your favourite stoneage family.

Wheel Of Fortune - Great conversion of the TV Game. Edit the Questions file on your favourite text editor to include your own entries.

Wormtris - This is a totally excellent Tetris game, of which I have many, but I like this one as one of the best. Cross between Tetris and Worms, which doesn't bear thinking about. Very daft and great fun.
