### Overview

3D Maze is a simple game to play! Start off from the blue square, find the red square and make your way back to the blue square! Simple!

3D Maze is a rare program; it's a genuine time-waster!

### How to play

When you load 3DMaze the view you get is a rat's-eye view down a corridor (or possibly a wall!). The commands available include:

<u>Action</u>	<u>Mouse</u>	<u>Keyboard</u>
Move Forward	Fwd. Button	Up Arrow key
Turn Left	Left Button	Left Arrow key
Turn Right	Right Button	Right Arrow key
About Turn	Turn Button	Down Arrow key

As you move about the maze, a message in the bottom right corner indicates whether you are getting 'warmer' or 'colder' (ie; closer or further away) with respect to the target square - follow this closely.

### Difficulty

You can change the maze you are in at any stage by selecting New Maze from the Options menu and then selecting the level of maze you wish to venture through. The levels, in order of difficulty are: Playable, Taxing, Unhealthy or Suicidal. The two numbers after then maze type are the relative sizes of the maze.
