Welcome

Thank you for using *mcdj*. This guide will guide you through some simple steps so you can install *mcdj*.

Pre-installation

You must install the latest version of *Windows Media Player* and the latest version of *DirectX*. If you don't, *mcdj* might not work correctly or it might not work at all.

Windows Media Player

You can download the latest version of Windows Media Player for free by going to
<http://www.microsoft.com/windows/windowsmedia/download/default.asp>

DirectX

You can download the latest version of DirectX for free by going to
<http://www.microsoft.com/windows/directx/downloads/default.asp>.

Both of these packages must have been installed without any errors before going to the next stage.

Installation

If you have downloaded *mcdj* from the Internet, you will have a file called *mcdj.zip*. You will need a third party ZIP file reader to open this file such as *WinZip*. Open the file and run the *setup.exe* file.

If you have *mcdj* on a CD ROM, just run the *setup.exe* file in the *mcdj Professional* folder by double-clicking it.

If you don't have *Windows Installer* on your system, you may need to restart your computer during the installation. Otherwise, you won't need to restart at all.

Follow the on-screen prompts, paying close attention to any multiple choice questions.

When the installation has ended, click *Finish* to complete.

Installing mcdj Professional

If you have purchased *mcdj Professional*, please consult your *mcdj Upgrade Guide* document supplied with your upgrade package.

If you have *mcdj* on a CD ROM, your *mcdj Upgrade Guide* document will be in the *mcdj Professional* folder.

Troubleshooting

If you are getting errors during installation or *mcdj* is not loading, please refer to the *Frequently Asked Questions* (FAQ) section at www.mcdj.net as this is always up-to-date and changes on a regular basis.

Uninstalling

If you want to uninstall *mcdj*, you can do this in the normal way like you can with any software.

For instance, using *Windows XP*, go to your *Control Panel* and open the *Add/Remove Programs* icon. Find *mcdj* in the list and click *Remove*.
