For those of you in the know, Hyperceive doesn't stream and doesn't require plug-ins, which means that it can be accessed by loads of people, easily.

The applications are endless which is why Hyperceive has already been adopted by the likes of HMV, Aegean (George Michael's record company), Warners, Eidos and many more.
