This file contains release notes for version 2.10 of JAMMER Hit Session for Windows.

NEW FEATURES SINCE THE MANUAL WAS PRINTED:

Timer Settings: You may now change the resolution of the Windows Multimedia timer that JAMMER uses. The timer settings should be set to match your computer type. If you experience slow down problems during playback, try setting the timer to a lower timer resolution. You can access the Timer Settings dialog box from the Devices Menu.

System Options: There is now a button to reset all values to their default state.

Chord Entry Window: There is now a button to set the font for the chord list boxes.

SONG DIRECTORIES:

JAMMER now creates a song directory for you. If you installed to the directory C:\JAMWIN, the new song directory will be C:\JAMWIN\SONGS.

BAND AND DRUM STYLES:

JAMMER Hit Session now ships with 100 assorted band style intros, grooves, breaks, stops, holds and endings. Also included are a sampling of drum styles. Drum styles may be loaded into the current band style without affecting the current instrument tracks by right clicking the load style icon (the two musicians from the 60s). Please contact Et Cetera Distribution or SoundTrek for the availability of additional band and drum style disks.

GETTING STARTED:

The easiest way to get up and running with JAMMER is to follow the tutorial help file in the JAMMER program group. It covers most aspects involved in creating songs in JAMMER. The song "tutorial.cmp" was created by following the tutorial.

SYSTEM PERFORMANCE AND TRACK LEDs:

Track LEDs can use up a lot of processor time on slower machines. If your machine responds slowly during playback, disabling this feature may be all that is necessary.

Please note that by default, the LEDs in the Tracks Window are enabled. If you have a slower machine (such as a 386SX 16Mhz), you may want to disable the track LEDs. This can be done in the Preferences Dialog in the Window menu.

As a last resort, you may want to try running Windows in Standard Mode (type "win /s" from the DOS prompt).
