

This README is for **Mono.framework 2.6.3\_4**.

This is the Mono Runtime and Development Platform (<http://www.mono-project.com/>).

This package installs Mono and all of its dependencies inside of /Library/Frameworks/Mono.framework. This behavior is likely to change with a future release so that dependencies will get their own frameworks.

If you'd like to access the mono manpages you'll have to add  
`/Library/Framework/Mono.framework/Versions/Current/man` to your manpath

During the postinstall phase of the installation, links to `/usr/bin` are created for binaries installed into the Commands directory. This is done to prevent requiring modifications to the `$PATH` environmental variable. Yes, we know that this is not typical for \*NIX, but this is Mac OS X.

A simple `uninstallMono.sh` script is included in the disk image. This is shell script that must be run as root, and it will remove the `Mono.framework` and the links in `/usr/bin`.
