



ActiveX Manager

How many times have you tried to register/unregister an ActiveX control (OCX) and wished there was a better way to do it than REGSVR32?

ActiveX Manager enables users and developers to manage ActiveX Controls installed on their PC the easy way. It is great for users who surf the web and want to keep their system clean (ActiveX Manager helps you clean controls installed by Internet Explorer). ActiveX Manager provides a simple yet slick user interface that enables you to view registered controls, remove misbehaved controls, register new controls and more. ActiveX Manager also provides fast access from Windows Explorer via a pop-up menu.

ActiveX Manager allows you to view a list of all the ActiveX Controls installed on your machine. You can view the information about each control like TypeLib, GUID, ProgID etc. It displays all the controls in a list specifying via an icon which control is misbehaved and which is properly installed.

How to Unregister an ActiveX Control?

In order to unregister any of the controls simply select the control from the list and click the 'Unregister' button located on the right side of the screen. The control will be unregistered. Later a dialog box will prompt you to delete the file containing that control. You can either delete or keep the file depending on your needs. You can also unregister controls via Windows Explorer (see 'How to register/unregister controls from Windows Explorer?').

How to remove a misbehaved ActiveX Control?

In order to remove a misbehaved control simply select the buggy control from the list and click the 'Remove' button located on the right side of the screen. The control will be removed from the system registry.

How to Register a new ActiveX Control?

In order to register a new control simply click the 'Add Control' button and select the 'OCX' or 'DLL' file containing the ActiveX Control. You can also register controls via Windows Explorer (see 'How do I register/unregister controls from Windows Explorer?').

How to register/unregister controls from Windows Explorer?

ActiveX Manager allows you to quickly register and unregister controls via Windows Explorer. Simple select the 'OCX' or 'DLL' file containing the control and hit the right mouse button. A pop-up menu will allow you to register or unregister the control quickly. You can also double-click and OCX file to quickly register a control.

Generating reports

ActiveX Manager allows you to generate reports of the ActiveX Controls installed on the machine. To generate a report click the “Report” button located on the main screen. There are two types of reports: HTML and Text. ActiveX Manager allows the user to specify which controls and which fields are going to be included in the report. Use the ‘HTML’ report type to generate a nicely formatted report which you can then print. The ‘Text’ report type (comma delimited) can be used for database analysis.
