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Getting Started

What is Automated Internet?

Welcome to the most powerful communications package you'll ever find. AutoWinNet has been called "a batch file language for the Internet", but it's actually MUCH MORE. AutoWinNet is intelligent.

If he doesn't find a ftp site, then he doesn't try downloading files, changing directories, etc. at that site...
If it cannot find ONE particular prompt, he looks for others. This super-advanced program is the only one of its type. Fast, efficient, and worthwhile to try out.

I use AutoWinNet every single day to find new files on the Internet for my bulletin board. I get the LATEST Scan, F-PROT, TBAV, and all the games FOR FREE! No long distance charges.

If you are an Internet "dummy", don't use this program! This is for the average user of the Net that loves to wander around and find new cool files, but HATES spending hours at a time sitting in front of the computer.

Here is your answer.

AutoWinNet:

1. Gives you unlimited access to TERABYTES of Internet files without forcing you to sit in front of your computer for hours.
2. Mail your letters automatically, even to hundreds of recipients at one time. Great for announcements, personal letters or business purposes. Plus spell-check your work, and add both binary and text attachments.
3. Allows super-advanced Internet access using the graphical SLIP/PPP accounts.
DOWNLOAD WWW Pages, even when you're not home....
4. Uploads files to Internet sites. This is great for authors who want to distribute their programs automatically, or for Corporations that need to transfer a large quantity of files, but don't want the heavy long distance charges.
5. Leeches files from anywhere, take them all without hesitation.
6. Full Windows and Windows '95 support
7. Hammers at Internet sites that are busy, and require hours of frustration to get on. AutoWinNet will get on, guaranteed. Even if it has to try for hours

Even allows you to adjust the time between hammers!.

8. Obtain the latest sports, weather, and daily info.
9. Uses personal "signature file" that password protects your Internet sessions, and ensures no unauthorized people snooping into your AutoWinNet information.
10. Post Usenet messages - up to 1,000 of them without touching your keyboard.
11. Fax people from the Internet. No long distance charges.
12. Find the latest new files and games.. WHILE YOU'RE NOT HOME!
13. Stop at any time during your agenda to perform your OWN things. When AutoWinNet reaches your destination, he will page you!
14. Download more files than your hard disk can hold without long distance charges.
15. Get updates to your favorite programs automatically - direct from their support Internet site.
16. Access the Internet with super-speed. You cannot type as fast as AutoWinNet can!
17. If you're calling long distance to access the Internet, AutoWinNet cuts your phone bill in HALF by whizzing through your tasks faster than you could do them.
18. Keep mailing lists of important clients - give them updated newsletters or up- to-the-minute information without having to touch your keyboard. Don't hire an extra person to handle your Internet tasks, let AutoWinNet take care of them for half the cost.

Why should I automate my Internet sessions?



So... you have a PPP/SLIP account?

Those are fantastic for getting or sending mail, but for files... they just won't cut it. You STILL have to sit at your computer and click on the files you want, get them to your local computer, then hunt down any new files that might interest you at different sites on the Net.

Tried logging onto wuarchive.wustl.edu lately?

How about ftp.cdrom.com?

Good luck. You usually cannot get on. And if you're persistent, you can click on the old FTP icon fifteen THOUSAND times and might get on. But then, if the site times out or disconnects you, I can personally guarantee you'll cuss at your computer violently and become very frustrated.

Argh... forget it. Don't you have better things to do?
Isn't your time worth something?

Concerning Internet mail: That's fun. Just click on your recipient and write a beautiful message.

But what happens when you become responsible for a mailing list?

You must type in all the recipients' names, separated by a comma. And if you miss a comma, or put a space in there accidentally, you have to re-type it all over again.

Doesn't Windows' 8 point font look blurry after a while? Wouldn't it be nicer to simply click on the people you want to add/remove from the list and let AutoWinNet do all the messy work for you?

In short: **What a pain!**



Your time is valuable... use AutoWinNet to retrieve any new files and then download them while you do something YOU want to do. Go jog, workout, shop, sleep, go out with your wife/girlfriend, do the things you REALLY want to rather than getting new files for hours at a time.

You can also use Automated Internet for DOS on your SHELL account, and save some money there, also!

Get a WWW page while I'm asleep?



Absolutely.

When you dial in to your Internet provider, there is no one on the other end, waiting to hand you your mail, or Internet files... so why should YOU be on YOUR end typing all the commands and clicking the icons?

AutoWinNet is good for you

Obviously, because it saves you countless hours and headaches by doing tedious things for you.

Tried logging onto wuarchive.wustl.edu lately?

Good luck. It's always busy.

However, if you call at 5:00am, when everyone else in your area is asleep, you probably can get on **immediately** instead of clicking on the FTP button 4,000 times.

AutoWinNet is good for your provider



Most people call their Internet provider after they get off work, or on weekends. That means that most **EVERYONE** is logging on to the Internet during the evenings.

From a provider's standpoint, that's bad. He has a limited number of modems in stock, and a limited number of lines. Plus, when everyone logs on during the evening, his UNIX box will naturally **SLOW DOWN** considerably,

and you will notice a huge performance drop. Files transfer slower, your newsreader takes longer to update its screens, and Telnet sessions are bogged that you could cook dinner between keystrokes.

That's not good for you, the customer, and obviously not good for the provider.

By spreading the PEAK times around, AutoWinNet allows:

1. Your file transfer rates are **FAST**
2. Your mail is sent quickly
3. Your provider doesn't have to purchase more modems, and therefore pass his savings onto YOU.
4. Your provider has less support calls. Since AutoWinNet does all the work, there's little chance of a typing error or mistake during file transfers.

AutoWinNet Lite is a tool to automate your Internet sessions.

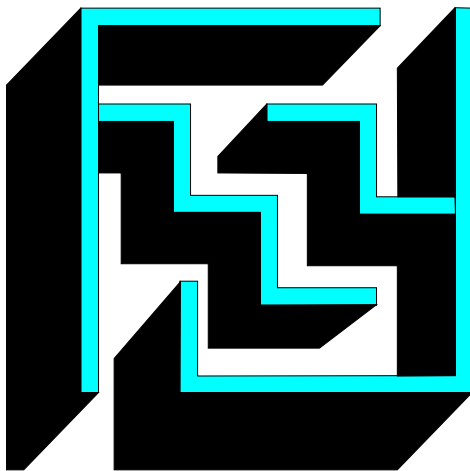

CURRENT FEATURE BOILERPLATE LIST

INSTANT FTP ACCESS

I like getting new files, so I created AutoWinNet to get new files listings from various sites, then I can choose them from a convenient Windows listbox, and wala!

He goes and gets all the files I want.

I also HATE it when a FTP site is busy, and I have to re-click on the FTP icon OVER AND OVER AND OVER AND OVER until I get on.

Frankly, I got better things to do!

Therefore, AutoWinNet hammers at the site until he gets on (you can configure how many times to hammer before he gives up)

MAIL ALL YOUR FRIENDS

I keep several mailing lists of friends, and people who want to find new info on Automated Internet.

So I invented a MAIL LIST function, and the regular MAIL functionality. Now you can keep hundreds of mailing lists (customers, friends, associates) and automate messages to any of these.

You can also automated monthly mail, getting your mail, sending out regular stuff, etc...

USENET NEWS READING/POSTING

Instead of wandering through a newsreader, choosing messages, reading/writing, etc... wouldn't it be great to post usenet messages automatically?

So I invented posting to groups without ever logging onto the Internet!

If ya need help with MICROSOFT WORD 6.0 problems, or just like to chat, you can post "HELP ME WITH MS-WORD!" along with all your problems to a couple of word-processing newsgroups. If anyone can help ya, they can.

In turn, the people can write you mail in response to your questions...

DAILY STOCK REPORTS

Yes, yes. You can subscribe to daily stock reports, White house updates, Yanoff's Internet list, plus tons more. Just click the button and Automated Internet takes care of the rest.

You will receive these great things almost daily, and be updated on the world events...

IMAGINE THAT :-)

WWW PAGES

I thought it would be great to get WWW pages (no graphics! I ain't a graphics programmer!) off-line.

I hate waiting for the screen to update when trying out new WWW pages. Wouldn't it be better to simply download all that junk off-line?

Then you could read it without the hassle.

NEW

This creates a new agenda

You are then prompted for an Agenda name (which can be anything)

After you create this new agenda, you will be prompted for activities to add.
For example:

1. Download file
2. Upload a file
3. Obtain new files list

EDIT

Edit the highlighted agenda

NOTE: You can double click on an agenda name to **EDIT**

You will be taken to the agenda editing screen, where you can choose different activities to add.

For example:

1. Download file
2. Upload a file
3. Obtain new files list
4. Send mail letters
5. Post USENET news messages
6. Get World Wide Web pages as text

COPY

Make a duplicate of the highlighted agenda

If you want a new agenda that will be similar to another you have already made, it's much easier to just copy the agenda to another name, then edit it.

This eliminates you having to type in all the activities again, and saves time.

After you create a name for your new agenda, it will appear in the All Agendas listbox, and you can then edit it.

DELETE

Delete the highlighted agenda

CAREFUL!

You may lose many hours of setting up if you delete the wrong agenda.

Creating an Agenda

Quick tutorial

CREATE A NEW AGENDA

Let's create a new agenda, to learn how one is made and what they consist of.

1. Click AGENDAS from the main menu
2. Click NEW to make a new agenda
3. Type in TEST AGENDA 1 in the text box and click OK

That will be the name of our new agenda.

The EDITING AGENDA screen will appear, and you're now ready to add some steps. Each agenda consists of several steps you want AutoWinNet to run.

For example, go get a new file list, download a file, upload a file, etc.

4. Click ADD FTP to create a FTP step.

The FTP SERVICES window should now appear, listing several possible FTP sites for you to visit.

In the dialog on the left, oak.oakland.edu should be listed. If it's not there, click NEW FTP SITE then type in oak.oakland.edu.

5. Single click on oak.oakland.edu in the FTP SITES listbox.
The buttons in the FUNCTION section should now come to life.
6. Click REFRESH FILES LISTS and the SELECT DIRECTORIES FOR REFRESH dialog will appear.

Now, if you have visited oak.oakland.edu before, then you will see all the oak.oakland.edu directories listed up top. When you click on one, it appears in the text line at the bottom.

Since we've never been here before, highlight the lower text box, and type in /SimTel/win3 then click the SELECT button.

That tell AutoWinNet to FTP to oak.oakland.edu, and get all the directories under /SimTel/win3, which is naturally all the Windows file directories they have.

The next time this dialog appears when you choose oak.oakland.edu, you'll see a ton of directories you can select from.

7. After you clicked SELECT, you should now be back at FTP SERVICES.

8. Since one agenda item is okay for our first try, click on the **DONE** button to save your new agenda to disk, and exit

The EDITING AGENDA dialog should have one entry:

Connect to oak.oakland.edu, refresh file list from /SimTel/win3

So click on OK then click the EXIT button on the AGENDAS dialog.

NOTE: If you want to see the Agenda run right now, press the QUICK RUN button during your agenda edit.

Editing your Agendas

Agenda Steps

1. Click on **AGENDAS** from the main menu
2. Create a new agenda called TEST AGENDA 1
3. Click on **ADD FTP**
4. Click on oak.oakland.edu in the listbox

If it's not in there, add it using the NEW FTP button

5. Now click the **REFRESH FILES LIST** and type in /SimTel/msdos at the bottom text box

Run that agenda to collect all the subdirectories of /SimTel/msdos at oak.oakland.edu

6. Once it's done, go back to **AGENDAS**, then **ADD FTP** and click on oak.oakland.edu again.
And wala! You see all the new directories up top? Those are ones we just obtained in that last agenda.

If, now you want to see what files are in the /SimTel/msdos/modem directory (maybe a new version of AUTO-net for DOS!)

Click once on it, then click on **SELECT**

And the next time you click **REFRESH DIRECTORIES**, you'll find all the files inside /SimTel/msdos/modem

Downloading a file

1. Click **AGENDAS**, either create a new agenda, or click on an existing one, then **ADD FTP**, oak.oakland.edu, like we did before.

You should now be at the AGENDA-FTP SERVICES screen.

2. Click on **DOWNLOAD FILE**

NOTE: Any files with a “0” size are either directories or user-oriented messages.

3. The top listbox should contain several files, one of which is /SimTel/msdos/DIRLIST.TXT
If you don't see that filename, it's because you haven't **REFRESHed FILES** there, yet.
4. Highlight those files (or type them in at the bottom of the screen, separated by semicolons) and click **SELECT**
5. Now click **DONE** from the **AGENDA-FTP SERVICES** screen
6. Now click **QUICK RUN** from the **Editing Agendas Screen**

Running an Agenda

Quick tutorial

RUNNING OUR NEW AGENDA

You ready to roll?

1. Click **CONNECT** from the main menu.

NOTE: MAKE SURE YOU'RE CONNECTED TO THE INTERNET WITH YOUR DIALER AND YOU HAVE A SLIP/PPP ACCOUNT RUNNING!

I don't want any support calls from people who have shell accounts, and cannot figure out why this won't work.

2. Highlight your agenda name and click on ADD > (or double click the name)

If you don't see your agenda listed in the left listbox, start over from scratch. You didn't create the agenda successfully.

3. In the right listbox, your agenda name should appear.

4. Click **RUN NOW** (or **RUN LATER** in AutoWinNet Professional)

Run Agenda dialog

After pressing the **CONNECT** button from our main menu, you will see the above dialog.

Add

Double click on an agenda name in the left listbox to add it. Or simply press the Add button.

You can add multiple agendas (in AutoWinNet Professional) by clicking on several agenda names in the left listbox.

Run now

This runs the agenda listed in the right listbox immediately.

Run later AutoWinNet Professional

This runs the agendas listed in the right listbox at a later time. You will be prompted for the exact time in which to start your agendas.

For example: 12:00am, 4:00am

IMPORTANT NOTE: Most Internet sites do maintenance late during the evening. If you run an agenda during this time, you will probably get many errors or time-outs logging onto the FTP sites.

Watching your agenda run

During the actual run, you can watch up top, as each step of your agenda takes place. And on the bottom listbox, communication proceeds between AutoWinNet and your Internet site.

IMPORTANT NOTE: The **KILL SESSION** button will terminate all agendas, and exit the program. Be very careful when using this button, since it will be a HARD job to re-create exactly what you wanted done again.

KILL SESSION wreaks havoc on the program - by the nature of the beast. Press it sparingly...

Frequent Run Agenda problems

It just sat there

Make sure your agenda has some items in it. If your agenda is empty, it will appear to just sit and wait.

Another problem may be with your WINSOCK. Frequently, a winsock dialer will time-out and hang up on your Internet provider without telling you. Then, no matter what you do, all your Internet programs just do nothing.

Make sure you're still connected, and the WINSOCK dialer has not hung up.

Kept saying "Retrying site" and did nothing

If AutoWinNet does not log successfully on a site, it will "hammer" until it gets on. You can tell AutoWinNet not to hammer at any sites, or you can specify how many times you want it to try getting on your FTP site before it quits.

Both of these features are adjustable in the OPTIONS section (a button on the main menu)

It keeps timing out, no matter what I do

The Internet is probably just REAL busy, and everything will run slow. Try at a later time, or earlier time of the day.

If that still doesn't help, contact AutoWinNet technical support.

It just hangs... Nothing is happening

Your WINSOCK program (Trumpet, Internet in a Box (tm)) probably timed out and hung up. If nothing runs, and all your

Internet programs simply die and time out, chances are you're no longer connected to the Internet.

Check your WINSOCK settings in TCPMAN.EXE (trumpet winsock) and increase your inactivity timeout.

The file manager dialog is blank

It's disabled in the Lite version.

FTP is the ONLY thing that works in the Lite version. Upon purchasing the Professional Version, you get mailing lists, sending mail, spell checking outgoing messages, posting to USENET, obtaining WWW pages, and the full-featured file manager (which includes internal PKZIP support and charts/graphs/reports of your Internet file database).

RUNTIME ERROR 202

That's a WINSOCK message - nothing I can do about it. Chances are you pressed ABORT AGENDA, which is never a good button to press!

Unfortunately, it's very hard to abort an already running agenda. Winsock is moody, and he doesn't like being turned off during a process.

Agenda Items

FTP Services

FTP stands for File Transfer Protocol. You are most likely accustomed to calling various Bulletin Boards around town, and downloading files over your modem.

An FTP site is much like a bulletin board, where you can view file listings and decide which ones you would like to try out. Unfortunately, most of these sites do not have file descriptions. So when you download a file, you must look through it to determine what exactly it does.

All FTP sites have a variety of free or shareware programs available. The shareware principle is simple:

Try the program for a few weeks. If you like it, send the author a little money, and he will give you a "enhanced" version, or one without nagging reminders.

There are hundreds of thousands of shareware and freeware programs available. You are sure to find something you like, but searching for it is half the battle. And always remember: Virus scan everything you download!

It's best to be safe rather than sorry.

Most FTP sites are organized into directories. And the pathnames have a forward slash rather than a backward slash (which takes some adjusting to!)

The public programs are commonly in the **/PUB** directory and its subdirectories.

For example: Many Unix programs will be in /PUB/UNIX
 and Ms-Dos programs in /PUB/MSDOS
 and of course, Windows programs in /PUB/WINDOWS or /PUB/WIN3

These are organized into further subdirectories, depending on what type of program it is.

For example: File utilities (directory listers, etc...) might be in /PUB/MSDOS/FILEUTIL
 and WordPerfect enhancements in /PUB/MSDOS/WP6

For the most part, trial and error is the best method of finding files you like.

Mail

AVAILABLE IN AutoWinNet Professional

EDIT MESSAGE

This opens **NOTEPAD**, fills in the "SUBJECT:" then allows you to edit your message.

Once in notepad, you can copy text from other applications and include them in your message. When you're finished editing, save the message in notepad, and you will return to the above dialog.

Now click **POST** and your message will be added to the current agenda, and later sent out to the people you specified in the **TO:** listbox.

NOTE: If the **TO** listbox is empty, you cannot send your message

POST

This adds your message to the AGENDA. It will be sent when your agenda is run.

If in doubt, use the **TUTORIAL** on editing and sending messages.

CANCEL

This cancels all current editing and closes the dialog.

NOTE: Any changes you made will be lost

TO:

If you want to add an address to the **TO:** listbox that is not in the **MEMBERS** listbox and is not included in your mailing lists, then type the address in here.

Once an address is in the **TO:** section, click the **ADD:** button directly underneath it to add this new name into the listbox.

When your message is sent out, that person will receive it.

NOTE: It's not necessary to type anything in here!

If the address is listed under **MEMBERS** at the bottom, simply double-click on that address to add it to the **TO:** listbox.

If you want to add an entire mailing list, simply double-click on a mailing list name, and those people therein are immediately added to the **TO:** listbox.

EDIT Mailing lists

This will open the **EDIT MAILING LIST** dialog (see below)

ADD Mailing list

This expands the currently selected mailing list, and adds each member to the **TO:** listbox.

ADD and DELETE from the TO: list

The **TO:** listbox holds all the addresses you want to send this message to. Each recipient will get the same message.

When you click **ADD**, whatever you have typed in the **TO:** line up top is added to your recipients.

And **DELETE** will remove the highlighted recipient.

NOTE: If no one is highlighted, then nothing will be deleted from the **TO:** listbox.

SUBJECT:

The subject of your message.

Mailing Lists

Mailing lists contain more than one address that you want your message to go to.

For example, if I had two supervisors that wanted E-MAIL each month containing what work I have done, I would mail two separate letters each month:

One to major@info.com

and another to asstmajor@info.com

So instead of writing two messages every month, I could automate a message and include both of those people in my mailing list.

To create a new mailing list, click the **EDIT MAILING LISTS** button.

And to add the members of a mailing list to your **TO:** listbox, simply double-click on the mailing list name. All of the addresses will be searched, and added up top.

Editing Mailing Lists

This allows either creating a new mailing list, or editing an already existing one.

The directions are very simple. Highlight all the addresses under **MEMBERS** that you want included in a new mailing list, then type in the name of that list up top.

Now, if you go back to the main mail dialog, you'll notice your new list has been added to the **MAILING LISTS** section.

MEMBERS

These are the "REAL NAMES" of all your friends, relatives, and business associates. When you add them to the **TO:** listbox, or a mailing list, you can access them easily, and write letters to them often.

Editing a list is very easy, and once done, you can **EDIT MAILING LISTS** and create new mailing lists from the existing addresses you have.

NEW

Create a new mailing list.

You will be prompted for a name, then allowed to select the members of that list.

ADD

Add a new or existing member to your mailing list.

DELETE

Nuke one of the members of this mailing list.

NOTE: He must be highlighted before pressing **DELETE**

Understanding Mailing Lists

Frequently, you will have several people that you write on a weekly or daily basis.

You may announce a new product, remind them of an upcoming event, or be in charge of a "mailing list" for your club, business or organization.

In either case, writing them the SAME message over and over becomes a hassle. And quite time consuming. AutoWinNet allows broadcasting messages quickly and easily - with a very attractive interface:

INTERNET IN A BOX (tm) offers a one-line, comma-separated list, but you can only fit ten people in it.

EUDORA offers a comma-separated list, but it looks like this:

Pretty ugly, huh?

Where are their real names? And who the hell is silber@stalag13.com???

AutoWinNet offers a much much more appealing substitute:

MEMBER NAME

MAILING ADDRESS

Fred Smith

fred@quessa.com

John Jones

dipshit@unicomp.net

SELECT

Highlight the member you want to select, then press this button.

ADD NEW

Add a NEW member to the above list. Another dialog will appear (see below)

EDIT

Edit the currently highlighted member

DELETE

Delete the currently highlighted member

A quick Mail tutorial

Let's assume our member list is:

physics@compuTek.net
tmartin@iAdfw.net
PRESIDENT@WHITEHOUSE.GOV
john.stewart@lunatic.com

BEGIN BY MAILING john.stewart@lunatic.com

Let's start by mailing Mr. Stewart a letter.

Since he's already in the **MEMBERS** section, you'll notice his address appears in the **MEMBERS** section at the bottom of our dialog.

Now double-click on his name down in MEMBERS to add him to the TO: listbox.

You see his name appear up there?

Now type "HOWDY JOHN!" in the **SUBJECT**: section.

So we're all set. We have a recipient for our message, a subject, and now we just need to type in a message.

Click on **EDIT**, and **NOTEPAD** appears.

Cursor down a couple of lines below the **SUBJECT**: portion of your message, then type "Hi there John. Just testing out the New AutoWinNet"

And choose **FILE**, then **SAVE** from the menu.

Now close down **NOTEPAD** by choosing **FILE** then **EXIT**.

Ok. We have our message, and we're ready to send it. So click **POST**

and this message will be added to your current agenda.

ADDING A MAILING LIST

Included with your AutoWinNet package are several sample mailing list

If you pull this up into **NOTEPAD**, you'll notice that it also consists of several E-MAIL addresses, each on a line. You can edit this file with NOTEPAD or choose EDIT MAILING LISTS from the mail dialog.

Find the list: **SAMPLE** in the mailing list box near the bottom of our mail dialog.

Now double-click on it, and you'll notice it disappears, and a whole bunch of addresses appear up top in the TO: listbox.

Since you have a few addresses up there, let's go ahead and write them all a letter.

Type "test message" in the **SUBJECT** portion, then click on **EDIT MSG** like you did before.

NOTEPAD will come up, with a **SUBJECT:** portion already filled out for you.

Now simply cursor down a couple of lines below the subject, and type in a sample message. When done, choose **FILE** then **SAVE** from **NOTEPAD's** menu and exit out.

When back to our mail dialog, click **POST** and this message will be added to your current agenda.

Don't abuse mail

Please don't abuse E-MAIL by sending tons of useless messages. And definately do not send multiple messages to the same person.

Be fowarned, anyone who decides to include my E-MAIL address 100 times in their mailing list will receive ten-fold that amount in **theirs** :-)

Faxing

remote.printer.FIRSTLINE/SECONDLINE@[phone number, backward].tpc.int

The first and second line are the header that will appear on the fax, and the phone number backward looks like: 2.9.2.6.1.4.6.4.1.2.1

(that's a BBS number 1-214-641-6292)

So to fax that bbs:

remote.printer.DAVESMITH/HI_THERE_DAVE@2.9.2.6.1.4.6.4.1.2.1.tpc.int

That huge address would go in the TO: section of your message and you can put anything you want in the SUBJECT section.

In addition to the AutoWinNet method of posting to USENET, you can also do so

by sending mail in the following format:

groupname@cs.utexas.edu - use dashes instead of dots in groupname: alt-binaries-pictures

or

groupname@pwd.bull.com

So if I wanted to post a great message to the group: alt.bbs.ads, I would type:

alt.bbs.ads@pwd.bull.com

in the TO: text box, and fill out the subject, etc... and type a message into the main text. This in turn would be mailed out immediately, and posted to alt.bbs.ads.

NOTE: I strongly recommend posting all test messages to ALT.TEST, so in case you screw up the message, 14,000 people don't respond and mail-bomb your site.

World Wide Web

AVAILABLE IN AutoWinNet Professional

The "web" and "web-surfing" has become one of the most well-known activities of all time. And AutoWinNet allows you to retrieve WEB pages as text, and save them into files.

NOTE: No graphics are saved... only text.

To select a World Wide Web site, simply highlight one of the 250 included sites, then fill in what filename to save to.

When done, press **OK**

If you have another cool web site that's not listed, simply type it into the **SITE ADDRESS** box, choose a filename in the **SAVE TO FILE** box, and press **OK**.

NOTE: All web files are saved into the WWW directory, unless otherwise specified.

Timeout

How many seconds should pass without activity before AutoWinNet moves on to the next agenda item.

Download directory

When downloading a file from a FTP site, where should AutoWinNet put it?

So if AUTONT32.ZIP already existed, it would be downloaded as AUTONT32.ZI0

Where to post mail messages at... If in doubt, contact your provider.

NOTE: Please post messages at your own provider's site.

Otherwise, you probably won't be able to post at all.

Again, if in doubt, contact your provider.

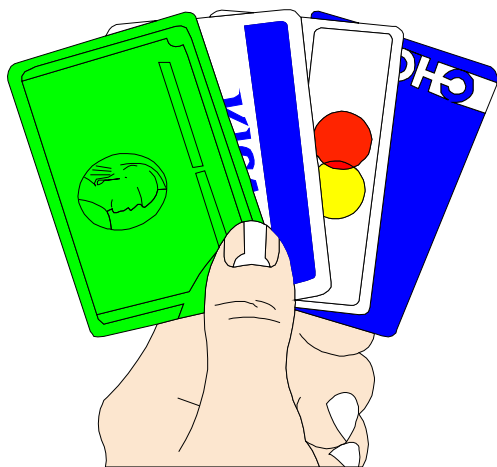
