1.3 Synopsis

How to start WBMakeLink?

It's SIMPLE!

Just drop it in your WBStartup directory or anywhere else you want
and double click its icon.

The settings for WBMakeLink are stored in its Workbench icon.

What is WBMakeLink?

WBMakeLink adds a menu item to the "Tools" menu of the Workbench screen.
If you are familiar with the "Make Alias" menu item on Macintosh
systems, WBMakeLink will feel right at home for you. Simply select
an icon (or icons) on the Workbench screen and select "Make Link"
from the tools menu. A link to the selected icons will be made,
and a new icon will be made for the link file.

If no icon exists for the file that is selected, no link icon will
be made, unless the "ALWAYSMAKEICON" tooltype exists.

1.4 Why does WBMakeLink copy the icon?

WBMakeLink copies the icon instead of making a link to the icon.

This is because in order to make the linked icon appear in a
different snapshotted place than the original icon, it has to
have a different set of x,y coordinates, which are stored in
the icon.

If it didn't, the icon would be placed over the original icon in
the workbench window, unless the icon was unsnapshotted.

Even if a link file was created, once you moved the icon and
snapshotted it, it would be saved as a real file, instead of
a link.

If no icon exists for the file that is selected, no link icon will be made, unless the "ALWAYSMAKEICON" tootype exists.

1.6 Tooltypes

Description of the icon tooltypes

The following are the tooltypes in which WBMakeLink gets its settings from when it is started.

The tooltypes can be marked out so that they are not defined by placing parenthesis around the keyword. For example (ALWAYSMAKEICON).

MENUNAME=

You can set the name that you want to appear in the "Tools" menu.

ALWAYSMAKEICON

If this tootype exists, WBMakeLink will always make an icon for the linked file, even if the original file doesn't have an icon.

1.7 Default Settings

Default Settings

MENUNAME=Make Link

(ALWAYSMAKEICON) <--- In other words, it doesn't always make an icon.

1.8 Features

WBMakeLink Features

- o Uses the "Tools" menu in Workbench.
- o Create file links from workbench, and add's an icon for the link.
- o Configurable menu item name.
- o If you like, it will even create link icons for files with no icons.

1.9 How to quit WBMakeLink

How to Quit WBMakeLink

1. Make sure no icons are selected.
Select "Make Link" from the "Tools" menu in Workbench.
Select "Quit" from the requester.
2. OR send WBMakeLink a CTRL-C.
