

OptionCaps

OptionCaps is a system extension primarily for users of PowerBooks whose keyboards sport the Caps Lock key that doesn't lock down when pressed. Hence, the annoyance of having to reset the Caps Lock key after accidentally typing a half-dozen characters in upper case. It is similar to the Caps Lock Off Extension except that it still allows you to use the Caps Lock key - you just have to indicate that you really mean to by holding down the Option Key, too.

After installing OptionCaps, you can not activate the Caps Lock key by just pressing it. You must instead hold down the Option key, and then (while still holding down the Option key) press the Caps Lock key. Similarly, to reset the Caps Lock key to lower case mode, you must again hold down the Option key while pressing Caps Lock. You may find the Caps Lock key is a little fussy. To be sure, hold down both the Option key and the Caps Lock key for a full second.

You may also find it convenient to install one of the extensions that notifies you when the Caps Lock key is set.

OptionCaps is meant to be used with system 7.x only.

To install OptionCaps, simply drag a copy of it into the Extensions Folder.
