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Introduction to Surfer Central

This section introduces you to Surfer Central. Included here is an explanation of the program, some reasons why you should use it, and a list of features.

Please **note** that the words "site" and "address" are used interchangeably; that is, each refers to an entity which is stored within the database

What is Surfer Central?

Surfer Central is a useful tool for Microsoft Windows 3.1 (and later) that allows the user to manage all Internet addresses, including E-Mail, WWW, FTP, FSP, Gopher, Archie and Telnet, in a convenient and simple fashion. Each address contains fields that are unique to that site type. For example, E-Mail addresses contain a person's name, e-mail address, alias, snail mail address, etc. Field names are completely customizable and need not be displayed if the field is of no personal use.

The site database is split into 7 categories according to the various types of addresses that may be entered. In addition, each address may be accessed from a global list of all sites in the database. Each site may be assigned one of 32 user-definable subcategories according to personal tastes. For example, a list of e-mail addresses could be separated into personal, business, and support contacts.

Site lists may be generated at the click of a button which is an excellent feature if you manage some sort of mailing list. The text header of each section of the site list is fully customizable.

Surfer Central also acts as an excellent shell for maintaining Winsock connections. At the touch of a button, you can launch your Winsock session manager (for example, TCPIPMan.EXE) as well as the client software associated with the site you have selected. TCP/IP Manager can also be loaded in a minimized state and unloaded on exit of Surfer Central.

Netscape bookmark files and Mosaic hotlist files can be imported into the database saving you countless hours of retyping!!! In addition, each URL to be imported may be assigned to a particular category.

As of version 1.20, site types are also user-definable. Don't like the FSP site type? Change it to something else such as 'News'!!

Why should you use Surfer Central?

The number of people using the Internet is growing at an alarming rate. Obviously, each user has some sort of address associated with him/her. For example, every Internet user possesses an e-mail address and possibly (soon) a home page on the World Wide Web. This makes for a horrendous number of addresses to manage. Surfer Central is tailored towards helping you keep track of all of your sites and addresses in a convenient and logical way.

Some of the advantages of Surfer Central over conventional methods of managing your Internet addresses include:

- you can have all your sites in one handy dandy place
- you can organize addresses by name instead of cryptic addresses
- you can do searches for text
- sites can be arranged in categories for logical storage
- generate quick lists of addresses so you have hard copies
- generate quick lists of addresses so you can trade with other people
- all of your Winsock programs are accessible in one place

Surfer Central is for you if you are an Internet surfer, **either a newbie or a guru**. Surfer Central will help you manage your WWW, E-Mail, FTP, FSP, Gopher, Archie and Telnet addresses so that locating a needed contact, FTP site, home page, archie server, etc. is a painless process.

List of Features

Given below is a summary of some of the useful features provided by Surf Central. Feel free to copy and paste this list and pass it on to your friends!!

- allow the user to store and retrieve a wide variety of Internet site addresses in a simple fashion
- contain custom fields for WWW sites, E-Mail addresses, FTP, FSP, Telnet, Archie, and Gopher... or create your own site types!!
- site information boxes that DO NOT display information that is unnecessary (ie. dynamic fields)
- custom fields for each of the Internet sites described above
- import Netscape bookmark files and Mosaic hotlist files and place each URL into a particular category.
- have Netscape automatically connect to a URL from within Surfer Central.
- automatically grab a URL from Netscape to ease the creation of a new address record.
- act as a command shell for using a Winsock connection. A dynamic toolbar on the right side of the main window contains buttons for all Winsock tools the user has currently configured.
- automatically load TCP/IP manager in a minimized state and unload it on exit of Surfer Central
- generate an organized, customizable site list at the click of a button. This list may contain full details about the addresses in the database or simply your addresses (great for a mailing list)
- a screen that lists all of the sites in the database (with scrollbar) and allows the user to click on a site to get full details.
- use a notebook metaphor for assigning each site a category
- full 3-D interface
- toolbars (with descriptions) for most activities
- check for a valid winsock connection and if none is found, launch the appropriate Winsock connection manager and close it when complete.
- allow the user to define the WWW, FTP, etc. clients which are used in his/her system
- when a FTP, WWW, site is on the screen, with the press of a button the client software is launched and the user is connected to that site.
- simple copy operation to copy a site name to the clipboard. Addresses may be copied as URLs if desired.
- context sensitive menus available by clicking the right mouse button
- password option for each of the site list files
- modem status window with LEDs for all you internal modem users
- many user customizable features, including screen colors, fonts, toolbars displayed, desktop window position and others.

Conventions

There are several typographical conventions used within this help file:

Primary Mouse Button: is usually, by default, the left button of the mouse. This button is used for most operations such as selecting text or choosing a menu item.

Secondary Mouse Button: is usually, by default, the opposite button to the primary mouse button (i.e. the right mouse button). This button is typically used for accessing pop-up menus.

Menu Items: menu items are indicated by **black boldface text**. For example, the **File** menu.

Buttons: are indicated by *italicized text*.

Select: this word usually implies that the primary mouse button should be clicked on a particular object on the screen. For example, select **Open** from the **File** menu implies that the primary mouse button should be first clicked on **File** followed by the **Open** menu item.

System Requirements

To use Surf Central, you will require:

- at least an 80386 processor
- Windows 3.1 (or later)
- a screen resolution of 640x480 (256 colors recommended) or greater
- a mouse
- at least 2 Meg of memory (more depending on the size of the database file)
- approx. 2.5 Meg of disk space

Installation

Installation of Surfer Central couldn't be simpler!! An installation program called INSTALL.EXE has been included to automatically configure Surfer Central for your machine. Assuming you are using *Program Manager*, click on the **File** menu and select **Run**. Next type:

a:install

Follow the on screen instructions and when you are complete, Surfer Central can be run by double-clicking on the icon that was placed in the group of your choice.

Running Surfer Central

Running Surfer Central is very straightforward. Simply locate the Surfer Central icon in your Windows shell (usually Program Manager) and double-click the left mouse button on this icon.

Hint: the Surfer Central icon will be located in the program group that you selected during the install process.

- *I registered my copy of Surfer Central but since then I've made significant changes to my system. Now the program says I'm not registered. What should I do?*

The registration program uses your system information to generate the program lock number. When you change part of your system a new key number is required that corresponds to your new lock number. Simply contact the author providing your new and old lock number in the correspondence. Your registration status will be verified and you will be given a new key number (at least until I come up with a better system).

- *I get a General Protection Fault (GPF) when the program is started - something to do with not being able to find a bitmap or other type of file. What is wrong?*

Make sure that the icon you are using to run the program has its working directory set to the same directory that contains the SURFRCEN.EXE file. If the working directory is not correct, the program will not be able to find some of its files that are necessary for initialization. *Better error checking will be incorporated into future versions of Surfer Central.*

- *When I launch one of the Winsock client programs a message box appears indicating there was an error.*

Do you use a TCP/IP Manager? The most common instance of this error is *Error Code: 2*. This error indicates that a file was not found. If you don't have the TCP/IP Manager setup correctly and the Winsock program you are launching is set up to first launch the TCP/IP Manager followed by itself, you will get this error which indicates that Surfer Central tried to execute TCP/IP Manager but was unsuccessful. If you don't use any sort of Winsock manager, then make sure the associated checkbox for each Winsock tool is unchecked. See Using the Winsock Tools for more information. Also, here is a list of error codes.

- *I have checked the minimize TCP/IP Manager checkbox and the unload TCP/IP Manager checkbox in the Configure Winsock Tools dialog. However, when I run the TCP/IP Manager it is not minimized and when I exit Surfer Central the TCP/IP Manager is not closed. What is wrong?*

For the TCP/IP Manager, you **must** have the description field in the Configure Winsock Tools dialog box set to the **exact** name of the Window (given in the title bar) of the TCP/IP Manager you use. For example, a heavily used manager is called Trumpet Winsock. You'll notice that the title of the main window when Trumpet Winsock is loaded is indeed 'Trumpet Winsock'. Thus, you must have this string as the description. Why? Because Surfer Central can't find the Window to minimize/close if it doesn't know the name of it.

- *After importing a Netscape bookmark or Mosaic hotlist file, the columns in the sites listbox seem all messed up. Some URLs are displayed on the screen but the URLs with sites that have long site names are not displayed. How can I fix this?*

The site names of the sites in the bookmark file or hotlist file are extraordinarily long. To clean up the sites listbox you should shorten the long site names. To do this, select the site with the long name, shorten the name in the site entry area, and insert the new site. Finally, delete the old site that had the long name. Note that you cannot just *change* the name of the site - when a site name or address is changed Surfer Central requires that you perform an insert operation.

- *When I invoke Surfer Central help that pesky little window displaying the contents tree is **always** on top of other windows. How do I fix that???*

To prevent the contents tree from staying on top of other windows, click on the Help menu of the HWA Contents Tree window and select the menu item 'Always On Top'. This action will have the effect of disabling the always on top feature causing the contents tree to behave like all other windows. Note that this **need only be done once**. The contents tree window remembers its state between executions, thus, the next time it is invoked, the always on top feature will remain disabled.

- *I am trying to import a Netscape bookmark file (or a Mosaic hotlist file) and when I choose the file name to import in the open dialog box, the list of sites to be imported is blank. I know there are sites in that bookmark file. What is wrong?*

This problem is commonly encountered when trying to import a bookmark or hotlist file that was originally used in a UNIX environment. UNIX files do not use the same carriage return / line feed combinations to break lines in a file as DOS does. As a result, when Surfer Central attempts to read the bookmark or hotlist file and that file was created in a UNIX environment, it thinks there is just one long line in the file and your sites are read incorrectly. The solution is to give the command 'unix2dos -ascii <file> <file>' (without the quotes) in the UNIX environment before bring the bookmark file over to your PC. This command converts the file to use the DOS carriage return / line feed convention. Surfer Central should then read your file correctly. 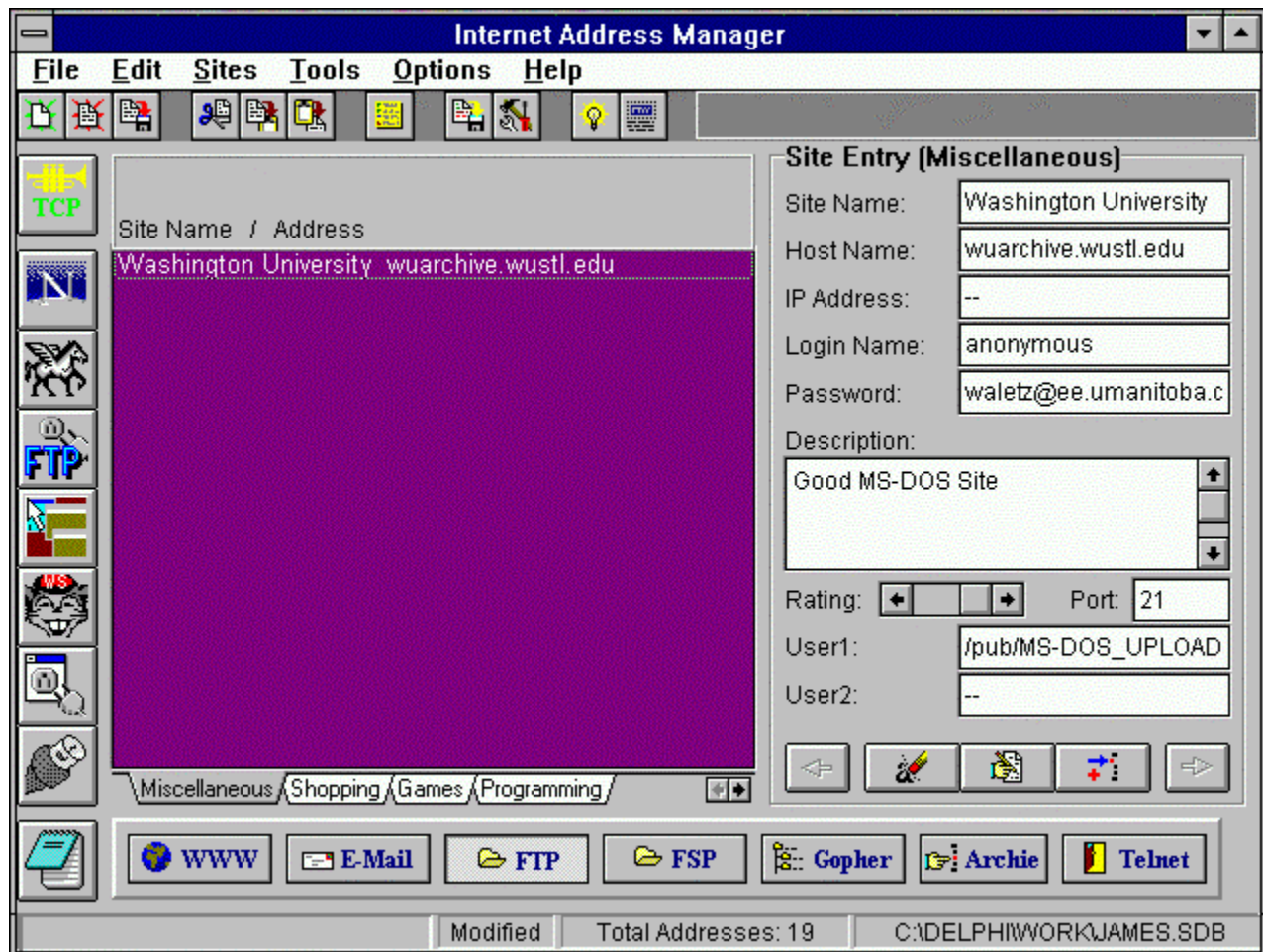

Note #1: Your main window may not look *exactly* like this - it depends on your video mode, how your system colors are configured, and the configuration of your Winsock tools.

Note #2: For information on a particular area of the main window, move over the desired area (the cursor should turn into a hand) and click the primary mouse button to jump to the appropriate topic.



The Main Menu

A picture of the main menu for Surfer Central is provided below. For further information on any of the menu items, click on the appropriate menu item in the illustration.



The Sites Listbox

The sites listbox provides a bird's-eye view of the sites in the current database. The list is divided into several (up to 8) categories as indicated by the tabs at the bottom of the listbox. *Only the sites belonging to the currently selected category are displayed.* A screenshot of the sites listbox is given below.

Each site in the list is represented by two fields of text - the first field (leftmost column) identifies the name of the site; the second field (rightmost column) indicates either the hostname or the IP address of that site. The hostname is given a higher priority than the IP address (since it is more meaningful) but if no hostname was provided when the site was entered into the database, the IP address is displayed.

Each site in the list can be selected by clicking the primary mouse button on it. A selected site is highlighted in blue in the example above, but this color may be different depending on your system configuration.

To change categories, simply click on the desired category tab. There are actually 8 categories in total, although all 8 will not be visible on the screen simultaneously. To view hidden tabs, press the right and left arrows at the far right of the tab set.

The Site Entry Area

The site entry area is where you will enter the information for all of your Internet addresses. A screenshot of the site entry area for an FTP site is shown below.

All of the fields for each site type are shown in this box. Note that the field labels (to the left of each edit box or scroll bar) are user configurable, so your labels may look slightly different. Also, each site type contains different fields - the site entry area changes dynamically corresponding to the currently selected site type. For example, it wouldn't make sense to have a field for a person's snail mail address in a WWW record.

The site entry contains several fields by default:

- *Category Name* - shown in brackets beside the Site Entry label
- *Site Name* - a text string describing the site
- *Host Name (URL for WWW)* - the hostname of the site
- *IP Address* - the Internet Protocol address in numeric form
- *URL Type (WWW Only)* - the type of URL in the URL box
- *Login Name* - the name you use to login to the site
- *Password* - the password used to login to the site
- *Description* - any text that you wish
- *Rating* - 0 (scrollbar at left edge) indicates a poor site and 5 (scrollbar at right edge) indicates an excellent site
- *Port* - port number of the site (e.g. for FTP, the port is always 21)
- *User Field #1* - any text you wish (the label for this field in the above example has been changed to Directory)
- *User Field #2* - any text you wish (this field is not displayed in the above example)

The buttons are (from left to right):

- *Previous Site* - go to the previous site in the list. If the first site is the one displayed in the site entry information area then this button is disabled
- *Clear* - Clear all the edit boxes. This button is used when a new site (starting from scratch) is to be entered
- *Update* - Press this button when you have made a change to one of the fields of the currently displayed site. **You cannot update a site in which the site name, host name or IP address has been changed. In this case the Insert button must be used.** (see Updating an Existing Site)
- *Insert* - Once all of the information for a new site has been entered, the *Insert* button must be used to submit the site to the database and display it in the sites listbox (see Entering a New Site)
- *Next Site* - go to the next site in the list. If the last site is the one displayed in the site entry information area then this button is disabled

Hint: To quickly move between edit boxes, press the *Tab* key to move forward and *Shift + Tab* to move backward

Hint: If all of the information for a particular field is not visible in an edit box, simply click on the edit box to activate it and use the cursor keys to view the hidden text

The Toolbar

The sole purpose of the toolbar is to make commonly used menu items available with one click of the mouse. You will find that you will rarely need to use the main menu since almost all commands are available via a toolbar on the main window. Another purpose of the toolbar is to display hints for various buttons and menu items in the program. The gray window on the right side of the toolbar displays context-sensitive hints when the mouse is over a hint-enabled button or menu item.

For your reference a brief description of each toolbar button is given below. For further information on a toolbar button simply click the primary mouse button on the appropriate toolbar button in the diagram below.



Hint: to determine the purpose of a toolbar button, move the mouse over the button in question. |

The Winsock Toolbar

The Winsock toolbar is located on the left side of the main window. Included on this bar are various buttons that are used to launch the Winsock client programs.

This toolbar will look different for every user since not everyone will use the same client programs. **In all probability, the Winsock toolbar buttons will be disabled (i.e. are not pressable) when Surfer Central is run for the first time.** Once configured, the toolbar buttons take the form of the icon assigned to the client program. As shown in the example toolbar below, the WWW browser icon contains a bitmap of the Netscape icon since Netscape is the browser that I use.

Note: If the toolbar buttons are disabled (contain a text description and cannot be pressed) you must setup the paths to the client programs you use. For further information see [Using the Winsock Tools](#)

To get more information on a particular toolbar button, click the mouse on the appropriate icon in the picture below.



Hint: For help on what the various icons represent, simply move the mouse over an icon to view its associated "balloon" help.

Button Purpose: To launch the TCP/IP manager tool

Description: The TCP/IP manager is used to coordinate and manage the SLIP or PPP connection on your machine. If you have a direct connection to the Internet and do not make use of SLIP or PPP then this tool will not be of use to you. Feel free to reconfigure this button to launch another program of your choosing.

A common TCP/IP Manager is called Trumpet Winsock.

Button Purpose: To launch your World Wide Web browser program

Description: The World Wide Web (WWW) is a tool whose use is exploding on the Internet. It allows you to view hypertext documents which take you to various other links on the Internet. The amount of information available on the Web is astounding! This button allows you to launch your WWW browser. You may also configure the program in such a way as to first launch the TCP/IP manager before launching the browser.

Common WWW browsers are Mosaic and Netscape.

Button Purpose: To launch your e-mail client program

Description: Once you have looked up an e-mail address using Surfer Central, the next logical step is to launch your e-mail client program so that you may send this person some mail. Pressing this button loads up your e-mail program as well as the TCP/IP manager if desired.

Common e-mail programs are [Eudora](#) and [Pegasus Mail](#).

Button Purpose: To launch the FTP client program that is configured on your system

Description: Press this button once you have looked up a site that possibly contains a file you are after. The File Transfer Protocol client will be launched as well as the TCP/IP manager if so desired.

A common FTP client is [WS_FTP](#).

Button Purpose: To launch the FSP client

Description: FSP is actually a rarely used file transfer system but I have used it somewhat in the past so I decided to include it in Surfer Central. Pressing this button launches the FSP client program as well as the TCP/IP manager if desired.

Common FSP clients are WINFSP and FSP4WIN.

Button Purpose: Launch the Gopher client program

Description: Gopher is a hierarchical system of information retrieval first launched by The University of Minnesota. It's use is dwindling at the present time due to the advent of the World Wide Web. However, many gopher sites are still in existence. To launch the Gopher client program, as well as the TCP/IP manager if desired, press this button.

A common gopher client is [WS_GOPHER](#).

Button Purpose: To launch the Archie search tool

Description: Archie is a useful tool on the Internet allowing you to search thousands of FTP sites for a particular string. It is perfect if you are searching for a particular file and don't know where to look. Press this toolbar button to launch the archie tool, as well as the TCP/IP manager if desired.

A common archie client program is [WS_ARCHIE](#).

Button Purpose: To launch the Telnet or rlogin tool configured on your system

Description: Many internet users have accounts on more than one system - sometimes a second or third account may lie halfway across the world!! To get to these 'extra' accounts, a Telnet tool is used which is accessible via this button.

A common telnet program is EWAN.

Button Purpose: To launch a previously configured program of your choice

Description: You may configure this button to launch any program of your choosing. For example, if you like to take notes while on an archie site, you may want to launch NotePad via this button.

Good uses for this button are NotePad (for taking notes) or File Manager (for manipulating your retrieved files). But feel free to use this button however you want!!

The Sites Toolbar

The sites toolbar is located at the bottom of the main window and allows the user to navigate between the various site types. Clicking on a site type will change the current focus of the database to that site type.

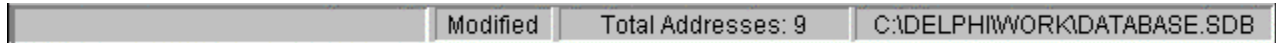
The diagram below is only a sample of what the sites toolbar may look like. As of v1.20 of Surfer Central, site types are now user-definable!!! You may place any text or graphic on a button! For details, please see [User-Definable Site Types](#).



Note: *only one site type (toolbar button) can be active (in a pressed state) at any given time.*

The Status Bar

The status bar contains 3 areas: the progress bar, the number of sites indicator, and the current file indicator.



progress bar: indicates the progress of loading a file or searching for a text string.

modified indicator: is set to "Modified" if the database has been changed since the last save. This indicator is blank if no save is required.

number of sites indicator: indicates the total number of sites in the current database.

current file indicator: indicates the name of the sites database being edited.

Starting a New Sites Database

To begin a new sites database, choose *New* from the *File* menu.

If you are prompted to save the existing database and wish to do so, select *Yes* and follow the instructions in Saving the Current Sites Database. Otherwise, select *No* and continue.

Loading an Existing Sites Database

If a database exists on disk that you wish to retrieve, you may do so by selecting **Open** from the **File** menu.

If you are prompted to save the existing database and wish to do so, select **Yes** and follow the instructions in [Saving the Current Sites Database](#). Otherwise, select **No** and continue.

Once the open dialog box appears, change to the appropriate directory that contains your site database file. You can change directories by double-clicking the left mouse button on the appropriate directory in the box containing the directory tree.

After navigating to the correct directory, click on the file you wish to load and press the **Ok** button.

To abort the *Open* procedure and return to the current database, select the **Cancel** button.

If the database file has been previously encrypted using a password you will need to enter the correct password in the dialog box that appears. Enter the password and press **Ok**. If the password is correct the file will properly load, otherwise you will receive an error message.

The evaluation version of Surfer Central only allows you to load databases consisting of 50 sites or less.

Saving the Current Sites Database

If this is your first time saving a new database:

- Select **Save As** from the **File** menu
- Select a directory for the file to reside by double clicking on the branches in the directory tree (right side of save dialog box)
- Choose a filename for the database in the edit box in the top-left corner of the dialog
- Press *Ok*.

If you would like to save the database using the same name as used previously:

- Select **Save** from the **File** menu
- The previous version of the file will have been overwritten

If you have saved your database before but would now like to use a different name:

- Select **Save As** from the **File** menu
- Follow the instructions in *saving a new database* above

For details on encrypting the database using a password, please see the section [Encrypting the Current Sites Database](#)

Importing Files

As of v1.20 of Surfer Central, you can import Netscape bookmark files and Mosaic hotlist files and choose to which category each site belongs!!!

To import a Netscape bookmark file into Surfer Central:

- Select **Import** from the **File** menu followed by the **Netscape** pop-up menu item
- A dialog box will appear prompting you for the name of the bookmark file. Enter the name of the file in the edit box or select the file with the mouse. Note that bookmark files usually end with the extension .HTM since these files are actually HTML documents.
- Now that you have chosen the file to be imported, proceed to Choosing Site Categories for Imported Sites

To import a Mosaic hotlist file into Surfer Central:

- Select **Import** from the **File** menu followed by the **Mosaic** pop-up menu item
- A dialog box will appear prompting you for the name of the hotlist file. Enter the name of the file in the edit box or select the file with the mouse.
- Now that you have chosen the file to be imported, proceed to Choosing Site Categories for Imported Sites

Hyper-Text Mark-up Language:

The 'programming language' that is interpreted by a web browser (such as Netscape or Mosaic) to produce all those wonderful web pages. To see an example of an HTML document using Netscape, connect to your favorite site and choose the **View** menu followed by the **Source** menu item.

Choosing Site Categories for Imported Sites

Once the file to be imported has been read by Surfer Central, you will be presented with this dialog box:

{ewc OSHTOOLS.DLL, OlsonSoftEWBitmap, IMPRTCAT.BMP}

The listbox contains the sites that were read from the bookmark or hotlist file. To import a all or selected sites from this list:

- Select a site to be imported by clicking the primary mouse button on that site. To select a range of sites, click the primary button on the first site, hold down the shift key, and click the primary button on the last site in the range. To select multiple, non-contiguous (separate) sites, hold down the Ctrl key and select a group of sites by clicking on them with the primary mouse button.
- Once you have selected a set of sites to be imported, choose a category to which these sites should belong by clicking on the 'down arrow' of the combobox at the right side of the dialog box. Choose a category from the list that appears by clicking the primary mouse button on the desired category.
- Next, press the button labelled 'Import Selected Sites'. The sites that you have selected will disappear from the listbox and be moved to the Surfer Central database.
- When you are finished importing sites, press the button labelled 'Done' to complete the procedure.

Hint: If you would like to import all of the sites in the bookmark or hotlist file to the same category, press the button labelled 'Select All' to select all sites in the listbox with one mouse click. Alternatively, if you have several sites selected but would like to start over in your selection process, you may press the button labelled 'Select None' to deselect all sites.

Note: If the columns in the sites listbox appear distorted after importing a file, you may perform some minor changes to the sites to correct the look of the list. Please see [Common Problems - Main Window](#) for details.

Encrypting the Current Sites Database

If you have some addresses that you would rather keep secret you may choose to encrypt the database file to prevent prying eyes from sneaking a peek. Encryption makes the database file unreadable to a person who does not know the password that was originally used to scramble the file. Encrypting a database in Surfer Central is a fairly straightforward process:

- First, select the **Password** menu item from the **File** menu. This action brings up a dialog box containing two edit boxes. Type in your password into *both* boxes. The second edit box is simply used to verify the correct password.
- After entering the passwords, press the *Ok* button. If the passwords match the dialog box will close. Otherwise, enter the passwords again *ensuring that the same password is present in both edit boxes*.
- Now that the program knows the password you want to use, simply save the file using the usual procedure. The database will be automatically encrypted using your password.
- To retrieve your file later, simply open the database in the normal way and when prompted for a password, enter the password you used to originally save the database. If the correct password is entered, the database will appear and be ready for use.

WARNING: *The encryption process used for Surf Central is fairly simplistic and can be cracked by any experienced and knowledgeable hacker/cracker. If the data being stored in the database is extremely personal, please consider using another encryption scheme (such as DES or PGP) on top of the Surf Central method for added security.*

This feature is only available in the registered version of Surfer Central.

Printing the Sites Database

Unfortunately, the printing feature is *not available* in version 1.1 (and earlier) of Surfer Central. There is, however, a convenient workaround for printing your database. When you are ready to print your addresses, select **Generate Site List** from the **Tools** menu. This has the effect of creating a text file containing all of your sites in an easily readable manner. After generating the list, simply print it using the DOS print command or through File Manager.

For further info, please see [Generating a List of Sites](#).

Selecting a Site Type

Before entering or viewing a site in the database, you should first select the appropriate site type. 'Site Types' consist of WWW, E-Mail, FTP, FSP, Gopher, Archie and Telnet addresses. To select a site type, either:

- (a) press the appropriate button on the The Sites Toolbar
or select the site type from the **Sites** menu

Once a site type has been selected the Sites Listbox will be updated with the current sites for that site type and category and the Site Entry Area will reflect the information from the first address for that site type and category. To change to another site type and category simply repeat the procedure above.

User-Definable Site Types

Don't have any use for the FSP site type in your database? Change it to something else!!!

As of v1.20 of Surfer Central, you can define your own site types!

To change the name and graphic of a particular site type, either:

- select **Change Site Type Names** from the **Options** menu; or
- press the secondary mouse button (usually the right button) anywhere on the sites toolbar.
Next, select **Change Site Type Names** from the pop-up menu that appears.

You will be presented with the following dialog box:

{ewc OSHTOOLS.DLL, OlsonSoftEWBitmap, CHNGSITE.BMP}

First, select the type of site to be changed by clicking the primary mouse button on one of the tabs at the bottom of the dialog box.

To change the name of the site type, click the mouse (or tab into) the edit box adjacent to the 'Site Type Name' label. Type in a new name for the site type.

To change the graphic associated with the selected site type, type in the filename of the graphic or press the button labelled 'Browse' to graphically select the filename via a browse dialog box.

Once you have chosen a name and graphic for the site type, the button at the top of the dialog box will reflect your changes. This button serves no purpose other than previewing the corresponding site type button.

When you have completed editing the site type names and graphics, press the button labelled 'Ok' to exit the dialog box.

Note: The recommended size for the button graphic is 16 x 16. Choosing a graphics that is larger or smaller than this size will have unpredictable effects.

Entering a New Site

Before entering information for a new site, you should select a site type and a category. Now the information for the new site is ready to be entered into the database. Before the entire procedure is given, please be aware that *the meanings of the site fields in the Site Entry Area vary according to the currently selected site type*. All fields need not be used and for the most part, the meanings of these fields is determined by you, the user. Also, to change the focus from site field to site field, simply click the mouse within the desired edit box and begin typing.

The example of entering a new FTP site is provided below, but this procedure is fairly generic to the other site types.

To enter a new address into the database:

- Select a site type and category
- Press the *Clear* button if information exists in the edit boxes
- Click in the edit box corresponding to the site name and enter a descriptive name for the site (e.g. Windows Shareware Site)
- Enter the hostname or URL (e.g. ftp.cica.indiana.edu)
- Enter an IP address (e.g. 128.134.2.12)
- Enter a login name (e.g. anonymous)
- Enter a password (e.g. your e-mail address)
- Enter a description for this site (e.g. Good site for Windows programs)
- Choose a rating using the slider (e.g. scroll bar completely to the right indicates an excellent site)
- Choose a port number (e.g. 21 for FTP sites)
- Enter any information you like into the user fields

When information entry is complete, simply press the *Insert* button to enter the site into the database. Once the site has been entered in to the database, the site entry box will be cleared in preparation for your next site entry.

The same process applies to other site types

Note: For the WWW site type, there is an extra group of radio button in the site entry area. These radio buttons allow you to choose the URL prefix for the site (such as http://, ftp://, etc.). By selecting a particular prefix, the prefix displayed for the site in the URL edit box is updated.

Note: For the FTP site type, the *Login* and *Password* fields may be setup to contain a default value for new sites. For details, see Setting Default Field Strings

The evaluation version of Surfer Central only allows insertion of up to 50 sites in the database.

Updating an Existing Site

Updating a site in the database is a similar process to adding a new one - just change the desired site fields in the Site Entry Area and press the *Update* button. There is one important rule that must be followed, however, when updating a site:

--> **You cannot update the the site name, host name, or IP address of a site.** To change one of these fields you must delete the site and reenter it. All other fields are updatable.

Note: A site may only be updated when the *Update* button is enabled.

Note: If you have made changes to a site and attempt to change site types without updating (or inserting) the information to the database a warning dialog box will appear asking if you would like to discard the changes or not. Answer *Yes* to discard the changes and change the site type and *No* to return to where you left off.

Deleting a Site

To *permanently* delete a site(s) from the database, select the site(s) to be deleted in the sites listbox by clicking on it with the primary mouse button. To select multiple sites for deletion, hold down the control key and press the primary mouse button on additional sites.

Now, click the secondary mouse button on the site to bring up the sites pop-up menu. Select **Delete Site Object** from the pop-up menu.

Hint: A shortcut for deleting a site is to click the primary mouse button on the site(s) to be deleted and press the key marked 'Delete'.

Cutting and Pasting Sites

Cutting Sites:

To Cut a site object(s) from the database, select the site(s) to be cut in the sites listbox by clicking on it with the left mouse button. To select multiple sites for cutting, hold down the control key and press the left mouse button on additional sites.

Now, click the right mouse button on the site to bring up the sites pop-up menu. Select **Cut** from the pop-up menu.

Pasting Sites:

Change to the category in which you would like to paste the site(s).

Press the right mouse button anywhere in the sites listbox to bring up the sites pop-up menu.

Select **Paste** from the pop-up menu.

Notes:

- **You can only paste once! You must perform another cut operation in order to paste again.**
- **Pasting of addresses between site types is not allowed. Pasting between site categories is allowed.**

Hint: The keyboard shortcuts for cutting and pasting sites correspond to the usual Windows shortcuts (i.e. Shift+Delete for cutting; Shift+Insert for pasting.

Hint: You can select multiple sites for cutting by holding down the Ctrl key and clicking the primary mouse button on each site to be cut. To select a range of sites, click on the first site in the range, hold down the shift key, and click on the last site in the range.

Cutting, Copying, and Pasting Text

The **Cut**, **Copy**, and **Paste** commands in the **Edit** menu refer to operations that may be performed on text - *not* on the sites themselves. For information on cutting and pasting sites, please refer to [Cutting and Pasting Sites](#).

To cut or copy text in an edit box, select the text with the left mouse button (pressing and hold down while you move the mouse over the text) and select **Cut** or **Copy** from the **Edit** menu (or select the *Cut* or *Copy* toolbar button).

To paste text into an edit box, select the edit box to which the text will be transferred (by left-clicking on it) and choose **Paste** from the **Edit** menu (or select the *Paste* toolbar button).

Copying and Pasting Addresses to Client Programs

Surfer Central contains a neat feature that allows you to easily copy and paste addresses between programs. The long way to perform a copy and paste between, say, your FTP client and Surfer Central would be to click on the desired site in the sites listbox, check to see what field is provided that site (IP address or hostname), select the text in the appropriate edit box, and select **Copy** from the **Edit** menu.

The quick way to do the same action is to click the secondary mouse button on the desired site and the sites listbox to bring up the sites listbox pop-up menu, and choose one of the following actions:

- Copy Site Address: this will copy the hostname of the site (if it exists in the database) or alternatively the IP address to the clipboard.
- Copy Site Address As URL: this will copy the hostname of the site (if it exists in the database) or alternatively the IP address to the clipboard in URL format. For example, if you click on the FTP site with hostname ftp.cica.indiana.edu, selecting this command will copy ftp://ftp.cica.indiana.edu to the clipboard

Once your address has been copied, simply activate the desired application and paste the address.

Dealing with Categories

Site Categories are used to store your sites in a more manageable fashion. You may create up to **16** categories in which your addresses may be stored. For example, you may have a set of FTP and WWW addresses relating to computer games. Thus, you may want to name a category *Games* to store these sites. You may also want to make one for shareware, business, and whatever else you heart desires!!!

Changing Category Names

The default category names provided with Surfer Central are *Group 1*, *Group 2*, ..., *Group 16*. Clearly, these names are not very descriptive. You should probably start a new database by altering the names of these categories. First, change to the category you would like to change by clicking the primary mouse button on the tab corresponding to that category. For example, to change to *Group 2* you would click on the *Group 2* tab. Next, click on the secondary mouse button *anywhere within the sites listbox*. This action will bring up the sites listbox pop-up menu. From this menu, select Change Category Name. Type in the new category name and press *Ok*. Voila! You have changed the name of the category!!!

You may repeat this procedure for each category tab. Having meaningful categories will go a long way in organizing your mountain of Internet addresses.

Changing the Order of the Category Tabs

You may also want to have the most frequently used categories situated at the far left of the tabset. For details on this process, please see Changing the Order of Site Categories.

Moving Sites Between Categories

There are a couple different ways to move sites between categories. The simplest way is drag & drop!! Simply select the sites you would like to move to a different category using the primary mouse button in the sites listbox and drag them to the desired category tab. Once you are over the tab, drop them. The sites will disappear from the sites listbox and reappear when you change to the category that you dropped them on.

Alternatively, see Cutting and Pasting Sites to cut and paste sites between categories.

Hint: If one of your tabs is not visible on the screen, click on the one of the double-arrows to the right of the category tabset. This will effectively scroll the tabset such that hidden tabs are now visible.

Displaying a Summary of Categories

As of v1.20 of Surfer Cental you are now allowed to split your sites into **32** categories in addition to the 7 sites types. The categories are represented by the tabs on the bottom of the sites listbox. Since 32 categories is a fairly large number, it is now possible to display a summary of all the categories in a dialog box to make changing categories easier!!

To view the category summary dialog box, choose **Category Summary** from **Sites** menu. Alternatively, press the secondary mouse button on the sites listbox to bring up the The Sites Listbox Pop-Up Menu and choose **Category Summary** from that menu.

A dialog box will appear listing all of the categories in your current database. You may change categories simply by clicking the primary mouse button on a category in the list. The appropriate category tab under the sites listbox will then reflect the category change.

To close the category summary dialog box, click the secondary mouse button anywhere in the dialog to bring up the category summary pop-up menu. Next, click on the menu item labelled **Close**. Also, to have the category summary dialog box remain on top of all other windows, choose **On Top** from that menu.

As with all other destop windows in Surfer Central, the size and position of the category summary dialog box is saved when you exit the program. Next time you load Surfer Central, the dialog will appear in the exact same spot you left it!!

Searching for Text Strings

To search for a text string within the address database, select **Find Site** from the **Edit** menu. The following dialog box will appear:

{ewc OSHTOOLS.DLL, OlsonSoftEWBitmap, FINDDLG.BMP}

The steps required to search for a text string are as follows:

- Type a string in the *Text to Find* edit box
- Select the types of sites that should be searched. Selecting a particular site type has the effect of speeding up the search since only a specific part of the database is examined. If you are unsure as to what type of site the text string belongs, select *All*.
- Now choose the type of fields to be searched. Selecting *Site Name and Address ONLY* speeds up the search since only those two fields will be searched. If you want to search all fields select *All Fields*. Start the search by pressing the *Find* button.

If the text string is found within the database, the current site type of the database will be changed to match the found site and that site will be selected in the sites listbox. If the text is not found, a dialog box will appear telling you so.

Note: If you have previously performed a search and wish to search for the same text again, press the *Find Next* button

Hint: To quickly bring up the Find dialog box, press the **F2** key.

Displaying a Summary of All Sites

It is often handy to see a summary of all the addresses in the database on one page. By doing so you can do a quick scan of all your addresses and possibly quickly skip between sites via this summary.

Surfer Central allows you to do just that. Selecting **Site Summary** from the **Sites** menu brings up a dialog box containing the names of all sites currently stored in the database. By clicking on any one particular site in this list, you can bring up the details of the site in the sites listbox and site entry area. Here is a screenshot of the site summary dialog box containing some of my favorite sites:

{ewc OSHTOOLS.DLL, OlsonSoftEWBitmap, SITESUMM.BMP}

You may also view a site summary for a particular site type by selecting the appropriate tab below the listbox. Selecting the WWW tab will display only WWW site names, selecting FTP will display only FTP addresses, and so on. Select the 'All' tab to view a global list of your database.

Ordering the Sites

An excellent use of this summary list is to order your sites such that the most frequently accessed addresses appear at the top of the list. Thus, in a large database, you can simply open the site summary list and choose your favorite site from near the top of the list. This could save quite a few mouse clicks!!

When you open the site summary list for the first time in a database, the ordering of the addresses may not be to your liking. It is easy to change this by pressing and holding the primary mouse button on a particular site and dragging it to its new location. You may change the order of as many sites as you desire. When you save the database, Surfer Central also saves the global position of the sites in the site summary list so next time you load the database, the ordering of the addresses is preserved.

Sorting the Sites

To sort the site summary list, press the primary mouse button on the "Sort" checkbox. This action will have the effect of keeping the listbox contents sorted. *Warning: the positions of the sites will be lost if you have previously ordered them.*

Stay on Top

If you would like the site summary dialog box to remain on top of the Surfer Central main window, press the primary mouse button on the checkbox labelled "On Top".

Hint: If you are searching for a site but have no idea what text string to search for, bring up the site summary box. Simply scroll down the list of site names until you find the one you want. Clicking on the site in the site summary dialog box is the easiest method of both finding sites and selecting frequently used sites.

Changing Site Field Labels

The names of the site fields in the site entry area are fully customizable. Since each person has different tastes, Surfer Central allows you to change the name of the site fields as desired. For example, for the E-Mail site type, instead of having a field named *User Field #1*, you may want to change this to *Company Name*.

Each site type in the database can have its own site labels, but labels between site types are mutually exclusive. This implies that if you change the name of the *User Field #1* field in the E-Mail site type, this field will still be called *User Field #1* when you change to the FTP site type. This allows for full customizability between site types!!!

To Change a Site Field Label:

- Click the secondary mouse button on the label to be changed. This will bring up the labels pop-up menu.
- Enter the new name for the label in the edit box. Note that site labels look a little nicer if you follow them with a colon ':'.
• Press *Ok*

Site field labels are specific to each database file. Thus, if you start a new database and wish to keep the same field names, you will have to reenter them (or load the old database and delete all of the sites from it).

Hiding and Displaying Fields

Surfer Central provides the capability for hiding and displaying the various fields for each site type. Since all fields may not be of use to any particular user, the unused fields may be hidden from view to produce a less cluttered representation of each site. For example, *User Field #1* and *User Field #2* may not be of use for an archie site. The text below illustrates how to hide and display fields in the site entry area.

Hiding Fields

Surfer Central is configured in such a way that all fields for a particular site type are displayed in the site entry area. However, all fields for any one site type may not be of use. To hide a field label and its corresponding edit box from view, select **Hide Field** from the labels pop-up menu.

Displaying Fields

To redisplay a field that has been previously hidden from view for a particular site type, select **Display Fields** from the **Options** menu. This brings up the following dialog box:

{ewc OSHTOOLS.DLL, OlsonSoftEWBitmap, DISPFLDS.BMP}

To indicate which fields are to be displayed and which fields are to be hidden select the desired site type from the tabs at the bottom of the listbox. The field names used for that site type will be shown as check boxes. A check box containing an 'x' indicates that that field is currently displayed in the site entry area, while the absence of an 'x' indicates that that field is hidden. You may alter the state of the field (hidden/displayed) by selecting the appropriate check box. Note that fields that do not apply to the selected site type have their check boxes disabled and cannot be changed. When complete, simply press *Ok* and the site entry area will reflect the changes.

Note: The state of all site fields is saved each time you save your database file. Thus, if you chose to hide the description field for WWW sites, this field will remain hidden the next time the database is loaded.

Hint: When generating a site list, if there are certain fields that you would like to omit from the list, hide these fields before generation.

In the context of the site entry area, the word *field* refers to a site label and its corresponding edit box (i.e. the field name and field contents).

Generating a List of Sites

There may often be times when you would like to have a list of addresses by your side but Surfer Central is nowhere to be found (for example you are logged into your UNIX shell account which is incapable of running Surfer Central). Or, perhaps you would like to share your list of sites via e-mail with users who do not yet have a copy of Surfer Central (make sure you recommend it!!). Fortunately, you may generate an ASCII text file containing a list of your sites for everyone to read.

To generate a well formatted site list, choose **Generate Site List** from the **Tools** menu. The following dialog box will appear:

{ewc OSHTOOLS.DLL, OlsonSoftEWBitmap, GENLIST.BMP}

First, choose the site types you wish to include in the list to be generated. Any site types that are checked (with an 'x') in the leftmost group of check boxes will be included in the final list. If you only want to create a list of e-mail addresses, for example, make sure only the E-Mail site type has a check beside it. To enable/disable checks, click the primary mouse button the check box.

There are several options available for site list generation:

- **Use address ONLY:** check this option if you would like to generate a list containing only addresses. This option is useful if you would like to generate a very simple mailing list (especially for e-mail addresses) to import into another program
- **Use defined headers:** If you would like to have user defined headers included in the generated list, choose this option. If you select this option the site headers currently appearing in the site header dialog box will appear on the final generated list.
- **Include addresses containing keyword:** This option is very handy if you would like to generate a list relating to a specific topic. For example, if you have FTP, E-Mail, and WWW sites in your database relating to games, choose this option with a keyword of 'games' for list generation. Only those addresses containing the word 'games' in any field will be included in the list.

Now select a filename for your generated list. Any standard DOS compatible filename will do. If you would like to find a particular directory on your disk, click the *Browse* button to graphically navigate the drive.

Finally, press the *Generate* button to generate the site list. You may now pass this list on to your friends or print it out via the standard DOS **print** command.

Hint: When generating a site list, if there are certain fields that you would like to omit from the list, hide these fields before generation. See Hiding and Displaying Fields for more information.

Note: The '*override inclusion fields*' checkbox in the above dialog is reserved for future versions of Surfer Central. It serves no purpose in this version.

A *Site Header* is a series of lines of text that appear before a list of sites for a particular site type. Instead of having a boring "WWW" appear prior to the actual site addresses themselves in the generated list, you may want to create an ASCII representation of WWW in 3-D, perhaps surrounded by some sort of box. Site headers have the sole purpose of making your generated site lists a little prettier.

Using the Winsock Tools

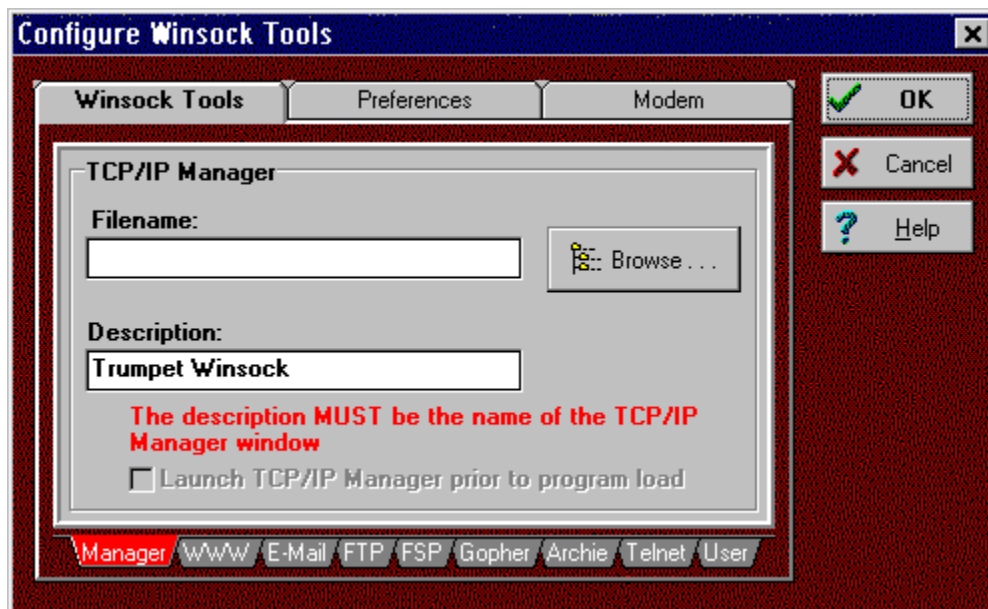

In addition to managing and organizing your Internet addresses, Surfer Central is also a capable command shell for all of your Winsock-related applications. A handy toolbar is visible on the left side of the screen which allows you to launch any client program that you have previously configured.

Configuring the Winsock Toolbar

The first time you invoke Surfer Central you will need to configure the Winsock toolbar such that the icons for your client programs are visible as toolbar buttons. The configuration process is completed by selecting **Configure Winsock Tools** from the **Tools** menu. This action brings up the following dialog box:

To get information on the Preferences tab and the Modem tab, click the appropriate tab on the screenshot given below.



There is a tab at the bottom of the dialog box for each site type as well as a TCP/IP Manager tab. You should configure all tools that you use on a regular basis.

The meanings of the dialog box fields are as follows:

- **Filename:** is the filename of the Winsock tool corresponding to the currently selected tab. This is the file that will be launched when you press the appropriate toolbar button. In the example above, the program WS_FTP32 will be launched when the FTP button is depressed. To graphically browse the directory structure and select a file click the *Browse* button
- **Description:** You may place any text here that you wish. If you do not use an FTP client and want to use the FTP button, for example, to launch another program, you may change the description to match the program to be launched
- **Launch TCP/IP Manager prior to program load:** When this box is checked, pressing any toolbar button (except the TCP/IP Manager button) will first load the TCP/IP Manager followed by the requested program. For a program that does not require the TCP/IP Manager to be loaded, make sure that this box is unchecked

Launching the Winsock Tools

To launch (load) a program that you have configured to occupy the Winsock toolbar, simply press the appropriate button on the toolbar with the primary mouse button. If the *Load TCP/IP Manager prior to program load* box is checked, the TCP/IP Manager will load followed by the program you selected.

If you attempt to load a Winsock tool and receive an error such as Error Code: 2, check here for a list of codes if it is not immediately obvious what the error is.

List of Error Codes

Hint: if one of your Winsock client programs supports command-line arguments (Netscape does), then you may want to load the client and have it automatically open a particular site. To do this, select the site in the sites listbox and drag it over to the appropriate Winsock button. This one mouse action will load the TCP/IP Manager (if required), load the Winsock program, and open the site.

Automatically Loading URLs into Netscape

Here are the various error codes (straight from the Windows SDK help):

Value	Meaning
-------	---------

0	System was out of memory, executable file was corrupt
2	File was not found.
3	Path was not found.
5	Attempt was made to dynamically link to a task
6	Library required separate data segments for each task.
8	There was insufficient memory to start the application.
10	Windows version was incorrect.
11	Executable file was invalid. Not a Windows application or error in the .EXE

Winsock Tool Preferences

{ewc OSHTOOLS.DLL, OlsonSoftEWBitmap, CFGWINS2.BMP}

There are several available options for the determining the behaviour of the Winsock tools:

- **Minimize Surfer Central when Winsock tool loaded:** Check this option if you want Surfer Central to be iconified whenever a Winsock tool is loaded.
- **Minimize TCP/IP Manager when loaded:** Enable this option if you would like TCP/IP Manager iconified when it is loaded. It is generally a good idea to have this box checked if you have Trumpet Winsock set up to auto login. *For this to occur properly, you must have the description field of the TCP/IP Manager set **exactly** to the name of the TCP/IP Manager window. For example, with Trumpet Winsock, the description field **must** be 'Trumpet Winsock' (without the quotes).*
- **Unload TCP/IP Manager on Surfer Central exit:** Check this box to unload (close) TCP/IP Manager when you close Surfer Central. *For this to occur properly, you must have the description field of the TCP/IP Manager set **exactly** to the name of the TCP/IP Manager window. For example, with Trumpet Winsock, the description field **must** be 'Trumpet Winsock' (without the quotes).*

The Modem Status Window

{ewc OSHTOOLS.DLL, OlsonSoftEWBitmap, CFGWINS3.BMP}

The modem status window displays the various LEDs present on most external modems. These LEDs are often handy in determining what is happening during a connection. However, there are many users with internal modems that do not have access to a tool that indicates connection state. The modem status window now gives you all the benefits that the external modem users have!!!

There are several available options associated with the modem status indicator:

- **Show modem status window:** Check this box to display the modem status indicator window. To close the status window, either (a) click the secondary mouse button on the modem status window and select 'Close' from the pop-up menu; (b) double-click the primary mouse button in the upper left corner of the window; or (c) uncheck the checkbox in the configure winsock tools dialog box as shown above.
- **Modem status window always on top:** To keep the modem status window permanently on top of the Surfer Central window, check the corresponding box as shown in the screenshot above.
- **COM Port:** Select the COM port that your modem is connected to so that the modem status window knows which port to monitor for changes.

The modem status window is displayed below:

The LEDs are represented as rectangles in the above screenshot. For a detailed description of each of the LEDs, please see your modem manual. On a high level, the LEDs are:

- **RING:** turned on (or flashes) when someone is ringing your line.
- **CTS:** the modem is initialized and in a state where it ready to receive data (Clear to Send)
- **DSR:** the modem is in a state where it is ready to connect
- **DCD:** when the modem is connected to another modem, this light will be on (Data Carrier Detect)
- **RTS:** the modem is ready to send data to the remote end. This line is a request to send that data.
- **DTR:** data terminal ready indicator
- **RxD:** when this LED is on, the modem is *receiving* data *from* the remote end.
- **TxD:** when this LED is on, the modem is *transmitting* data *to* the remote end.

Automatically Loading URLs into Netscape

Note: The following discussion assumes that you are using Netscape Navigator as your WWW browser. If you do not have Netscape configured, you cannot automatically load a URL into your browser.

One of the great features of Surfer Central is that it can transparently communicate with Netscape Navigator and have it automatically load a URL from within Surfer Central!!!

The first time you double-click the primary mouse button in the sites listbox or drag and drop a site to the Netscape Winsock toolbar button (and Netscape is *not* running), Surfer Central will launch Netscape and connect you to the URL. The *next time* you double-click or drag and drop, obviously Netscape need not be loaded since it's already running. Surfer Central can figure this out on its own and simply tell Netscape to load the site!!! Easy!

So, to summarize how you can get Surfer Central to tell Netscape that a URL should be loaded:

- double-click the site you wish to have Netscape load
- click on the desired site in the sites listbox and drag it to the Netscape Winsock toolbar button
- click on the desired site in the sites listbox to select it. Now click the secondary mouse button to open the sites listbox pop-up menu. Select **Open URL** from the menu

Grabbing URLs from Netscape

Note: The following discussion assumes that you are using Netscape Navigator as your WWW browser. If you do not have Netscape configured, you cannot grab a URL from your browser.

Surfer Central contains a great time saver for entering new sites into the database when you are surfing the net using Netscape Navigator.

Suppose you are surfing along and come across a site that you would like to add to your Surfer Central address database (assuming Surfer Central is already running and the URL you wish to add is loaded in Netscape). Just flip back to Surfer Central, press the secondary mouse button on the sites listbox to bring up the sites listbox pop-up menu. Now select **Grab URL** from the menu.

What just happened? Well, Surfer Central asked Netscape what site it was currently connected to and waited for the response. Once Netscape told Surfer Central what the URL to that site was, Surfer Central then placed that information in the site name and URL edit boxes. Cool! Now all you have to do is add any other information that you desire and press the Insert button.!!

Note: You must have Netscape running and a valid URL loaded for this feature to work correctly.

Sizing the Main Window

Since Surfer Central appears differently in various video modes that Windows accommodates it would be useful to have the capability of saving the position of the main window such that upon every invocation of the program, the window is the same size. Surfer Central gives you this capability by automatically saving the size and position of the main window every time you exit the program. These values are saved to the file SURFRCEN.INI. Therefore, the next time you run the program, the main window will appear in the exact place that you left it. Handy!!

Setting Site Headers

Site headers are used by the site list generation routines to customize the site lists and ease the distinction between various site types in a large list. These headers are simply lines of ASCII text that are used to separate the various sections of a generated site list.

To customize the various headers for the list (if you choose to use site headers during site list generation), select **Site Headers** from the **Options** menu. This selection brings up the following dialog box:

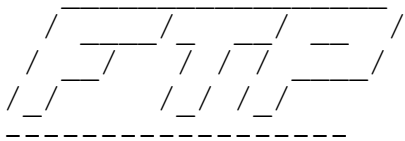

You may customize the headers for all site types plus add a title header which will be placed at the top of the site list. Use your imagination! Be creative! You can make some interesting looking lists. Click [here](#) to see an example of a site header used for FTP sites.

When you are done entering site headers, press the *Ok* button.

Note: Site headers are saved to the SURFRCEN.INI file and are, thus, common to all databases. Therefore, if you change the site header while editing a particular database the same change will appear in *all* site lists generated - even from different database files.

Changing Fonts and Colors

Many of the fonts and colors within the program are customizable to suit each individual user's tastes.

The dialog boxes used to change fonts and colors are common to most Windows applications. Therefore, a detailed description on their use will not be provided here. Given below is a brief summary of how to go about changing fonts and colors for various parts of the main window.

Changing the listbox fonts and colors:

To change either the font or color of the sites listbox click the secondary mouse button on the listbox. This action will bring up the sites listbox pop-up menu. Next, choose either the **Listbox Color** menu option or the **Listbox Font** menu option. Make your changes and then save the database.

Changing the site entry area fonts and colors:

To change the colors and fonts of the site field labels move the mouse over the desired field and press the secondary mouse button to bring up the labels pop-up menu. Select **Change Font** or **Change Color** to change just that label, or **Change Font (ALL)** or **Change Color (ALL)** to change the font or color for *all* site field labels.

Note: The fonts and colors currently on the screen are unique to each database. When you make a change to a font or color you *must save the current database* for the changes to be in effect next time you edit the database.

Hint: You could have a different listbox color for each address database in your collection. For example, you may want to have a database for the office colored **purple** and a database for home colored **cyan**.

Getting Help

Well, you are currently reading this help file so you must have some idea as to how to get help, right???

Tool Tips: You can determine the function of particular button or other control by moving the mouse over it and waiting a couple seconds. A small box with a description of the control will appear. These tips are commonly called balloon help.

Command Description Label: In addition to the tool tips, a more comprehensive description of a control appear in the toolbar panel on the right side of the window when you move the mouse over a control

This Help File: provides the most comprehensive help on any part of the program

Hint: Help in Surfer Central is generally context sensitive. Selecting an item on the screen about which help is desired and pressing the **F1** key invokes this help file with the current topic corresponding to the item on the screen that was selected. Help is also always available by pressing the *Help* button when it is visible (e.g. in the Register dialog box).

Quitting the Program

To exit Surfer Central, simply click on the **File** menu and choose **Exit**. If the database has been modified since the last save you will be prompted to save it. Also, the current state of Surfer Central is saved including the size and location of the main window. Thus, the next time the program is invoked, the main window will appear in the same position and with the same size.

Saving the State of the Desktop

The state of the desktop is saved whenever you exit Surfer Central. By *state of the desktop*, it is implied that the sizes and positions of all windows and dialog boxes related to Surfer Central are saved.

Therefore, if you place all the windows (e.g. Category summary dialog, modem status window, site summary window, main window) where you want them, the size and position will be restored the next time you load Surfer Central!!!

Changing the Order of Site Categories

As an everyday user of Surfer Central, you will probably want to have the tabs representing the categories that are most frequently used at the beginning of the category tabset. To change the order of the tabs, simply left-click on the tab that you would like to move and drag it to its new position. The dragged tab will be inserted *before* the tab onto which you dropped it.

Moving Sites Between Categories

To quickly move a site or group of sites between categories, first select the desired sites in the sites listbox using the primary mouse button. Now click and hold down the primary mouse button on one of the selected sites. Drag the sites to the desired category tab and drop them by releasing the mouse button. The sites will disappear from the sites listbox and reappear when you change to the category onto which you just dropped the sites.

Hint: You can select multiple sites in the sites listbox by holding down either the *Shift* key or the *Ctrl* key while clicking on sites using the primary mouse button. Holding down Shift will select a range of sites, and holding down Ctrl will select individual, non-contiguous sites. Try it!

Quickly Connecting to Sites

The absolute quickest and easiest way to connect to a site of interest is to **double-click** (primary mouse button) the appropriate site in the sites listbox. This action has the effect of checking to see if the TCP/IP Manager has been (or should be) loaded, loading it if necessary, opening the client application corresponding to the site type of the site you double-clicked, and passing the address of that site as a command-line parameter to the client application.

Note: If your client application does not support command-line parameters (i.e. when the application is launched you can specify the site to directly connect to directly on the command-line) then you *will not* be directly connected to the requested site.

Hint: Even if you are not directly connected once the client application is launched, there is still a quick method of connecting. Whenever you double-click on a site the address of that site is copied to the clipboard as well. Simply open the dialog in your client that allows you to connect to a site and paste the address into the application (usually using *Shift+Insert*).

Drag and Drop from the Sites Listbox

To quickly launch a Winsock client program and have it automatically open a site which exists in the database (provided the client supports command-line arguments), click on the desired site in The Sites Listbox and drag it to the appropriate winsock toolbar button. This process will automatically launch the requested Winsock tool and open the site.

Note: If your client application does not support command-line parameters (i.e. when the application is launched you can specify the site to directly connect to directly on the command-line) then you *will not* be directly connected to the requested site (unless you are using Netscape Navigator - please see Automatically Loading URLs into Netscape).

Tailoring the site fields

Not everyone will like the names of the default site fields that I have provided with Surfer Central. For example, for an e-mail address, you may want to use one of the User fields to represent the job title of the person you are dealing with. Obviously, a field name of *User Field #1* isn't very meaningful!!!

To change the name of a site field, click (and hold) the secondary mouse button (right mouse button in most cases) on the site field label you wish to change. This brings up the The Labels Pop-Up Menu. Now select Change Label once again using the secondary mouse button. A dialog box as shown below will be displayed.

Now, enter the new name of the label and press the *Ok* button.

Note: Site field labels are saved with the current database. If you wish to use the same field label on another database, you will have to load the second database and make the same change.

Setting Default Field Strings

If you enter a lot of sites into Surfer Central that have some fields that are entered but rarely change, it's nice to have these fields automatically filled in for you. The best example is with FTP sites - most of your sites will probably be anonymous which implies that the *Login* field will frequently contain 'anonymous' and the *Password* field will contain your e-mail address.

To save you some typing you can set the default value for the *Login* field and the *Password* field for the FTP site type. Unfortunately as of version 1.0 of Surfer Central there is no way to change these defaults via the user interface of the program. This will be improved in a later version.

To change these defaults, follow these steps:

- Execute (Run) your favorite Windows editor (e.g. NotePad)
- Open the file in the Surfer Central directory called **SURFCEN.INI**
- Find the section of the file containing the text '[Default Fields]'
- Locate the text 'FTPLLogin=Anonymous'. To change the default text that appears in the *Login* field for the FTP site type simply change the 'Anonymous' to whatever text you like (ignoring the quotes (')) of course)
- Locate the text 'FTPPassword=<e-mail>' and change the '<e-mail>' to whatever text you like. For example, in my case that line would become 'FTPPassword=waletz@ee.umanitoba.ca' (minus the quotes)
- Save the file and run Surfer Central. Change to the FTP site type and if no sites exist in the sites listbox you will immediately notice the change.

Automatically Loading a Database

If you exclusively use the same database file and would like to have that file loaded automatically every time you load Surfer Central, then follow these steps:

- locate the icon for Surfer Central in the Windows Program Manager
- Hold down the Alt key and double click the primary mouse button on the Surfer Central icon (alternative, click the primary mouse button on the icon to select it, and select Properties from the File menu in Program Manager)
- Add the filename of the database you would like to load to the string (edit box) that is adjacent to the 'Command Line' label. For example, if the command line is currently 'C:\SURFCEN\SURFCEN.EXE' and we would like to load WORLD.SDB automatically, the new string should read 'C:\SURFCEN\SURFCEN.EXE WORLD.SDB'.
- Press Ok to save the changes. The next time you load Surfer Central, the specified file will be loaded automatically.

Keyboard Shortcuts

There are various keyboard shortcuts throughout the program which may be used in place of menu commands. All of those shortcuts will not be listed here, however. To find a shortcut for a particular command, examine the menu item corresponding to that command. You will notice that to the right of most menu items is a key combination that performs the identical task as the menu command.

For example, if you look at the **Find Site** command on the **Sites** menu, it's keyboard shortcut is Ctrl+F. This implies that you hold down the control key and press the letter F.

Saving Disk Space

If you are a Surfer Central expert and feel confident that you don't need to use the help, why not get rid of it? You'll save yourself almost 1 Meg of disk space!!! I am fairly proud of this help file (it's my first one!) but if you need to save space you can get rid of it :^).

Simply delete the following files from the Surfer Central directory:

- SURFCEN.HLP
- HWACT.*
- OSHTOOLS.DLL

If you ever need to reference the help again, simply re-install it. To save time, the installation program allows you to install *only* the help if desired.

Also, feel free to nuke the sample database file and any files with a TXT extension if desired. **But don't touch any of the other program files -- if you do, Surfer Central may not run and will need to be re-installed.**

A *site* in Surfer Central is an address or location on the Internet that one may access through some means. For the purposes of this program, the term *site* refers to an e-mail address, WWW URL, FTP address, FSP address, Gopher address, Archie location or Telnet location. The term *site* is, in most cases, synonymous with the word *address*.

A *site field* is one of the elements of information that makes up a site record field is the IP address - this is one piece of information that contributes to the definition of a particular site.

A *site field label* is a text string that describes a particular site field

A *site record* is made up of a series of site fields and is the highest level at which to refer to a site. When a phrase refers to a *site*, really it is referring to a *site record*.

Synonymous with site record.

Winsock, short for Windows Sockets, implements the Transmission Control Protocol/Internet Protocol (TCP/IP). TCP/IP is a protocol which allows computers to communicate with each other and is implemented as a stack; TCP and IP are two separate components which work together to communicate information across network lines. Many Local Area Networks (LANs) use TCP/IP and the worlds largest network, the Internet, also uses this protocol. In all cases, you must install a TCP/IP stack to communicate across a network using TCP/IP. For example, Novell offers a stack to communicate over a Novell network using TCP/IP.

Windows users must also install Winsock compliant software, called *client programs*. This software is an additional component which communicates to both Winsock applications such for Windows and the TCP/IP stack. In all cases, Winsock compliant software will install a dynamically linked library called WINSOCK.DLL on your system, and Winsock applications interact with this library to send and receive information.

Winsock applications offer graphical user interfaces which provide TCP/IP functionality for users. These applications interact with the underlying Winsock compliant software which handles all TCP/IP communication.

A *pop-up* menu is an invisible menu which only becomes visible when the secondary mouse button (usually the right button) is pressed. Once the menu is visible, the user may interact with it just like any other menu.

Definition of Shareware

Shareware is actually not a type of software but a marketing method. Shareware is distributed via bulletin boards, the Internet and a host of other sources. Shareware gives you the opportunity to try software before you buy it - something *all* software should allow for. Prices are very low due to low marketing expenses. Obviously, I do not have the overhead of a large company.

Continuing to use a shareware program after the trial period has expired requires that you register the software. With most shareware, registering the program allows you to continue using, and possibly gain some incentives (*such as allowing more than 50 records in a database*). You may continue to distribute the shareware version of the program, but the license agreement for the registered version usually restricts copying and distribution. Also, note that the registration fee is a direct payment to the author and does not include phone bills, online connection fees and other tangibles.

"Shareware has the ultimate money-back guarantee - if you don't use the product, you don't pay for it."

Another big advantage of shareware is the personal technical support that you receive. In most cases communication takes place directly with the author of the program. This also ensures that requests for new features will not be ignored.

In conclusion, shareware is an excellent method of purchasing software - you can try before you buy and shareware authors frequently charge very little for their work.

Registration Procedure

Registering Surfer Central is a fairly straightforward process. Once you have decided to purchase the software you should take the following steps:

- Load Surfer Central and select **View Lock Number** from the **Help** menu. Make note of the lock string that appears.
- Fill out the registration form. For Canadian users, fill out the [Canadian Registration Form](#). For American or other International users, fill out the [International Registration Form](#). **Make sure you include the lock number on the registration form or you cannot be registered.**
- Once you have filled out the appropriate form send it, along with your payment, to the snail mail address listed on the form
- Once your form and payment have been processed you will receive a registration key (either through snail mail, fax, or e-mail) that can be used to unlock the program. I will make every effort to handle your registration as quickly as possible.
- Upon receipt of your registration key, load Surfer Central and choose **Register** from the **Help** menu. Your lock number will be listed along with an edit box asking for a key number. Type in the key number you received and press the **Register** button. If everything goes okay you will receive a thank you message and the program will work with full functionality from then on. Once the URL has been loaded, simply follow the instructions on the screen and fill-in the appropriate fields. *Don't forget to include your Surfer Central lock number (on page 2 of the form) and your e-mail address or you cannot be registered!!*.

Once you have submitted your form and PsL has processed it, they will send me your personal information (i.e. program lock number) and I will send you your key number that unlocks the full features of Surfer Central.

A Note About the Cost for Credit Card Orders:

Due to the processing fees that are required for credit card registrations, you will be charged slightly more than if you registered via cheque or money order. Known Problems in the Latest Release

Here is a list of known problems in the latest release:

- Making a change to the site entry area and clicking either on the sites listbox or category tabs without first updating or inserting the changes may cause minor problems. The mouse seems to enter a dragging state where the mouse cursor changes to a circle with a line through it. If this occurs, move the mouse around until it's in a position where it remains as the circle and click the primary mouse button (usually the left button). In the case of the sites listbox, click the button anywhere within the listbox, and for the category tabs, click the button on the currently selected (gray) tab. The program will then function normally.

Future Features

I have several new features planned for upcoming versions of Surfer Central. Just to wet your appetite a little bit, some of the planned enhancements are:

- **a 32-bit Windows 95 version!!!**
- **a hierarchical listbox that will replace the sites listbox to allow for greater customizability of the displaying of addresses**
- speed optimizations
- printing capabilities
- more customizability and options for site list generation
- enhanced search functions
- an undo feature
- a floating Winsock toolbar
- possibly file compression for the site database files
- one button deletion of the entire database (useful when you want to start a new database but keep the same colors, field names, etc. of an existing database)
- bug fixes (of course)

Upgrade Information

I have not decided on the upgrade process for Surfer Central. *Probably*, upgrades to minor releases (e.g. to version 1.1) will be free and upgrades to new releases (e.g. to version 2.0) will be \$5 or so. This upgrade info is tentative and subject to change without notice.

Scratch that!!! All upgrades to Surfer Central are *FREE* for registered users!!!! You just have to send me a postcard when you download a new version :^).

Uninstalling Surfer Central

To remove Surfer Central from your system, locate the Program Manager group containing the Surfer Central icon {ewc OSHTOOLS.DLL, OlsonSoftEWBitmap, SCICON.BMP}. Also in this group will be an icon labeled Uninstall Surfer Central {ewc OSHTOOLS.DLL, OlsonSoftEWBitmap, SCUIICON.BMP}. Double-click this icon with the primary mouse button and Surfer Central will be removed.

Note: Uninstalling Surfer Central removes the Surfer Central directory *and its associated subdirectories* from your hard drive. Please ensure that you have no data files that you wish to keep in any of these subdirectories as they will be deleted during uninstallation.
