Creating a new What's New item

To create a new item:

- 1 Click on the "New Item" button in "What's New Wizard" dialog box.
- 2 Add a brief description in the "What's New item" text box.
- 3 Enter a hyperlink for the item. You can type in appropriate hyperlink or choose one by browsing through your Web space by clicking on the "Browse" button.
- 4 Enter a brief description of your What's New item in the "Description of What's New item" text box.
- 5 Modify the date.

Adding a What's New Item

To add a newly created item to the "What's New" item list click the "Add" button in the "What's New Wizard" dialog. After clicking the "Add" button, the item will now appear in the top in the list box of "What's New" items.

Deleting a What's New item

To delete an item from the "What's New" list:

- 1 Select the item in the list box.
- 2 Click the "Delete" button.

The selected item is removed from the list box.

Modifying a What's New item

To modify a "What's New" item:

- 1 Select the item in "What's New" items list box.
- 2 Modify the title, the hyperlink, the brief description or the date for the item.
- 3 Click the "Change" button.

The modified item now appears in the "What New" items list box.

Building the What's New page

To build the "What's New" page, click "Build It" button on the "What's New Wizard" dialog. An HTML document with the "What's New" item is written out.
