

# NetChronometer 1.0.1

You've probably noticed that the clock in your Macintosh tends to drift as time goes by. This can range from being a minor nuisance to a problem, especially if you do a lot of synchronizing between Macintoshes or other computers on a network. [NetChronometer](#) synchronizes the clock on your Macintosh to a highly accurate network time server, over the internet.

You can use NetChronometer to synchronize the clock manually, or automatically have it synchronize periodically.

## Requirements

NetChronometer will run on any Macintosh with a 68020 or better (it is accelerated for PowerPC). NetChronometer requires a direct or dial-in internet connection. It supports Open Transport or "classic" Macintosh TCP/IP.

NetChronometer is Appearance Manager-savvy.

**NOTE:** NetChronometer cannot access the internet through a proxy server or similar internet firewall.
