

Glue the parts together in the order indicated by the numbers.




(3) Making a Carnation

Glue the three petals you made using part 1, evenly spaced around the top of the stem (above the guideline).







Arrange the petals so that every second one overlaps. Attach the three remaining part 2 petals in between the other part 2 petals.



Attach the six part 3 petals using the same process as for the part 2 petals.




Glue three of the petals you made using part 2 , evenly spaced in between the three petals made from part 1 .
