

- *---A macro to calculate the number of days between two dates
- *---Use the /Range Name Label Right {End} {Down} <ENTER> to define range names in this column (starts with the \Z macro name)
- *---Hold the <ALT> key and press <Z> to activate the macro
- *---The macro prompts for the first date and then the second date
- *---Make sure that the keyboard is in [INSERT] mode and not [OVR]
