- *---A macro to RESTORE all range names after issuing /RNR accidently. The worksheet must contain a range names table previously created using /RNT. It is a good practice to set aside a place for range names table and using the /RNT to update the table any time new range names are created.
- *---Use the /Range Name Label Right {End} {Down} <ENTER> to define the range names in this column (starts with the \Z macro name)
- *---Place the cell pointer on the upper left cell of the names table.
- *---Hold the <ALT> key and press <Z> to activate the macro
