- 4: Type NET:CD0 (Where net is the network devicename)
- 5: Type Assign Epic_Encyclopedia: ""
- 6: Type Endcli
- 7: Run the software as normal

Adding Subjects

Subjects are available from our FTP site on the internet, or directly from us on floppy disk. Alternatively you can create your own using the Creator program!

Either way you obtain new subjects they are very easy to add to the encyclopedia.

All subjects are stored as '.epic' files, so a subject titled 'frogspawn' will be on disk as 'frogspawn.epic'. The Setup program will recognise '.epi' files as well.

To add new subjects:

- Run the 'Setup' Program by double-clicking on its icon.
- 2. Click once on the 'Install new Subjects' button.
- 3. Select the subjects you wish to add by doubleclicking on them.
- 4. Repeat steps 2-3 until you have added all of the new subjects.
- 5. Click once on the 'Update Subject Index' button.
