#### General Information about EGRESS

EGRESS is a simple program that will allow you to click an icon in Program Manager and have WINDOWS immediately terminate, or terminate and restart, or even reboot your computer. You can also use EGRESS to execute recalcitrant DOS applications that could not normally be run from WINDOWS.

Use File Manager to copy EGRESS.EXE and EGRESS.HLP to any convenient directory. The directory does not have to be on the <u>PATH</u>. The examples shown here have *EGRESS* located in a subdirectory of *WINDOWS* named "UTIL". Next install *EGRESS* in as many of your Program Manager Groups as you wish. Use the File Manager "<u>Drag & Drop"</u> feature to drop *EGRESS* on the desired Groups, or use the Program Manager "<u>File"</u>-"New"-"Program Item" facility.

You may also wish to install *EGRESS* in your <u>Start-Up</u> group to be run as an Icon at the bottom of your desktop.

#### Three warnings-

- 1) EGRESS will immediately execute when you activate it with a commandline parameter. It will not stop to verify that you wish to terminate WINDOWS the way closing down from Program Manager or File Manager will.
- 2) *EGRESS* will not save any new settings or icon arrangements you may have made in your groups. If you wish to save new settings, exit through Program Manager or File Manager in the normal way.
- 3) *EGRESS*, like almost all other software, is **not** guaranteed. The <u>author</u> would be glad to hear from you if you find a bug (Heaven Forbid!) or have a suggestion for improvements.

EGRESS does not modify any WINDOWS files, nor change any DOS files. You can easily remove it from your system by deleting it's icon from your Program Manager groups and then deleting EGRESS.EXE and EGRESS.HLP from the directory you installed them in.

Please remember that EGRESS is <u>Shareware</u>. Shareware is NOT "free software"! If, after you have tested it for a few weeks, and you find it to be useful you are expected to <u>register with the author</u> by paying a small fee.



### How to set up EGRESS to shutdown WINDOWS

Run *EGRESS* with the option keyword "QUIT" on the command line of the Program Manager Properties. Alternatively you can specify a number between 1 and 255 (except for 066 & 067) that will be returned in the <u>DOS Errorlevel</u>.

Using "QUIT", the command line should look something like this:



## How to set up EGRESS to restart WINDOWS

Run EGRESS with the option keyword "RESTART" on the command line of the Program Manager Properties. It should look something like this:

C:\WINDOWS\UTIL\EGRESS.EXE RESTART

# How to set up EGRESS to reboot your computer

Run EGRESS with the option keyword "REBOOT" on the commandline of the Program Manager Properties. It should look something like this:

C:\WINDOWS\UTIL\EGRESS.EXE REBOOT

#### **Run a DOS Application**

EGRESS can shut-down WINDOWS, run a <u>DOS</u> program, and then restart WINDOWS. This is a useful feature if you have one or more DOS applications that simply will not run from within WINDOWS, even after much fiddling with <u>PIF</u> files and other options.

Set up your Program Manager properties for *EGRESS* similar to the example below. The "Working Directory" indicates where *EGRESS* can be found. If *EGRESS* is on your <u>PATH</u> you won't need this; or you could include it as part of the "Command Line" entry. Including it in the "Working Directory" entry leaves more room in the "Command Line" entry for the required path to the *DOS* program and any necessary command-line parameters.


WINDOWS always exits with the current directory set to itself. Your DOS application will need to change the directory if it requires a specific directory to be current at the time it is executed.

Notice that the "Command Line" entry includes the <u>full path</u> to the *DOS* program: "c:\fun\cosmo.exe" in this case. The full path is <u>required</u>, even if the <u>DOS</u> program is located on the PATH.

The DOS program you specify to be run must be a <u>.EXE</u> or <u>.COM</u> program. You cannot specify a <u>.BAT</u> file. If you must run a .BAT file, you will need to run another version of <u>COMMAND.COM</u> with the desired .BAT file named as a parameter. Here is an example:

"EGRESS.EXE command.com /c c:\fun\cosmo.bat"

You will probably want to assign a custom Icon, instead of the default *EGRESS* icon that would normally be shown. Choose "Change Icon" and then "Browse" to pick a suitable Icon from Program Manager, <u>MORICONS.DLL</u>, or from a collection of your own.



### **ERROR- Can't Find Program**

The command-line parameter for *EGRESS* does not specify a valid path and program. You must specify the complete path to the <u>DOS</u> program you wish to have executed.

This error may also be caused by insufficient system memory, or if one or more other applications refuse to close.

### **ERROR- Application(s) won't Close**

One or more *WINDOWS* applications refused to close (terminate). This could be caused by a file not being saved or by responding "Cancel" to an application's "OK to close?" question.



### Registering EGRESS...

EGRESS is Shareware. If you find this program useful and/or amusing please register with the author by paying the regular registration fee of \$5.00. If this program is not worth \$5.00 to you, don't use it! Registered users will receive notification of the next release of EGRESS.

Please notice that *EGRESS* does not "nag" you to register. The author is depending on your voluntary registration to keep up his morale and encourage him to produce bigger and better Shareware programs (He also has 3 college-age children and a wife to support).

Please pass along copies of *EGRESS* to your friends and favorite bulletin boards. Be sure to include all of the original distribution package, which includes EGRESS.EXE, EGRESS.HLP, EGRESS.TXT, PURGE.TXT and README.TXT. Your installation package may also have included the installation program files INSTALL.EXE and INSTALL.INF.

 $\underline{PATH}$  - the directory "route" that DOS follows to locate programs. Normally defined in your AUTOEXEC.BAT file. See your DOS manual for more information.

 $\underline{\text{DOS}}$  - The " $\underline{\text{D}}$ isk  $\underline{\text{O}}$ perating  $\underline{\text{S}}$ ystem". The most basic software level installed on your computer. See your  $\underline{\text{DOS}}$  manual for more information.

 $\underline{PIF}$  - a " $\underline{P}$ rogram  $\underline{I}$ nformation  $\underline{F}$ ile". A file of program information and options that pertain to a single application to be run from within  $\underline{WINDOWS}$ . See your  $\underline{WINDOWS}$  manual for more information.

 $\underline{\mathsf{MORICONS.DLL}}$  - A file containing dozens of icons for use with  $\mathit{WINDOWS}$  program manager items. This file comes with  $\mathit{WINDOWS}$  version 3.1.

<u>.EXE</u> - The normal type of *DOS*' "executable" program files. See your DOS manual for more information.

.COM - A normal type of DOS' "compiled" program files. See your DOS manual for more information.

<u>.BAT</u> - A *DOS* "batch" file of commands to be executed. See your DOS manual for more information.
