Conditions/Agreements for Volunteers of 'Project Jonah'

'Project Jonah' is different from the traditional Family Radio mission trips in that it is proposed to be a mission team traveling from country to country continuously for the remaining months until May 21, 2011. To a certain extent, the itinerary will be developed as we go along and will be subject to change at any time.

Being a part of 'Project Jonah' will require each team member to be very flexible with and easily-adaptable to situations and conditions that may be encountered and that may be difficult and demanding and less than comfortable. These situations and conditions may include: being apprehended and detained by local authorities; staying in accommodations that have limited hours of electricity and hot water or that have only cold water or that have no running water and require bucket baths; staying in accommodations that have no air conditioning in hot climates, do not provide mosquito nets, do not have the cleanest of conditions and are located in noisy environments; and eating foods that you may not be accustomed to and not being able to get foods that you are accustomed to.

Have you passed-out tracts before? If yes, when and where?

Are there certain countries in which you are particularly interested?

Have you traveled to other countries? _____ Do you presently have a passport? _____ If so, when is the expiration date? _____

Each team member must wear clothing that is culturally-sensitive and not offensive to the citizens of each country to be visited. T-shirts and hats will be worn that identify with May 21, 2011.

Team members will have one day each week (not Sunday) to rest and relax.

We are looking for people who can serve for the full duration till May 21, 2011. We allow team members to come home in case of emergency only. Please let the Team Leader know of your situation at all times and he will work with you for the best course of actions.

Smoking or drinking alcoholic beverages will not be permitted.

Family Radio will pay for transportation, lodging, food and tract-printing expenses. If you are single, you should be willing to share a room with another single individual. Any single person who does not desire to share a room must pay the extra cost for a single room. Are you able to provide for all of your personal expenses, such as sundries?

Each team member must be completely convicted that it is God's will that he/she give these remaining months in His service; must be convicted that The Bible assures us that May 21, 2011 is the Day of Judgment; must have a definite sense that his/her life is not his/her own but belongs to the Lord Jesus Christ; must be willing to suffer for the sake of Christ; must have a great passion to be obedient to God's command to warn the world of impending Judgment Day and of God's mercy.

If you are married, both the husband and wife must be of the same mind and equally willing and qualified to pass-out tracts. Each spouse needs to apply separately and both must travel together. If your children are 15 years or older and are fully able and willing to pass-out tracts, the whole family may qualify. If you are a parent with children under the age of 15, you are not eligible unless the children can be placed under the competent, loving care of relatives, like grandparents, etc. If a young person, who is aged 15, 16 or 17, is interested, he/she must be with his/her parents. The parents must be completely certain and desirous that their child/children will humbly follow the directions of the Team Leader.

Each team member must walk very humbly and should absolutely not become offended by angry or scornful citizens of a country. You must have an intense desire to walk humbly and faithfully in service to Christ.

Are you willing to humbly obey and work in harmony with the Team Leader? Even if you think you have a better way or plan? ______

It is absolutely necessary that everyone follows the Team Leader's instructions and respects his decisions. Anyone who has difficulty living in harmony with others in 'Project Jonah' <u>cannot</u> remain and will be asked to leave 'Project Jonah'. Do you understand this request?

Are you able to remain calm and kind when a citizen of a country is very angry and threatening towards you?

This is not a vacation, and therefore, each team member must agree to be diligent and faithful in the daily work assigned by the Team Leader to pass-out tracts. Only Family Radio tracts will be permitted to be handed out and each team member must be in agreement with the truths set forth in the tracts that are handed out. Are you willing and able to participate <u>fully</u> in the task of passing-out tracts?

This is a very important question that must be answered very honestly:

If the Team Leader believes that for the best interest of 'Project Jonah' you should return home immediately, will you agree to leave promptly and peacefully?

We are looking for people who are committed to serve for the full duration until May 21, 2011.

Are you able, ready and willing to leave your family/friends, work, etc behind? ______ Do you have any outstanding debt/other obligation that you will not be able to fulfill while you are away? ______

Your Health

We believe that we should remember that each person's health condition is a personal matter. Many people, for example, are under a doctor's care because they are desirous of maintaining good health. As we continue to pray for wisdom on this matter, we presently believe that unless there are obvious indications of health limitations, we should leave those judgments with each individual and his or her family members.

We do wish to emphasize, however, that being a part of 'Project Jonah' is not a task for individuals of limited endurance. It is not a project for those who have a tendency to be lazy. Those who go must be physically and emotionally capable and must be diligent and hard workers because it is hard work to continually pass-out tracts day after day for months. Each applicant should be very honest concerning these matters, remembering that his/her Master is the King of kings, the Lord Jesus Christ.

Do you and your family believe that you have the strength and endurance to do the hard work that is called for by participating in 'Project Jonah'?

If a health problem should become aggravated while serving on 'Project Jonah', the person involved could immediately leave 'Project Jonah' and return home. You must understand and agree that should you become ill, we will assist you in every way to return home, if that is necessary. But Family Stations, Inc. will not be at all held responsible or accountable, and therefore in any way liable, for causing the illness.

Should we believe it to be necessary, are you willing to send us a letter from your doctor stating you are able to travel and do this kind of volunteer work?

Traveling overseas does require proper vaccinations and certain medication, such as malaria prophylaxis. Family Radio is willing to provide reimbursement for these expenses. Are you willing to receive the proper vaccinations and medicine to go overseas?
