It was nice to see such a large number of our parents, grandparents and others make it to our Spring Parent-Teacher Conferences. Our Honor Roll numbers for both middle and high school were slightly higher than those of the first semester which is encouraging to our staff in terms of student progress.

The High School Academic Team enters the conference tournament as the #3 seed and will hosts the District Academic Tournament on Saturday, April 14th.

New activities to this quarter are Middle School and High School Track & Field as well as District Vocal and Band competitions. Track season is just getting underway as this letter is being printed.
