The MS Boys stayed competitive all season and closed out the season with a 3rd place victory at Weston.

The High School Basketball season is just past the halfway point. The girls are 10-9 overall and currently tied atop the PVC. The boys are an incredible 18-1 and have claimed titles in each of

the PVC, Osborn, and King City Tournaments and also sit atop the conference standings. The boys team currently is ranked 2nd in the state in Class 2A! Courtwarming will be held February 10th vs. Northeast Nodaway with the coronation following the games.

A Word From The Elementary Principal

Wow, we have been truly blessed with the atypical weather pattern. This has allowed us to stay on track with our curriculum as we prepare for our annual assessments. In addition, the students have enjoyed a great deal of fresh air and exercise during our outdoor recesses.

Our students had a great first semester and we are proud of their hard work. We had 52% of fifth graders and 83% of sixth graders earn honor roll status. Our year to date attendance remains high at 96.7% with 156 students enrolled in grades K-6. Our two preschools remain full with 20 in the full time program and 10 in the part-time program.

Students in grades 3-6 set quarterly personal goals and 54% met their second quarter Tiger Pride goal. They chose from four incentives: Snow Day Pass, Subway Take-out, \$100 in Tigerville monies, and a Quick Trip to the Dairy Queen in Atchison. Thank you, parents, for providing their funds for Subway and Dairy Queen.

We work hard on building positive character traits in school. It is refreshing when we take our youngsters out in public and they are complimented on their behaviors. When the 21 students went to the Dairy Queen, one of the workers came over to me and complimented them on being the best behaved group of students they had seen. We are very proud of our young people!

Congratulations to our spelling bee winners and all those participating. Averyl Crouse was our fifth grade winner and Cole Wildhagen took first place in the sixth grade. Both will represent us at the Buchanan County Spelling Bee. Cole also took honors as our overall champion.

Preschool and Kindergarten News

It is that time again, believe or not, to start getting ready for next year's preschool and kindergarten programs. We will have Kindergarten Round-Up on **Friday February 24**th. It is imperative that you call the school at 688-7777 to set up an appointment for your child if they are attending kindergarten next school year. If your child is enrolled in our preschool, **you will not need to make an appointment**. On this day, your child will be given a screening to check for kindergarten readiness along with a vision and hearing screening. The Round-Up will also give you an opportunity for your child to meet the teachers and discuss any questions you may have.

We are excited to offer a **Two-Year-Old Screening**, along with our preschool screening, this year, which will be **February 27**th **through March 2**nd. If you are interested in having your two-year-old screened, please call the school at 688-7777. The screenings will give you an idea of where your child is developmentally and what kinds of things you can be working on with your child.

Preschool Screening will be **February 27th through March 2nd**. You need to call the school to schedule the preschool screening appointment. Even if you are not interested in preschool, we encourage you to make an appointment to utilize this screening. The screening will give you an idea of where your child is developmentally and what kinds of things you can be working on with your child. If you are interested in preschool, your child **MUST** be screened before coming to preschool. All aspects of the screening must be complete in order to attend preschool. **Children who are four years old by August 1st will be given the first opportunity to enroll in preschool.** If there are any spots left after all four year olds have been given the opportunity, three year olds will be given the opportunity to enroll. Due to the screening being so early this year, we will do preschool registration in April. We will have a better idea after preschool screening as to how many spots will be available. You will get more information during preschool screening. After our preschool is full with 20 children, we will start a waiting list in the exact order that the registrations are received. We will provide a part-time preschool (Tuesday, Wednesday, & Thursday) if the need is there and after our full-time preschool is full.

In April, we will have an Early Childhood Night for all incoming preschoolers and kindergartners. This will be an opportunity for you and your child to take a tour of the building, ask any questions that you may have, and get information regarding the classroom, buses, and health information. You will receive more information regarding the Early Childhood Night at the Round-Up and Preschool Screening.
