Hello Everyone, it is hard to believe we are already into the new year. The school year is flying by like it always seems to. Hopefully everyone is surviving the winter. Though it has been a mild winter so far, winter is far from over. But, it sure is nice to enjoy these warm temperatures. I just have a few things to share with you.

First, I want to say all our hearts and prayers go out to those who were affected or lost their lives in Newtown, Connecticut. Not just educators, but everyone detests a tragedy like this one. We work very hard to keep your children safe in this district. But things happen at schools, malls, theaters, etc. that cannot be foreseen and prevented. Everyone needs to have an awareness of their surroundings and report anything that seems out of the ordinary. We continue to monitor the doors and keep them locked. We have asked and received an increased presence of Sheriff's Deputies in our buildings. So if you see their vehicles in town, on the roadways, or in our driveways, they are just keeping an eye on things.

In our ongoing attempt to protect our students we see and hear about things being posted on social media. We ask you to be sure to get the parents' permission before posting any pictures of students on social media. Some parents do not want their child(ren) to be exposed. We also might have a student who is placed here by a court asking that no one know where they are for their protection. Thank you.

We are in the middle of our winter extracurricular activities. We ask that if your young child(ren) attend our events that they sit with their parents during the contest. We worry while they are unsupervised they might get hurt. Thank you for your assistance.

Missouri School Improvement Program version 5 (MSIP 5) has just been approved by the State Board of Education. I am sure you have heard something about this topic in the news media and have wondered; How does this affect our district? MSIP 5 does not go into effect until next year; however, the Missouri Department of Education (DESE) has run a simulation of how districts will be effected using last year's data. There are 140 points possible in the new MSIP 5 and we scored 133.5. Thus we performed at the rate of 95.3 percent. Points are scored in academic performance, attendance, college and career readiness, etc. We did very well and look forward to the challenge of MSIP 5.

I'm sure you have heard, I have resigned my position as Superintendent. I do this with a heavy heart, but it is time to spend more time with our grandchildren as they get older. It has and continues to be a pleasure to serve this community. We have the greatest kids in the world.

The boys team worked hard throughout the year and capped off their season with a close defeat at the hands of West Platte in the West Platte Tourney. The girls middle school squad finished the year 12-2 and won 1<sup>st</sup> place in both the Mid-Buchanan and West Platte Tournaments.

High School basketball is in full swing as both the girls and boys team approach district play coming up in February. The girls are currently 11-6 overall and 2-0 in the PVC. They won 3<sup>rd</sup> place earlier this season in the PVC Tournament, 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Osborn Invitational and won the consolation championship in the King City Tournament. The boys are currently 12-4 and also 2-0 in the PVC. They managed to win the consolation championship of the PVC Tourney and won the Osborn Invitational for the 5<sup>th</sup> straight year! They also placed 2nd in the King City Tournament.

## A Word From The Elementary Principal

Students and faculty are working hard after a relaxing Christmas break. This is the time of year we begin to gear up for our annual state assessments. It always seems like once the second semester begins the pace picks up and we find ourselves busier than ever. We currently have 152 students enrolled in grades K-6. It's exciting to have both of our preschool programs now full with 20 students in each!

Thank you, parents, for participating in our annual fall conferences. We collaborated regarding 190 out of 192 students.

We are proud of our students' accomplishments over the first semester. Sixty percent of our fifth graders were on an honor roll and eighty-two percent of our sixth graders were on an honor roll. Fifty-six percent of our K-6<sup>th</sup> grade students earned attendance honors for the second quarter. Breakdowns were as follows: 23 Perfect, 45 1 Day or Less, 19 Two Days or Less. Personal Tiger Pride goals were achieved by 56% of our students in grades 3-6. Students selected the following incentives: 11 Chose a Pet Day Pass, 22 Chose DQ, and 13 Chose Subway. Thank you, parents, for financing our DQ treats and Subway!

## **Preschool and Kindergarten News**



It is that time again, believe or not, to start getting ready for next year's preschool and kindergarten programs. We will have **Kindergarten Round-Up** on **Friday February 22<sup>nd</sup>**. It is imperative that you call the school at 688-7777 to set up an appointment for your child if they are attending kindergarten next school year. If your child is in enrolled in our preschool, **you will not need to make an appointment**. On this day, your child will be given a screening to check for kindergarten readiness along with a vision and hearing screening. The Round-Up will also give you an opportunity for your child to meet the teachers and discuss any questions you may have.

**Preschool Screening** will be **February 25th through February 28th**. You need to call the school to schedule the preschool screening appointment. Even if you are not interested in preschool, we encourage you to make an appointment to utilize this screening. If you are interested in preschool, your child **MUST** be screened before coming to preschool. All aspects of the screening must be complete in order to attend preschool. **Children who are four years old by August 1**<sup>st</sup> **will be given the first opportunity to enroll in preschool.** If there are any spots left after all four year olds have been given the opportunity, three year olds will be given the opportunity to enroll. Due to the screening being so early this year, we will do preschool registration in April. We will have a better idea after preschool screening as to how many spots will be available. You will get more information during preschool screening. After our preschool is full with 20 children, we will start a waiting list in the exact order that the registrations are received. We will provide an additional program based on the needs of our families.

In April, we will have an Early Childhood Night for all incoming preschoolers and kindergartners. This will be an opportunity for you and your child to take a tour of the building, ask any questions that you may have, and get information regarding the classroom, buses, and health information. You will receive more information regarding the Early Childhood Night at the Round-Up and Preschool Screening.
