Sports Physicals are on Thursday, June 6 @ the High School. The cost is \$20 cash or check made payable to Health Express. Sign up outside office door. Call Nurse Bessie with any questions.

ImPACT testing will be performed at the high school on Tuesday, May 21, during school It is encouraged for all studentathletes who intend to participate in any sport during the 2013-2014 school year. ImPACT is a national computer-based program from the University of Pittsburgh Sports Medicine Department. We are fortunate at DeKalb MS/HS to be able to participate in this program. It is offered through the Human Motion Institute from Heartland Health. Through the Human Motion Institute, "this program is used to determine the severity of a concussion, track the recovery rate, provide rehab and recovery and determine when it is safe for the athlete to participate in sports again." Students may sign up outside the office or vou may call Nurse Bessie to sign up or if you have Parental permission is required. Parental letters and permission forms will be mailed to parents prior to testing. They must be returned to Nurse Bessie (or the office) NO LATER than May 14, 2013.

## A Word from the Elementary Principal

Our current enrollment is 20 in each preschool program and 155 K-6 students. Our average daily attendance for grades K-6 is 95.80%.

Ms. McQuillan, the fifth and sixth grade science teacher, was awarded two grants from the Missouri Department of Conservation, Discover Nature Schools Program. Each grant is for \$1,000 and has helped fund the supplies needed to complete the units of study. The curricula is designed with activities to meet Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) state and common core standards as well as Grade Level Expectations (GLEs). The sixth grade science class learned about Conserving Missouri's Aquatic Ecosystems and fifth grade is completing the Nature Unleashed unit. Each includes classroom studies, inside and outside investigations, hands-on activities, and an outdoor field trip.

Our state assessments were completed in April. Grades K-2 took the CTB McGraw-Hill Terra Nova while the third through sixth graders took the Missouri Assessment Program (MAP) tests. In addition, our third through sixth graders were randomly selected to take the Scientific Pilot Tests for the new SMARTER Balanced Assessments that will be put in place for the 2014-2015 school year. These assessments will replace the MAP tests, reflect the new Common Core Standards, and will be taken on computers. While we will not receive feedback on how our students scored, overall they indicated they did like taking a computerized test rather than the traditional pencil/paper ones. A sign of a new generation I assume.

We have completed kindergarten roundup and preschool screenings for the 2013-2014 school year. We currently have 28 students enrolled for our fall kindergarten classes and our five day preschool program is full with 20 students while our three day program has 12 enrolled.

Mr. Medsker and the ag students from DeKalb are making 5 outdoor tables to be used as a type of outdoor classroom in the future. You will see these placed between the building and the mobile unit. We are looking forward to the opportunity of working outside at times and even eating a special lunch now and then.

I truly do not know where this year has gone. It seems like just a bit ago we were struggling to get into a routine due to early dismissals from extreme heat. How ironic that the end of the year has found us desperate for sunshine and warm weather. Nonetheless, our students have grown, matured, and made terrific academic gains. Thank you for being their biggest cheerleaders and most important teachers. Your support ensures they will reach their full potential. Have a wonderful summer and enjoy this time with your family! Don't forget to keep reading and working on those basic math facts!
