Jack & the Beanstalk is a children's story designed to run in Windows 3.1. It consists of 35 illustrated pages with 2-4 captions per page. The illustrations are distributed as black and white line drawings. A paint routine is included so that a user is able to color each picture using a 240 color palette. The colored version is then saved. Subsequently the program will display the colored version of the picture for that page. Pictures can be repainted. Pictures can be printed out (they are named PGxx.BMP and can be loaded into any Windows graphics program).

System requirements: Any PC running MS Windows 3.1 - SVGA 640x480 256 colors - VBRUN300.DLL in the Windows\System directory - 7 Mb hard disk storage. (A 386-20 and a 486-33 were used in the development of the program, and the 386-20 was noticeably slow in turning pages and changing captions.)
