La expresión **there is** (singular) pasa a ser **there are** en plural.

<u>Ejemplo</u>: There is a hole in your pocket.

There are many nice flowers in that garden.

En la **forma interrogativa**, **there** se coloca **despu**és del verbo.

Ejemplo: Is there a problem?

Are there lots of children on the playground?

En la **forma negativa**, **there is** pasa a ser **there isn't** (there is not) y **there are** pasa a ser **there** aren't (there are not).

<u>Ejemplo</u>: There isn't any milk left.

There aren't many mistakes in your paper.
