

- The expression **there is** (singular) becomes **there are** in the plural.  
Example: **There is** a hole in your pocket.  
**There are** many nice flowers in that garden.
- In the **interrogative form**, **there** is put **after** the verb.  
Example: **Is there** a problem?  
**Are there** lots of children on the playground?
- In the **negative form**, **there is** becomes **there isn't** (there is not) and **there are** becomes **there aren't** (there are not).  
Example: **There isn't** any milk left.  
**There aren't** many mistakes in your paper.
