Demonstrating Effectiveness; Change of Practice

As mentioned in Briefing No. 2 and 3, we need your help in the evaluation of LTSN Bioscience.

The outcome in particular (from our Strategic Plan) that we would ask you to concentrate on is as follows; *that schools/departments/individuals change their learning and teaching practices based on the help and advice given by the Centre.* One possible way of recording such an outcome is through a short report showing a change (or indeed an *intent* to change) made in teaching that has involved some input from the Centre.

To this end, we would like you to record any such situation in your school/department; we are interested in any alteration to the student learning experience to which LTSN Bioscience made a contribution (however small). This material is not envisaged as occupying more

than 1 side of A4 unless the nature of the activity requires a longer report. A proforma and further information can be found at:

This request is being sent to you 12 months before the deadline to allow you to capture and record information about changes(/intent) in teaching **when they are made.** Please return any reports to us as soon as they are available. We will also be in touch to request such reports periodically over the next 12 months.
