





2-WEIGHING: Considering the alternative courses of action and comparing the strengths and weaknesses of each

3-JUSTIFYING: Identifying the reasons supporting the proposed action and those that support **NOT** choosing other actions

4-CHOOSING: Making a choice and taking action; taking responsibility for outcomes

5-EVALUATING: Looking at the outcome.



- What was successful/unsuccessful?
- •What could be done differently in a similar case in the future?



Descriptive ethics

Is about facts




Description of the way in which people live, and the moral choices they make.

e.g.: most of the vegetarians made they choice to be so because they are against killing animals

Normative ethics

Is about values



- •what is right
- •justice
- how people should live

e.g.: it is always wrong to steal

Meta-ethics

Is about **meaning**

Ethics is the sequence of logic arguments that justify the adoption of a certain moral.
