Back to the stakeholders

- **Scholarship:**
 - Falsification of data; plagiarism
- **Colleagues:**
 - Respect for them and their work; plagiarism
- **Wider research community:**
 - Plagiarism; falsification of data

Back to the stakeholders

- **Subjects of research**
 - Respect; responsibility
- **Funding agencies**
 - Commitment; Appropriate use of funds
- **Community / Society:**
 - Applications of work; Responsible communication

- **Ourselves**
 - Honesty; self-awareness
