# Supporting Students within an Academic School through Pro-active Personal Tutoring and Intervention with Failing Students

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## **Aim**

- ➤ Provide tutorial support for all first year students
- ➤ Identify students with poor performance in semester 1 assessments
- ➤ Put in place intervention measures and additional support for their studies.


## **PASS Intervention**

- >Look at semester 1 results for all first year students
- ➤ Identify all those who failed one or more modules
- ➤ Classify the students according to the severity of their failure

## **PASS Intervention Method**

- ➤ Email students with a single module resit, copied to their Personal Tutor
- All other failing students were sent appointments for individual interviews to discuss their results and offer extra support.
- ➤ Support available was 1:1 study skills and/or maths tutorials, and counselling.
- Mentoring through follow up interviews

# **Uptake of Support**



22 out of 24 failing students participated in support

## **Discussion**

- >Students responded to personal contact
- ➤ Put in place individual study plan
- ➤ Picked up unregistered dyslexic students
- Prevented total despair and drop-out
- >Students held accountable
- Analyse outcomes of intervention

## **Conclusions**

Monitoring progress and early intervention led to:

- >Improved student motivation
- >Improved student engagement
- Halted downward spiral
- ➤ Good study habits being learnt
- Preventing repetition of poor performance
- ➤ Improved self esteem
- ➤ (Improved student retention)

### **Outcomes**

**Expectations** are that monitoring progress and early intervention will lead to:

- ➤ Improved student morale and (hopefully) performance in Semester 2 assessments
- ➤ Improved student retention for the School
- ➤ Savings of approx £15-20k per student retained

# **Work in Progress**

This is a first attempt at minimising student wastage by intervening with failing students and training them in skills to succeed.

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
